

Announcing the results of make-up examination.

Article 48. The results of the make-up examinations are collectively announced in a visible place in the school on the certified tables after the examinations and the work of the Board of Teachers have been completed. On this table, the marks obtained by each student and whether they have passed or failed according to these marks are indicated.

Limitation on the student transfers.

Article 49. Students may not be transferred and the enrollment of those who have transferred may not be performed from five days before the beginning of the waiting and responsibility examinations to their termination, from five days before the beginning of the make-up examinations to the end of the meeting of the Board of Class Teachers. However, the transfer of those students who quit school on punishment and of those who pass their grades directly may be performed within these periods, if they request so.

SECTION FOUR BOARD OF CLASS TEACHERS

Decision of board of class teachers.

Article 50. The status of the students who have unsuccessful marks at the end of the make-up examinations are discussed in the board of class teachers to be convened under the chairmanship of the principal or of his assistant to be commissioned by the principal.

In this meeting, the success of the student in other courses, in previous years, his attendance and disciplinary status are all evaluated by the student file kept by class teacher. At the end of this evaluation, the Board of Class Teachers,

a) Considers successful in that course the student who is unsuccessful in one course whatever the average achievement is at the end of the year or makes no change in his status. Those students whose status have not been changed attend the next higher grade, being responsible for that course,

b) decides on the attendance to the next higher grade directly or being responsible for one course of the students whose average of achievement is at least "5.00" even though they are unsuccessful in more than one course or makes no change in their status.

c) makes no change in the status of the students whose average of achievement at the end of the year is not "5.00" even though they are unsuccessful in more than one course.

In order to make any changes in the status of the students in the board of class teachers, the students must have taken the make-up examination for the course in which they are unsuccessful and the mark obtained by them in the examination must be at least (3) three.

If the mark of one of the courses in which student within the provision of the paragraph above is unsuccessful is (2) two or less at the end of the year and the others are at least (3) three, the status of this student is discussed in the board of class teachers, if the marks of two or more courses in which the student is unsuccessful are (2) two and less at the end of the year, the other courses in which the student is unsuccessful are not discussed in the board of class teachers.

In order to discuss the status of those students who transferred from other schools for make-up examinations first the necessary documents are requested from the school from which the student transferred. In case the documents are not sent until the termination of the work of the board of class teachers, the status of the student is evaluated by the available documents and information.

Article 51. Students are not permitted to pass to the next higher grade by the decision of the Board of class teachers from the following courses, whatever their averages of achievement are at the end of the year.

- a) Turkish in all the grades of secondary schools
- b) Workshop; workshop and technology; workshop and technology; workshop; technology and its laboratory in the occupational high schools and technical high schools; one occupational course which can replace these courses in some occupational branches and specified in their programs and only one course in each grade.
- c) Inorganic chemistry and laboratory in grade IX; analytical chemistry laboratory in grades X and XI in the chemistry occupational schools.
- d) Organic chemistry and its laboratory in grade X; analytic chemistry laboratory in grade XI; analytic chemistry laboratory in grade XII in chemistry occupational high schools.

- e) Koran in all grades of Imam-Preacher High Schools
- f) The Courses given in Turkish in the institutions set up by foreigners and in the schools specified in Article 25 of Law No.625, dated June 8, 1965 on the Special Educational Institutions.

Article 52. The evaluation of the student in accordance with the principles mentioned in Article 50 is also taken into account in the board of class teachers while discussing the course or courses in which students are unsuccessful. Decision is taken by majority. In case the votes are equal, the decision of the side of the course teacher is valid.

Article 53. The students who reduce the number of courses they are unsuccessful to one, including also the courses specified in paragraphs, a, e and f of Article 51 are permitted to attend the next higher grade, being responsible for that course. However, the students who are unsuccessful in the courses of workshop:workshop and technology; workshop, technology and its laboratory, and in the courses which can replace these courses according to the characteristics of some branches, indicated in their programs and who are unsuccessful only in one occupational course in occupational high schools and technical high schools are not permitted to attend to the next higher grade.

Article 54. One of the following procedures is applied to the students who are unsuccessful in more than one courses and in whose status no change has been made by the board of class teachers and to those students whose averages of achievement at the end of the year are less than

"5.00".

a) Such student doesn't attend school and takes examinations for the courses in which he is unsuccessful in the following educational year.

b) The student repeats the same grade.

The guardian of the student is informed in writing, of which of these two ways he wants to choose. The guardian must inform in writing the principalship of his decision until at least the end of the first week of the starting of the school.

Paragraph (a) of this Article 25 applied to the students whose guardians have no written requests.

The students who are unsuccessful in the courses specified in paragraphs b,c,d of Article 51 must attend these courses in the following educational year.

Article 55. The marks of the students who pass grades by the decision of the board of class teachers are not changed, the following statement is entered in the records of the school: " he has been considered successful in the course of by the decision of the board of class teachers.

SECTION FIVE

WAITING, RESPONSIBILITY AND PREVENTION EXAMINATIONS

PART ONE

WAITING AND RESPONSIBILITY EXAMINATIONS

Article 56. The waiting examinations and responsibility examinations of the students who wait in the courses in which they are unsuccessful in accordance with paragraph (a) of article 54 and of those students who at-

tend to the next higher class, being responsible for one course, are carried out in accordance with the principles of the make-up examinations. The date of these examinations is determined in the work calendar prepared in each year.

Article 57. The status of achievement on the courses in which the students to whom the provision of paragraph (a) of Article 54 has been implemented since they are unsuccessful in more than one course in a grade is determined in accordance with the results of waiting and responsibility or the make-up examinations. In order for these students to be considered successful, they must get at least (5) five in each course such students are not permitted to pass to the next higher grade by the decision of the board of class teachers. However, those students who reduce the number of courses they are unsuccessful to one attend to the next higher grade, being responsible for that course.

The status of achievement of those students who repeat the same grade by being subject to the provision of paragraph (b) of Article 54 are determined in the same way as those of the one-year students.

Article 58. If the students subject to the provision of Article 54 cannot get the right to attend the next higher grade at the end of the second year either, they may take the examinations for the courses in which they are unsuccessful for a maximum of four more successive periods, in the examination periods following that educational year, if they desire so. Those students who do not take one or several of the examinations during these four periods are considered to have used the right of taking the examination for that period. The certificates of those students who quit school show how many of the rights of taking these four period examinations have been used.

The students who quit school with certificate without using all the rights of taking four period examinations may use their remaining rights in that

school if they apply to the school which they quit or to any other school at least (5) five days before the beginning of waiting, responsibility and make-up examinations. Those students who are successful in these examination attend to the next higher grade provided that they meet the conditions of enrollment and admission. Those students who do not meet the conditions of enrollment and admission or who are unsuccessful in the four periods of examinations are taken out of school. Such student may take the examination of graduation outside school, their previous rights being reserved.

The students who cannot gain the right to attend to the next higher class at the end of the second year may not make use of the rights to get the student card, student identity card, certificate to delay drafting, participation in the sportive, cultural, and social activities in the school and the like student rights.

PART TWO PREVENTION EXAMINATIONS

Article 59. As a general rule, there is no prevention for examinations. However, a prevention examination is arranged for a student who proves that he is unable to take this examination due to an illness which require treatment in bed during the make up examination by a certificate of health to be obtained from an official hospital, government doctor or school doctor and who certifies this case to the principalship at least

until the evening of the day on which the examination was held and whose certificate of health has been approved by the administration of the school. A new report indicating that no prevention exists to take the examination is requested from the students whose period of report exceeds the date of examination but who want to take examination in the prevention examinations.

Those who do not bring the health certificate for whatever reason until the end of the working hour of the day on which the examination is held.

Furthermore, prevention examination is also arranged for those students who cannot take the make-up examinations due to the natural disasters such as fire, earthquake, etc. or the death or illness of such close relatives as father, mother, sister, brother or representing our country, by the permission of the Ministry on international contests or national sports, music, folklore etc. and who prove this case with a certificate to be obtained from an official authority. The school administration is immediately informed of the excuse and it is certified in three days at most.

The prevention examination is carried out within 16 days at most from the termination of the make-up examinations and on the day to be determined by the principalship. No prevention examination is administered outside this period.

The status of passing grade of the students who take prevention examination are also decided upon by the discussion in the board of class teachers as in the case of those students who take make-up examinations.

SECTION SIX
WAIVER OF RESPONSIBILITY

Article 60. The examinations of those students who are unsuccessful only in one course and who attend to the next higher grade, being responsible for that course are carried out together with the waiting and responsibility or make-up examinations.

The one course responsibility at those students who succeed in these examinations is waived.

Besides this, in order to waive the responsibility of the student who attends to the next higher grades being responsible for one course;

- a) that student must be successful at the end of the year in the same course given in the next higher grade where he attends.
- b) he must pass grade directly or by the decision of the board of class teachers in the grade where he attends.

In case the student who transferred, being responsible for the optional course is successful in the course which has taken for that optional course in his new school, his responsibility for the previous course is waived.

The provision of paragraph (b) is not applied to the courses which terminate in the intermediate grades and does not continue in the higher grades of high schools and schools equivalent to high schools. For these courses, the responsibility for one course goes on until graduation. Unless the student succeeds in the responsibility course, he can not get diploma.

The students who attend high schools or schools equivalent to high schools being responsible for one course from the secondary schools take the responsibility examination in the secondary school of the high school or school equivalent to high school where they attend, if that school has a secondary school, if not, in the school to be determined by the Directorate of national education.

The student, the principalship of the school where the student has transferred and the principalship of the school where the examination will take place are informed of the name and place of the school where these students will take the responsibility examination at least 15 days before the examinations start.

At the end of the examination, the principalship of the school which will prepare the diploma is informed of the mark obtained by the student. If the student who attends to the first grade of high school, being responsible for the course of social sciences in the last grade of the secondary schools succeeds in both the geography and history courses given in that grade, his responsibility for the course of social sciences is waived. Similarly, if the student who attends to the first grade of

high school, being responsible for the course of science succeeds in the courses of physics, chemistry and biology or in the course or courses equivalent to these courses given in that grade his responsibility for the course of science is waived. .
In any grade, one may not pass to the next higher grade, being responsible for more than one course.

SECTION SEVEN
ONE COURSE EXAMINATIONS

Article 61. The students who reduce the number of their unsuccessful courses to one at the end of the make-up examinations are taken to one course examination. The date of one course examination is determined by the Ministry. These examinations are carried out in accordance with the principles of make-up examinations and have no preventing right.

SECTION EIGHT
DETERMINATION OF THE MARK AND DEGREE OF DIPLOMA

Average of Year end achievement

Article 62. The average of the year-end achievement is the weighted average of the year end marks of the courses given in that year. The weighted average is calculated as follows:

- a) The weight of a course is equal to the number of the weekly lecture hours of that course
- b) The year end mark received in a course is multiplied by the number of weekly lecture hours of that course. The number thus obtained is the "weighted mark" of that course.
- c) The total of the weighted marks of all the courses given in the same year is divided by the total of the weekly lecture hours of the same courses. The number so obtained is the "average of the year-end achievement" of the student. In the calculation of the year-end achievement, the division is carried to two fractional numbers. The average of the year-end achievement of those who are the graduates of occupational high school and who graduate from high school by taking examinations of graduates of high school by taking examinations of graduation outside the school or of those who are the graduates of high school and who graduate from occupational high school by taking examinations of graduation outside the school is the arithmetic mean of the average of the year end achievement marks obtained by the student in the courses for which he has taken examination of graduation outside the school and the diploma mark he has received previously in the school from which he has graduated.

The average of the year-end achievement is entered in the file of the student and in the book of passing grade and of diploma.

Issuance of Diploma

Article 63. A diploma is issued to every student who graduates from secondary school, high school or school equivalent to high school.

The mark and Degree of Diploma

Article 64. The mark and degree of diploma are calculated as follows:

a) The mark of diploma is the arithmetic mean of the averages of three year-end achievements in the schools with a three years of educational period and of the averages of four year end achievements in the schools with a four years of educational period. In the calculation of the mark of diploma the division is carried to two fractional numbers.

b) The marks of diploma of those who are the graduates of occupational high schools and who graduate from high school by taking examinations of graduation outside the school on of those who are the graduates of high school and who graduate from occupational high school by taking examinations of graduation outside the school are the averages of the year-end achievements specified in article 62. The mark of diploma is indicated on the diploma.

c) The degree of diploma is indicated as follows according to the mark of the diploma. It is written as excellent, good, fair on the diploma.

| <u>Mark of Diploma</u> | <u>Degree of Diploma</u> |
|------------------------|--------------------------|
| 10.00 - 8.50 | Excellent |
| 8.49 - 6.50 | Good |
| 6.49 - and less | Fair |

Date of diploma

Article 65. The date of diploma is

- a) The date of termination of the courses, for those who graduate directly
- b) the date of the termination of the examinations for those who graduate at the end of the examinations of graduation outside the school, waiting responsibility, one course and prevention examinations.
- c) the date of the termination of the meeting of the board of class teachers, for those who graduate at the end of the make-up examinations.
- d) the date of graduation for those who graduate at the end of the training course.

The diplomas of those students who come to the last grade are successful in all the courses at the end of the year but who have not completed the training work which the students are responsible for 150 hours in the second grade of occupational high schools, a total of 300 hours in the second and third grades of occupational high schools and at least 6 months in the three educational years of occupational high schools of Hotel and Tourism carry the date of the day following the date on which they have completed their training work which they must perform.

Article 66. The degree of diploma of those students who complete a part of their education abroad and return to the country is determined according to:

- a) the averages of the year-end achievement during the years of their education abroad and in our country.
- b) in the case the averages of the year -end achievement during the years of their education abroad are not available, the averages of the year-end achievements during the years of their education in our country.

Other matters concerning the preparation of the diplomas

Article 67. The "book of passing grade and of Diploma, and the regulations on the arrangement of diplomas" are observed on the other matters concerning the preparation of diplomas.

SECTION NINE
SELECTION OF THE MOST SUPERIOR OF
THE SCHOOL

Article 68. The most superior student of the school is selection from among those students whose marks of diploma are the highest by the board of teachers, by also getting the opinion of the disciplinary board, irrespective of their sections or branches and from among those students who have not received a punishment of "quitting school with certificate" or a heavier punishment, at the end of each academic year in the last grades of high schools and the schools equivalent to high schools.

In case the marks of diploma of the students are even, the student whose average of achievement in the last grade is higher is selected the most superior student. If they are still even, the most superior student of the school is selected by reviewing the year-end achievement marks beginning with the next lower grade down until the evenness has changed.

The "Student Selection and Placement Center" is informed of the most superior student determined by the principalship on time.

SECTION TEN
TRAINING COURSES

Article 69. Training courses are arranged for those courses which cannot be given during the academic year because of the lack of teachers in the second semester of the educational year or in the summer vacations.

The teachers who will instruct in the training courses are commissioned by the governorship from among the teachers in the province. If this is not possible, the necessary measures are taken by the Ministry. The selection of the subjects to be studied in the training course is made and the duration of the course is determined by the principal and the teacher or teachers who will teach in the course. The duration of the course may not be less than the total of the lecture hours of that course in one semester. The mark obtained in the examination to be administered at the end of the course by the teacher of the course on the subjects studied during the course is considered the year-end mark. Those who get a mark less than "5" and so fails in this examination take a make-up examination on the subjects studied during the course.

SECTION ELEVEN: ATTENDANCE

Article 70. The period of academic year is calculated by counting the number of days on which the school is open, starting from the day on which courses started to the day on which the courses terminated. Holidays and the days on which the school is not open for whatever reason are not taken into account. The periods in the morning and in the afternoon are counted half day in the schools where there is normal education (also including women's occupational high schools, ceramic, textile high school and the like occupational high schools): these periods are counted as one day in the schools where there is double education.

In technical high schools and industrial occupational schools, the theoretical courses and workshop are calculated as a separate whole day each and every half day is counted as one day.

Accordingly ;

- a) In the schools where blocked education is implemented, the four hour parts of the courses and workshop studies which are 7 or 8 hours are counted one day each.
- b) If there is 2 hours of lectures and 2 hours of workshop studies in a morning education as a necessity of the program, the absence of the student who does not attend this program is considered as half day for each of the lecture and workshop.
- c) If a student attends first lecture but does not attend the next and following lecture without any excuse, his absence is counted as half day.

Article 71. Students must attend the school.

- a) A student who does not attend the school for a total of 20 days in an academic year is considered unsuccessful, whatever his grades are.
- b) The students who participate in the domestic and foreign training courses such as theatre, sports, music, folklore, etc. are considered to be on leave during their absence from the school. Permission is given to the student who participates in the domestic activities by the directorate of national education and to the student who participate foreign activities by the Ministry of National Education. The total of these leaves and the total of other absences may not exceed a third of the period of attendance.

c) Attendance to the training courses is obligatory. The student whose absence is equal to a third of the lecture hours they have to attend in the training courses is not allowed to take the examination at the end of this course and he fails for make-up examination.

Article 72. Although the students who were not able to come to the school on time and whose excuses for that have been accepted by the school are admitted to the lectures and training courses, they are considered to have come late on that day. Being late is a matter for the first lecture hour. Those students who come to the school after this first hour of lecture are admitted to school. But the last paragraph of article 70 of this regulations is applied to them.

The way of admitting in the class of the student who came late in the first lecture hour is decided upon by the board of directors at the beginning of the year.

Disciplinary action is taken against those students who make a habit of coming late and who leave the classroom or school without permission.

Article 73. The students who are on leave, while attending the school, due to the natural disasters such as fire, earthquake or because of serious reasons such as heavy illness or death of close relatives such as mother, father, sister or brother and those students who cannot attend the school with excuse because of the treatment or operation of a disease and those students who are arrested and let free or who are arrested and freed to carry out trial free or acquitted are subjected to the same procedures as the students who have completed their periods of attendance, provided that;

- a) their marks of behavior have not been reduced,
- b) they have completed at least two thirds of their periods of attendance and received one semester mark,
- c) the excuse has been proven by a certificate of health or document which is properly obtained from an official authority and delivered to the administration of the school on time and the document of excuse must have been delivered within seven days from the date of termination of the excuse,
- d) the student must be believed to be industrious by the board of teachers.

The cases in which one will be considered to have used his right of education.

Article 74. The following are the cases in which one will be considered to have used his right of education in a grade:

- a) to have completed the period of absence specified in paragraph (a) of article 71 without any excuse approved by the school even though his year-end marks are sufficient to pass,
- b) to be unable to get the right to attend the next higher grade at the end of the make-up or prevention examinations,
- c) to have quit the school for whatever reason while attending the school in the second semester.

Provisions of article 58 are applied to the students who are considered to have used their rights of education in two successive years.

Considering the right of education not to have been used

Article 75. The students who do not attend the school at all or who quit school without attending the school in the second semester are considered

not to have used their rights of education for that year.

SECTION TWELVE

WORKING DAYS AND HOLIDAYS

Article 76. The academic year in the secondary schools, high schools and schools equivalent to high schools may not be less than 170 working days. The starting and termination dates of the courses, enrollment and admission of the students, the starting and termination dates of the examinations of graduation outside the school, make-up and one course examinations, semesters and summer holidays are determined on the working calendar prepared by the Ministry every year.

Article 77. Academic year is divided into two semesters. There is a resting holiday between the first and second semesters. The resting holiday is 15 days between the last week of January and first week of February.

Article 78. The mark lists for the first semester are handed in at least three days before the semester ends, and the mark lists for the second semester are handed in the principalship until the evening of the day on which the courses terminate.

Article 79. The meeting of the board of teachers is convened before the make-up examinations and the meetings of the board of class teachers are convened at the termination of the make-up examinations.

Article 80. The mark certificates for the first semester are issued before the resting holiday and they are returned to the class teacher at the end of the resting holiday, being signed by the guardians of the students.

The mark certificates issued at the end of the second semester are not returned to the school.

The list showing the examination results of the students who take examinations for the courses of previous years are collectively announced in the school in a place which can be seen easily by everybody.

SECTION THIRTEEN

OTHER PROVISIONS

Article 81. This regulations is not implemented in the practical craft and practical women's craft schools, women's technical teacher training institutes and in the schools determined by the Ministry in order to develop programs and regulations.

Article 82. The provisions of this regulations are also valid for schools of foreigners and minority schools and other schools, high schools and schools equivalent to high school which have separate regulations. The provisions which are specified in the special regulations of these schools and which are not against this regulations are in force. However, the special provisions in the special regulations of the schools and grades of special education are reserved.

Article 83. The programs of examinations of graduation outside the school, waiting, responsibility, and make-up examinations start and their 3 copies are sent to the directorate of National Education for approval.

Article 84. The written examination papers to be used by the students in the examinations of graduation outside the school; waiting, responsibility, make-up, prevention and one course examinations are in the form

approved by the Ministry. They are sealed by the seal of the school and handed out to the students by the administration of the school. In case other types of paper are used, depending on the characteristic of the course, these papers are also sealed by the administration of the school.

Provisional Article 1. The students who reduce the number of courses in which they are unsuccessful, irrespective of the kind of the course, to one in the academic year of 1982 - 1983 in the public and private secondary schools, high schools and schools equivalent to high schools are allowed to attend the next higher grade in the academic year of 1983-1984, being responsible for that course.

The students of preparatory grades and the students who are unsuccessful in the courses listed in paragraphs c, d, and e concerning the vocational and technical high schools of article 50 of the regulations on passing grade and examination prior to this regulations are not allowed to attend the next higher grade.

Provisional Article 2. The students who attend only the courses in which they are unsuccessful in accordance with the provision of paragraph (b) of Article 53 of the regulations on passing grade and examination prior to this regulations either take examinations at the end of the academic year of 1983 - 1984 for the courses in which they are unsuccessful, waiting out of the school or repeat the same grade, according to the written requests of their guardians.

Basis

Article 85. This regulations has been prepared, based on amended article 9 of Law No. 2287 and on Law No. 1739.

SECTION FOURTEEN

PROVISIONS OF VALIDITY

Article 86. The regulation on passing grade and examination of the Fundamental Educational Schools (secondary schools) and of the Secondary Educational Institutions connected with the Ministry of National Education, the amendments of this regulations and the circular provisions concerning the implementation of this regulations are not valid.

Article 87. This regulations enters into force on the date of its publication, being valid from the beginning of the educational year of 1983 - 1984.

Article 88. The provisions of this regulations are implemented by the Minister of National Education.

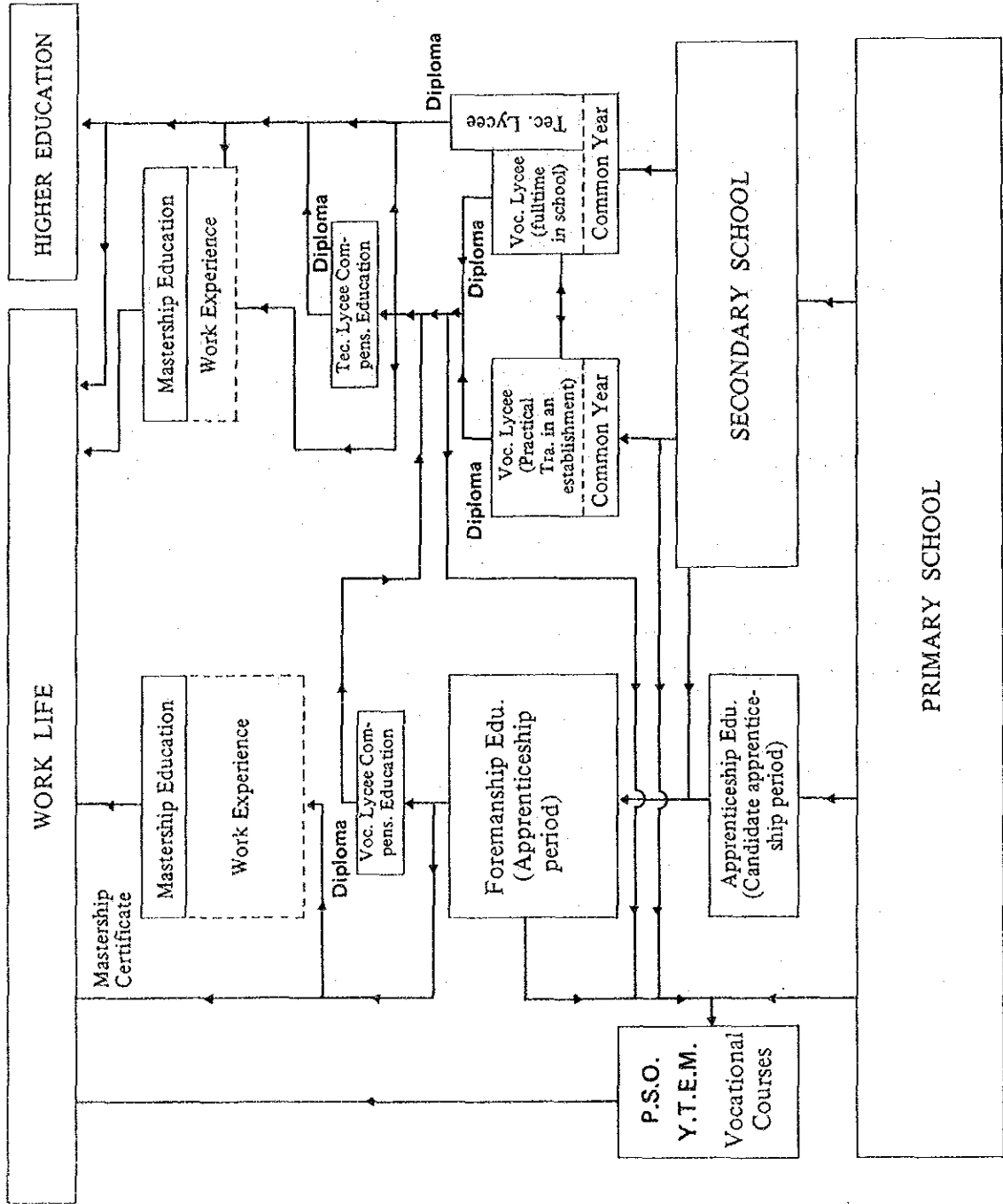
EXPLANATIONS

- 1) For students who failed only one course, if the course requires both written and oral or clinical examination, the written and oral or clinical examination should take place on the same day, the former in the morning and the latter in the afternoon.
- 2) Special days and, weeks etc. which are not stated in this calendar are subject to relevant sentences of law and necessary action shall be taken accordingly.
- 3) The schools applying intensified education are also subject to this academic calendar.
- 4) In the case of insufficiency of days reserved for examinations two examinations may be given on same day, one in the morning and the other in the afternoon.
- 5) Students who are entering into out-of-school graduation examinations may be given the exams of identically called courses of different classes on the sameday.
- 6) "Student Selection Examination" and "Student Installation Examination" shall be made on 20 April 1986 and 29 June 1986 respectively.
- 7) The studies of "Formal Vocational Education for Adults" which is applied in vocational and technical educational institutions at present, are subject to the calendar specified for schools where Vocational and Technical Education Project (METEP) is applied. However, the regulations due to fall semester make-up examinations shall not be applied in Formal Vocational Education for Adults.

- 8) The hotel-keeping and Tourism Vocational Lycees where Vocational and Technical Education Project is applied are subject to calendar of Hotel-keeping and Tourism Vocational Lycees.
- 9) On those days when entrance examinations for Science Lycees, Anatolia Lycees, Free State Boarding Schools and Industrial Vocational Lycees are to be made, the education shall be broken only in those schools where the examinations are to be made.
- 10) Registration dates of the public schools educating some courses in foreign language and Private Turkish and foreign schools are stated in their particular regulations.
- 11) Technical education schools for girls, and kindergartens are subject to the academic calendar of the schools they are tied up.
- 12) Student registration shall be made in the beginning of and within the academic year continually (forming different course groups) according to 20th article of Girls Technical Education Vocational Training Schools Regulations.
- 13) Since the beginning and ending dates of theoretical and practical education shall be stated by Governorship upon the proposal of local apprenticeship education committee according to 44th article of "Regulations on education of Apprentice, Foreman and Master", provinces can arrange separate calendars when necessary.

- 14) Since the base is the completion of minimum durations of theoretical and practical education (in hours and in years respectively as stated in programs) in apprenticeship in the case that an apprentice or foreman class is formed, the education may start out of the programmed dates.
- 15) Examination of free boarding schools to select who will study in return for compulsory service shall be made on 27 May 1986 Tuesday (Health Vocational Lycees under Ministry of Public Health and Welfare, Agricultural Vocational Lycees under Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Villiage Affairs, Finance Vocational Lycees under Ministry of Finance and Cdstoms, Rep. of Turkey Public Railway Vocational Lycees under Ministry of Communications, Anatolia Meteorology Vocational Lycee under Prime Ministry General Directorate of Meteorology Affairs, Land Register and Cadastral Vocational Lycee under Prime Ministry General Directorate of Land Registration and Cadastre).
