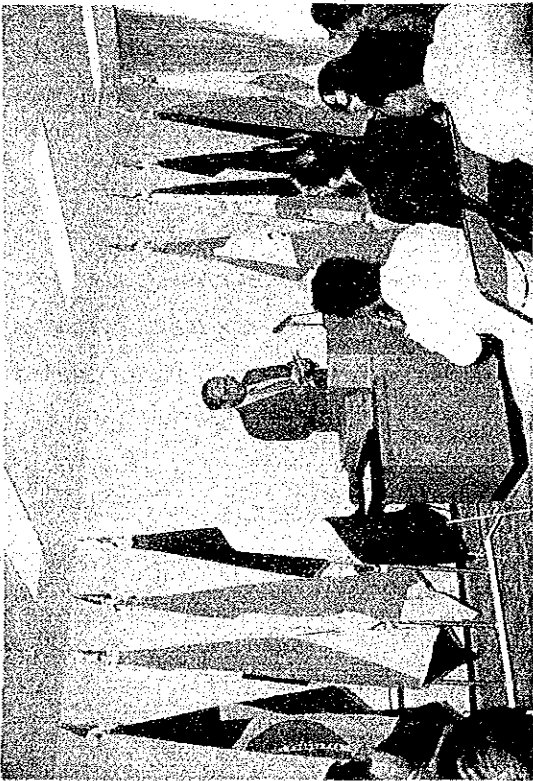
Since our arrival in Japan to this day when we are about to say ARIGATO GOZAIMASU for the opportunity to come to Japan and see some of our
