<p>1-1. Background of the Project</p> <p>Myanmar, since its political change in March 2011, has been actively promoting reforms focusing on three main fields: “democratization”, “economic development” and “peaceful settlement with ethnic minorities.” Myanmar government acknowledges establishment of rule of law as an indispensable element in promoting such reforms.</p> <p>While Myanmar has a set of laws transplanted from India during the colonial era, those laws, typically civil and commercial laws, are often incompatible with today’s complex, advanced business environment. The Myanmar government acknowledged that a set of reforms to improve legislation is necessary in order to establish an investment-friendly nation.</p> <p>In legal and judicial institutions, officers with legal background are limited in number, and the training opportunities on legislative drafting are still limited. At UAGO, which is in charge of scrutinization of laws, opportunities to gain professional and expert knowledge and skills have been limited. SCOU, with its limited role in the previous political eras, is yet to be ready for the rapid change in economic and social situation in Myanmar. Therefore, UAGO and SCOU (collectively, the Counterparts), both acknowledged the needs to develop their institutional and personnel capacities in order to establish rule of law in the society.</p> <p>Under such circumstances, capacity development of relevant institutions and human recourses in judicial and legal sectors in Myanmar is one of the most important issues that Myanmar government prioritizes in order to achieve the reforms towards promotion of market economy and improvement of investment environment.</p> <p>1-2. Project Overview</p> <p>The Project aims to i) promote the development of legislative capacity of related institutions in the the judicial and legal sectors while conducting activities to directly meet the urgent economic and social needs of Myanmar, and ii) to examine the issues to establish solid foundation for sustainable human resource development and consistent and systematic legislation on a longer-term basis, which overall contributes to the establishment of rule of law, promotion of democracy, and the economic development of Myanmar.</p> <p>(1) Overall Goal: Rule of Law, Democracy and Sustainable Economic Growth are promoted by development of laws and regulations corresponding to social and economic situation in Myanmar as well as international standards and appropriate implementation of such rules.</p> <p>(2) Project Purpose: To improve institutional and human resource capacity of Myanmar legal, judicial and relevant authorities to develop and implement laws in response to the needs of the times</p> <p>(3) Outputs</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Capacity development for legal scrutiny and legal advice 2) Strengthening of human resource development

3. Evaluation Results			
3-1. Achievements of the Project			
(1) Achievements of the Outputs¹			
Sub-Project I (UAGO)			
Output 1 (Capacity development for legislative drafting): Output 1 is mostly achieved.			
Law officers actively participated in various in-country trainings and study tours to Japan conducted by JICA on selected topics on specific laws/law areas such as Companies Law, IP related Laws, and Insolvency Law (ANNEX 2 and 3). Through these training opportunities, UAGO officers acquired and accumulated the theoretical knowledge and the practical skills on such selected targeted law areas. In addition, they participated in the study tour to Japan on the theme of legislative processes which was also conducted by JICA. UAGO acknowledged the current situation, issues and the challenges that Myanmar and UAGO are facing, and they gained recognition on the specific issues to overcome, and needs for the future reforms. Other authorities responsible for targeted law areas, who are to work in cooperation with UAGO for such future reforms, also joined those training occasions, and their knowledge and understanding on those targeted laws were enhanced. Such authorities and institutions include SCOU, of the Union, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Planning and Finance, Directorate of Investment and Company Administration (DICA), and the Central Bank of Myanmar, Union Parliament and the Myanmar Accountancy Council.			
Output 2 (Strengthening of human resource development): Output 2 is mostly achieved.			
Most of the planned activities were achieved in general. New teaching methods including mock trial and case study, have been planned, introduced and organized by UAGO to their regular training courses. The guideline and sample agreements for contract review were developed by UAGO officers together with JICA consultants, which is expected to be utilized for UAGO officers to conduct speedy and effective reviewing process of contracts (ANNEX 5). A set of mobile court facilities for the mock trial has also been installed, which contributed to the delivery of the practical and tangible training courses at UAGO. In addition, other equipment required for the training facilities, such as library facilities, has been installed to facilitate the delivery of effective and sufficient training courses.			
Sub-Project II (SCOU)			
Output 1 (Capacity development for legislative drafting): Output 1 is mostly achieved.			

¹The achievement levels of the two outputs were judged from the assessment on the achievement levels of their objectively verifiable indicators, observations by JICA experts and C/Ps, and the progress of activity implementation.

Judicial officers actively participated in various in-country trainings and study tours to Japan on selected topics on specific laws/law areas such as Arbitration Law, IP related Laws and Insolvency Law (ANNEX 2 and 3). Through these training opportunities, SCOU officers acquired and accumulated the theoretical knowledge and the practical skills on such selected targeted law areas. In order to improve the decision-making mechanism in SCOU upon introducing a certain policy (including making new law or revising it), they started to create a policy paper which sets out the backgrounds and summary of such policy, which facilitated not only the internal decision-making but also external coordination with stakeholders, resulting in the improvement of overall legislative drafting process in SCOU. A policy paper on establishing court proceedings on IP disputes has been completed and planned activities set out in the policy paper are undergoing. In addition, a policy paper on introduction of mediation is being finalized.

Output 2 (Strengthening of human resource development): Output 2 is mostly achieved.

Training curricula for various training courses conducted by SCOU have been discussed at the working group (WG) and some of them were changed based on the results of the discussion (e.g. introduction of case study). Drafting of flowchart of the court proceedings, which SCOU experienced during the study tour to Japan, further led to creation of additional flowcharts for other proceedings by SCOU by itself, which were eventually used in their training courses. A series of seminars on such topics as new types of evidence were held in various states/regions other than Nay Pyi Taw, and SCOU, in cooperation with JICA experts, shared their knowledge and exchange views with judges outside Nay Pyi Taw on how to handle the new types of evidences. WG activity to develop a textbook for solving business disputes has been launched with JICA consultants, and the WG team specified the legal issues and selected relevant topics to be discussed in the textbook, reflecting current Myanmar contexts (ANNEX 5). In addition, equipment required for the training facilities in Hlaing Thar Yar, such as personal computers and air conditioners, has been installed to improve the physical environment for the trainings.

(2) Prospect of the Project Purpose being Achieved (To improve institutional and human resource capacity of Myanmar legal, judicial and relevant authorities to develop and implement laws in response to the needs of the times): The prospect is highly promising

Given the steady progress made towards achievement of the Project purpose's three indicators and the two outputs for each sub-project, it is evaluated that the Project is on the good track towards achieving the Project purpose. Up to date, the Counterparts took advantage of what they learned and experienced through WG activities, in-country trainings, and study tours to Japan. As mentioned above, SCOU and UAGO, on their own initiatives, applied their experiences obtained through project activities to other fields of their authority (e.g. introduction of policy paper), which proves the solid progress in development of the institutional capacity. In addition, new training methods and materials mentioned above were introduced in the training courses for judicial officers and law officers, and JICA advisors gave a number of lectures in such training courses, which developed individual capacity of relevant officers. Through these opportunities, the Counterparts also acknowledged the significance of practical and interactive training methodology, which they are now applying to their other training courses on various occasions. However, since the scope of the project itself is broad, it requires some time for the effects of capacity development mentioned above to take root in each organization and individual officers.

3-2. Summary of the Evaluation Result

(1) Relevance: High

The relevance of the Project is assessed as "High". Importance of "rule of law" was repeatedly mentioned in various government documents and speeches of higher-ups in the government of Myanmar. Ms. Aung San Suu Kyi, the state counselor, delivered a note saying "rebuilding and reforming rule of law and justice sector is top priority for Myanmar. It is vital for our efforts towards sustaining peace and development" in her opening speech at the Conference on Justice Sector Coordinating for Rule of Law on 7 March 2018. In addition, the Development Cooperation Charter of Japan as of 10 February 2015 mentioned "the establishment of the rule of law...constitute the basis for effective, efficient and stable economic and social activities". Therefore, it can be concluded that the purpose of the project is in line with both policies in Myanmar and Japan.

(2) Effectiveness: Relatively High

The effectiveness of the Project is assessed as "Relatively High." As described in the "Prospect of the Project Purpose being Achieved," the prospect of the Project purpose being achieved by the end of the project period is

highly promising given the steady progress made towards achieving the Project purpose's three indicators and the Project's two outputs for each sub-project.

(3) Efficiency: High

The efficiency of the Project is assessed as "High". In the Project, timely inputs for implementing activities have been duly provided. With proper utilization of the inputs, the Project activities have been conducted efficiently, resulting in achievements of a number of outputs mentioned above. Since the activities set out in the project design matrix of this Project has some flexibility, timely and effective inputs were possible and they were useful to achieve a number of outputs.

(4) Impact: Relatively high

The impact of the Project is assessed as "Relatively High". The introduction of policy paper has allowed the efficient and transparent decision-making process that reflects the relevant social and economic situation in Myanmar with the prospect of smooth future implementation of laws, which is expected to play an important role in promotion of "rule of law". Although such improvement of decision-making mechanism in the judicial sectors is still limited to SCOU at this moment, it is possible that the significance of such mechanism become widely acknowledged by other related parties, and thus similar improvements be spread to other authorities in the next few years. In addition, involvement of parliament members in study tours to Japan has proved to be useful for Myanmar to promote "rule of law." For example, some of the parliament members who participated in the study tour later played very significant roles in the reviewing process of the draft intellectual property laws at the Union Parliament, such as by pointing out to prevent a modification to the draft intellectual property laws, which might cause a breach of TRIPs (Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights), one of the most important international treaty on intellectual property. Such examples show significant symptoms of change in the current legal and judicial sector in Myanmar, which proves the the positive impacts of this project to promote "rule of law" in the country. In addition, creation of the guideline for contract review for UAGO and the textbook for solving business disputes will assist Myanmar to build an investment friendly nation since such undertakings will contribute to investment promotion and investors protection, which is one of the impacts expected to be produced by the Project

(5) Sustainability: Relatively High

The sustainability of the Project is assessed as "Relatively High". SCOU and UAGO made its own long-term strategic plans to put their priority on building "rule of law," which is in line with the Project purpose. In addition, a wide range of WG meetings were held on regular basis in a consecutive manner. WG members do not only engaged in the Project activities with JICA experts but also in activities which falls under the same category of the Project activities with other aid agencies, which together is contributing to produce synergic effects in the related legal and judicial fields. Further, activities required to be implemented by the policy paper on establishing court proceedings on IP disputes, such as making court regulations, textbooks, Q&As are being conducted at their own initiatives, which shows the SCOU has established sufficient mechanisms to ensure implementation of a certain policy. Considering such initiatives and activities already being undertaken by the Counterparts, the sustainability of the Project is assessed "relatively high."

3-3. Main Factors Promoting the Production of Effects

(1) Factors Concerning to Planning

- Involvement of other authorities: The project was designed to involve not only Counterparts but also other authorities (Union Parliament, Ministry of Planning and Finance, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Home Affairs, Directorate of Investment and Company Administration), which has contributed to build a network among different authorities.

(2) Factors Concerning to the Implementation Process

- Solid commitment by the Counterparts: Senior managements of both Counterparts show solid commitment on the Project activities by selecting appropriate officers and supporting them to participate in WG meetings, in-country seminars and study tours to Japan.
- Network with Legal professionals in Myanmar: Utilizing Japanese law firms in Yangon as local consultants (e.g. creation of guideline for contract review and textbook for solving business disputes for UAGO), timely, speedy and effective inputs were realized. Such inputs meet the needs of Myanmar, which is now experiencing the unprecedented rapid economic development.

3-4. Main Factors Inhibiting the Production of Effects

(1) Factor Concerning to Planning

- Assistance to Scrutinizing Bills: Sufficient materials should have been submitted from relevant ministries to UAGO in order for UAGO officers to scrutinize bills effectively and efficiently.

(2) Factors Concerning to the Implementation Process

- Suspension of Management Committee (MC) meetings: The project activities could have gained more recognition and attention among the Counterparts if the MC meetings, which involve management levels at the Counterpart organizations, had continued to be held on a regular basis.

3-5. Conclusion

Relevance of the Project is “High” due to its alignment with overarching policies and strategies in both Myanmar and Japanese government. Effectiveness is “Relatively High”. The Project purpose is expected to be achieved in certain areas, although how to disseminate the results of outputs to other organizations and stakeholders should be further considered. Efficiency is “High” as the Project outputs are mostly achieved. Although the prospect of achieving the Project overall goal is somewhat uncertain, Impact is “Relatively High” as other impacts are observed. Sustainability is “Relatively High” as it is ensured by policies and institutional mechanism of both Counterparts.

However, since “rule of law” itself is a very broad and abstract concept requires tremendous continuing effort and additional activities to build a certain level of society where “rule of law” is accepted, JICA and both Counterparts agreed to start a new project to further promote “rule of law” in Myanmar.

3-6. Recommendations

- 1) Disclosure of Achievement of Project Activities: While the Project made various remarkable achievements as mentioned above, many of them are yet to be widely recognized in the Myanmar society in general. Therefore, disclosure and/or dissemination of the materials created through project activities (e.g. the paper policy paper on establishing court proceedings on IP disputes, the textbook for solving business disputes, the guideline for contract review) should be recommended for the future activities to further disseminate those achievements to the wider stakeholders and beneficiaries.
- 2) Focus and Future Directions of the New Project: In order to further extend the achievements of the Project, emphasis should be placed on benefits which general public can enjoy through building user friendly legislation and disputes resolution mechanism, signifying the importance of individual rights of citizens and improvement of access to justice, while addressing to the specific needs and issues requested and pointed out by the Counterparts from time to time.
