

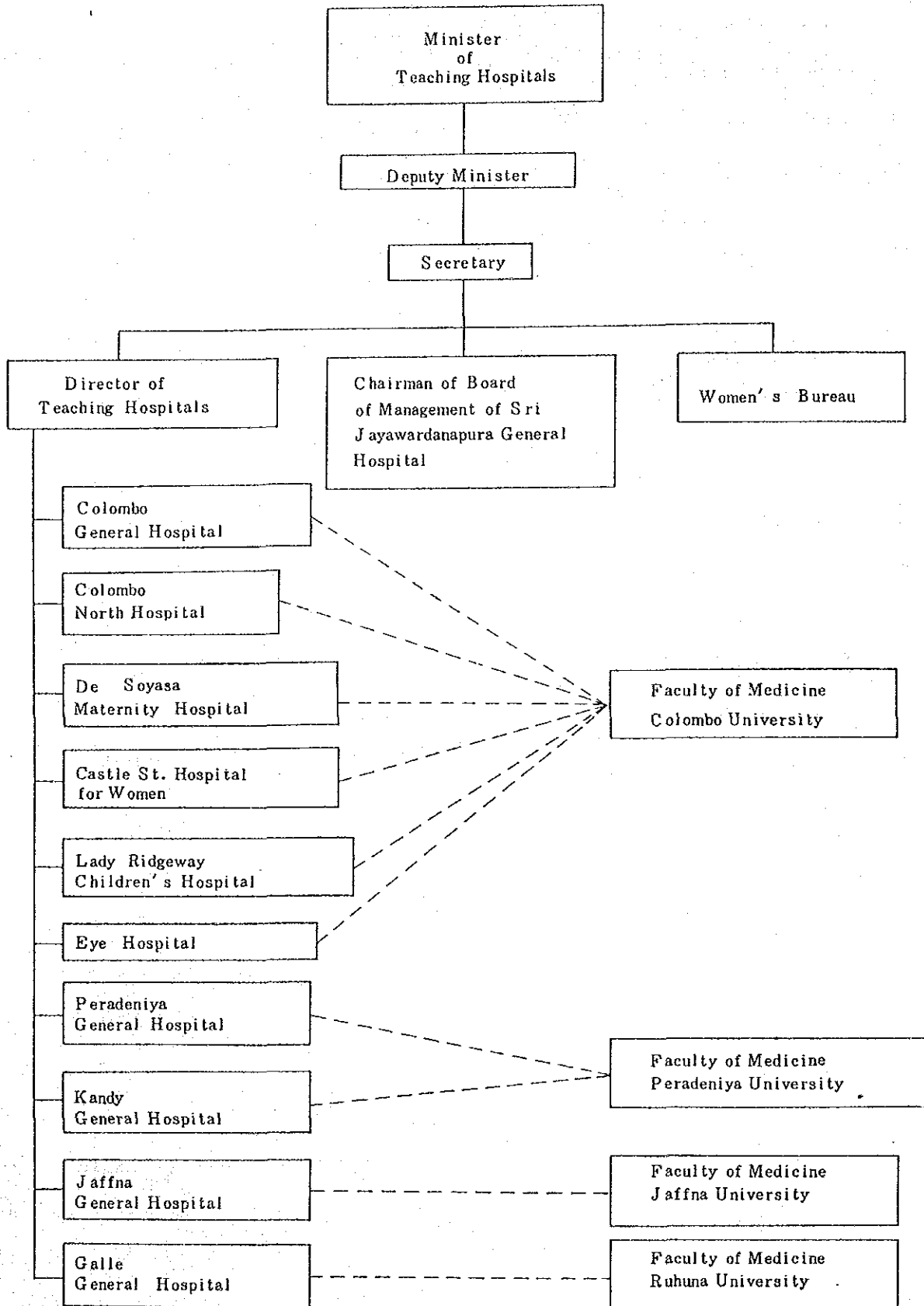

KOTTE HOSPITAL BOARD MEETS — Sunethra wants fresh approach to hospital management

"The Sri Jayawardenepura General Hospital is a very special hospital, gifted by the government and people of Japan at the special request of President J. R. Jayewardene. It is to be an important training centre for our future consultants." For these and other reasons, the government was convinced that a statutory board should be set up to manage the affairs of this hospital.

These observations were made by the Minister of Women's Affairs and Teaching Hospitals, Ms. Sunethra Ranasinghe, at the first meeting of the board of directors of the Sri Jayawardenepura Hospital in Kotte, which was held at the Ministry on Friday.

All members of the board were present at this meeting. They were, Dr. Rienzi Peiris, Chairman of the Board, Dr. Daya Samarasinghe, Secretary, Ministry of Women's Affairs and Teaching Hospitals, S. P. Chandradasa, representative of the Ministry of Finance and Planning, Dr. Malinga Fernando, Director of Health Services, Dr. S. A. Cabraal, Director of the Post Graduate Institute of Medicine, K. N. Choksy, Senior Counsel and M. T. L. Fernando, Senior partner, Ernest and Whinney.

Ms. Ranasinghe said:—

"It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all to this the first meeting of the board. It is gratifying to note your ready acceptance of my invitation to serve on the board. Thank you all very much.

"This is the first hospital board to be set up in this coun-

try and no doubt all eyes are on you to see how this experiment works, to see how you function. Being the first meeting I believe it would be proper for me as your Minister to convey to you my expectations. What I would like to see is a fresh approach to hospital management keeping in mind that the consumer — the patient must be given the best possible service — notwithstanding the accommodation sought by the patient be it standard accommodation (non-paying) or preferred accommodation (paying).

"This basic right must always be upheld. As I see it the board must be innovative. It should not follow the beaten track. The very purpose of setting up a board would be negated if the current improper and disappointing practices in the health services were imaged. I repeat there is no place for such inadequacies in this establishment.

What we need is a new direction, a new sense of purpose, yet it must be balanced and well judged. My consumer must be a satisfied person not as is currently believed one who seeks hospitalization only to die surely. This belief must and needs to be changed. As I see it this could only be possible by offering quality service.

"Here I would like to draw your attention to the fact that in hospital the average person is in strange surroundings. More so in this modern institution than in any other. There are several things he or she would not know how to handle. The same could be said about the visitors to the hospital. Do

give some thought to this aspect of the problem. Perhaps there is a need for a special category of staff to handle this problem.

By the same token I would like to see a happy contented staff who would work as a team not only within their own units but also sharing the burden of hospital management. Participatory management is the key word — I have already put this into practice in a number of institutions in my Ministry and one which I am confident will succeed. The foundation for this is already there in the committee of management laid down by statute.

"Next I would like to draw your attention to the question of post graduate training. My vision of this hospital in a few years time is one which is slowly evolving into a Sri Lanka Institute of Medicine which would be offering not only general hospital facilities but specialized services too. I would be delighted to see the investigative mind rewarded and encouraged to the fullest.

"Also, there is the question of financial management. From the memorandum already forwarded you would have noted that you have a formidable task ahead of you. With two accountants to help I am confident that you will be able to bridge that impossible gap hopefully with some assistance from the Finance Ministry.

"Finally, I would like to state that my Ministry will give you all the support and help you need in the tough assignment I have given you. In the meanwhile my best wishes to you all. I am confident that you will be successful.

Hospital board long needed, says doctor

Chairman of the Sri Jayawardhanapura Hospital Board, Dr. Rienzie Pieris, on Friday described the creation of the hospital board as the fulfilment of a long standing demand by the profession for independent hospital boards.

He was addressing the first meeting of the board at the Teaching Hospital's ministry conference room.

Dr. Peiris said he did not see any difficulty in getting the staff required; already a large number of doctors from abroad had expressed their willingness to join the hospital.

The only problem was finance. The hospital's administrative costs for a year would roughly be in

the region of Rs. 92 million. It would take at least two to three years before it could generate sufficient income from its paying wards.

Regarding nurses, Dr. Malinga Fernando said that the 600 nurses who had been specially trained for the hospital in 1981, were now working in va-

rious other institutions. There had been a shortage of nurses resulting from the training pro-

blems the department had in subsequent years.

The board decided to discuss these problems at its next meeting.

Kotte Hospital for research work too

The Teaching Hospitals Minister Mrs. Surethra Ranasinghe, addressing the first meeting of the Board of Management of the Sri Jayewardhanapura General Hospital on Friday envisaged turning the new hospital into a Sri Lanka Institute of Medicine in a few years, where even research could be done in addition to giving post-graduate training to doctors.

Mrs. Ranasinghe added "I would be delighted to see the investigative mind rewarded and encouraged to the fullest".

The Minister laying down her expectations from the management, said she would like to see a fresh approach to hospital management keeping in mind that the patient must be given the best possible service whether it was paying or non-paying

Mrs. Ranasinghe stressed that there was no place for such inadequacies in the new hospital. "What we need is a new direction, a new sense of purpose, yet it must be balance and well judged".

In a lighter vein, she said "My consumer (Patient) must be a satisfied person who will disprove the current belief that patients seek hospitalisation only to die.

She also spoke of the

need for a special type of staff for this very modern hospital as the average Sri Lankan patient or visitor to the hospital would find himself in strange surroundings. This staff should be there to guide them.

"By the same token I would like to see a happy contented staff who could work as a team not only within their own units. She said participatory management was the key word. "I have already put this into practice in a number of institutions in my Ministry and it is in one which I am confident will succeed. The foundation for this is already there in the Committee of Management laid down by the statute, she added.

The Chairman of the Board of Management, Dr. Rienzie Pieris, said the Sri Jayewardhanapura Hospital compares with

any new hospital in Japan. In order to maintain its cleanliness smoking has been prohibited within the hospital premises.

Associated with this meeting with the Minister were the Secretary to the Ministry of Teaching Hospitals, Dr. Daya Samarasinghe, and the other Directors of the board consisting of Mr. K. N. Choksy, Dr. Malinga Fernando, Mr. S. P. Chandradasa, Dr. S. A. Cabral and Mr. M. T. C. Fernando.

At the end of the meeting the journalists and the Board Members were taken on a guided tour of the hospital by the Japanese officials of Kaijima Corporation and Kume Co. who are the project managers and the architects of the Kotte hospital.

Patients to pay Rs. 20 per day

The government has decided that all patients at the new Japanese gifted Kotte-Sri Jayawardhanapura general hospital should be charged a minimum fee of Rs. 20 per day, health department sources said.

Charges in the full fee-paying section of the hospital will be higher, these sources said.

It was originally decided that the paying patients be charged fees that would help subsidise the non-paying sections of the hospital.

But it has now been agreed that a minimum Rs. 20 per day charge, which will be substantially below the actual cost of maintaining a patient, be levied in what was to be the non-paying section of the hospital.

The new hospital which was completed sometime ago is now due to be opened on September 23.

Its board of management has already advertised a wide range of jobs including that of medical directors, consultants, medical, nursing, paramedical and subordinate appointments.

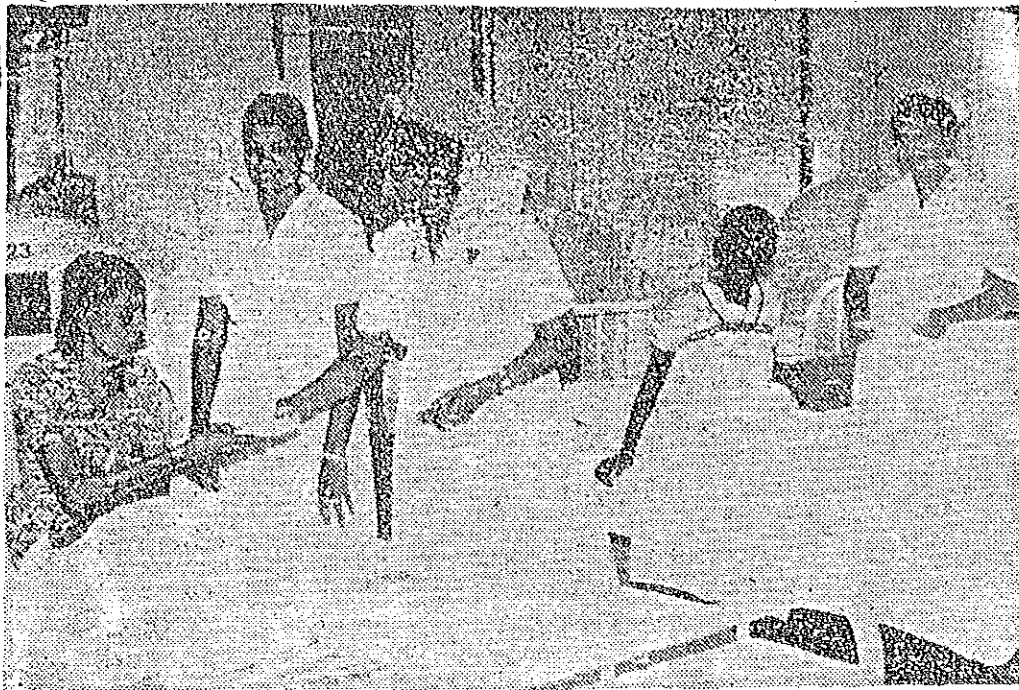


First patient at Kotte hospital
