5. 保健省中央医藥品供給部概要

Present facilities for the Storage.

The Medical Supply System is based almost exclusively on a single storage and distribution centre at CMSD Rangoon with a Sub-Depot at Mandalay playing a minor part and a Transit Camp at Monywa.

This system has necessitated establishment of large number of godowns at CMSD, Rangoon, a few at Sub-Depot, Mandalay and one at Monywa.

(1) Present facilities for the storage at CMSD, Rangoon consist of (18) number of godowns equipped with wooden/iron racks. One of the godowns is installed with air-conditioners, for storage of film Antibiotics, Injections and others which need cool storage and one pucca building for cold storage. Table below shows the use of these godown.

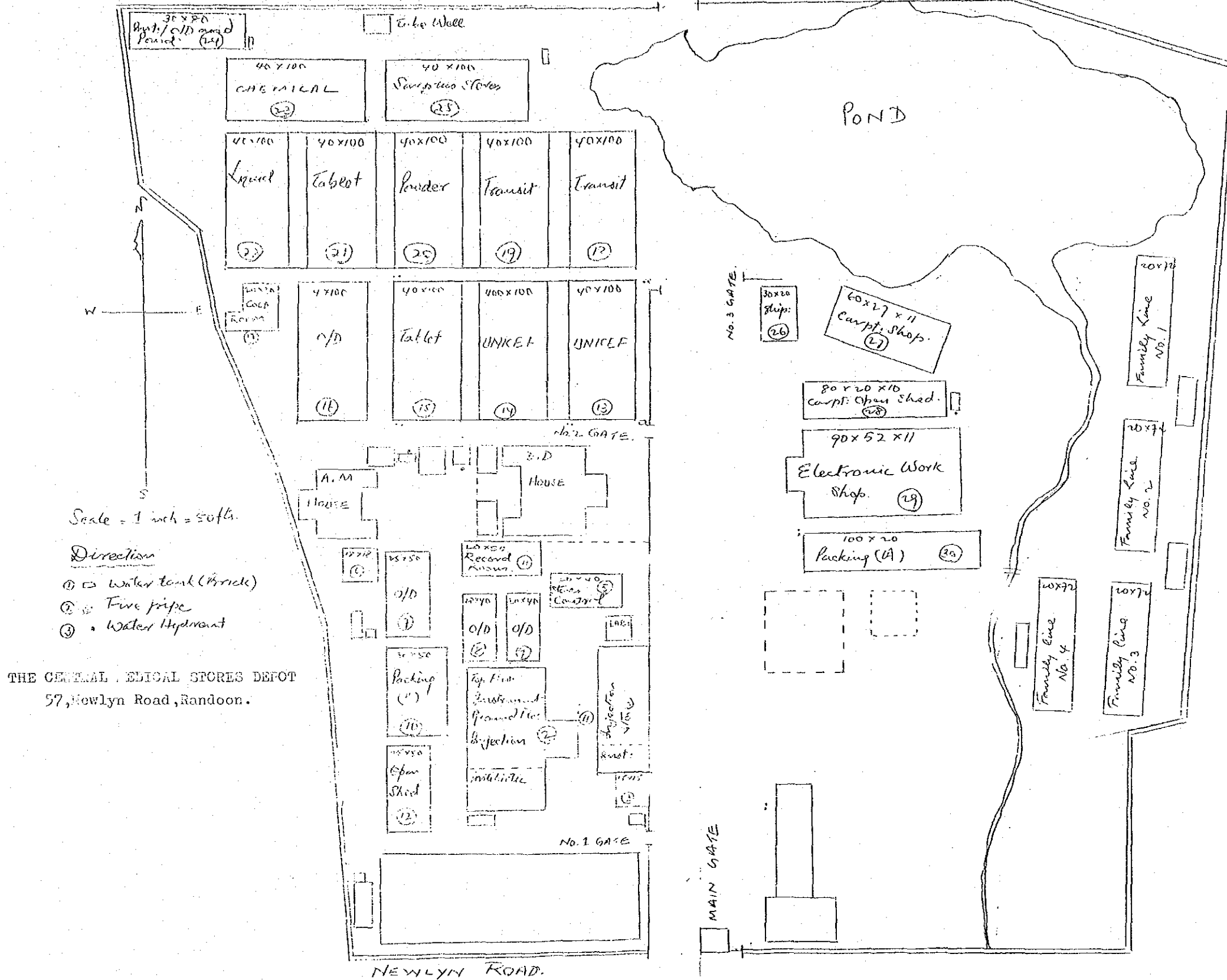

- (2) The storage facilities at Sub-Depot, Mandalay consist of two godowns.
1. Two story godown 150' x 60' x 30'
 2. One story godown 100' x 40' x 16' - built in 1979-80 with Third Four Year Plan.
- (3) The Transit Camp at Monywa has one godown measuring 60' x 30' x 16'.
- (4) One godown each, measuring 100' x 40' x 16', has been built at Akyab and Myitkyina in 1979-80 with the Third Four Year Plan.
- (5) One godown, 60' x 40' x 16', is under construction at Taunggyi with Third Four Year Plan.

Existing Facilities For Distribution of Drugs.

The following facilities are, at present, utilized in distributing medical supplies and equipment (S & E) throughout the whole country.

- a) For Tenasserim division and Arakan state medical S & E are distributed by Burma Five Star Line Corporation's coastal going vessels and schooners.
- b) For Irrawaddy division, medical S & E are despatched by riverine transport. The S & E for the most of townships of Magwe division situated on the west and east bank of Irrawaddy river were also distributed by steamers. But at present, as the heavy pilferage occurred repeatedly during transit, the usage of this system of distribution was dropped. The medical S & E for these areas are now despatched by rail or by road to Divisional Health Director, Magwe and from there the respective townships of these areas received their S & E through personal collection.
- c) The townships in Rangoon division and some townships in Pegu division receive the medical S & E through self-service collection system.
- d) The Medical S & E for remote areas where there exists no easy access such as Kengtung, Tachileik, Mongtong, and Monghsat townships of Shan State and Papun township of Karen State are distributed by chartered planes.
- e) The medical S & E for those townships of the remaining states/divisions which are situated on the rail road are distributed direct by rail to them and the remaining townships which are not on the rail road receive the medical S & E through Mandalay sub-depot, Monywa transit camp, State/Divisional Health Directors and Township Medical Officers. Rail transportation is used in forwarding of S & E from CMSD to those sub-depot, transit camp, state/divisional Health Directors and TMO's and some of these S & E are again despatched to the respective townships by road or by steamer from them and the remaining S & E are collected by the respective townships personally.

At present one sub-depot in Mandalay and one transit camp in Monywa are in existence and they are functioning in full swing. Mandalay sub-depot is dealing with Mandalay division, Northern Shan State and Sagaing division except those areas which are near to Monywa and which are situated in upper Chindwin. Monywa transit camp is dealing with Northern chin state, upper Chindwin and those townships which are near to it. The details of responsibilities of Mandalay sub-depot and Monywa transit camp are shown below.

In addition to Monywa transit camp, two warehouses each at Myitkvina and Akyab for establishment of two transit camps there, have been constructed. But operation of these two transit camps keeps pending due to non-appointment of the required staff.
