In response to the request of the Government of the Republic of the Philippines (hereinafter referred to as "GOP"), the Government of Japan hereinafter referred to as "GOJ") has decided to conduct the Feasibility Study on Integrated Jalajala Rural Development Project in the Republic of the Philippines (hereinafter referred to as "the Study"), and exchanged the Notes Verbales with GOP concerning the implementation of the Study.

\_\_\_\_\_Japan\_International\_Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA"), the official agency responsible for the implementation of the technical cooperation programmes of GOJ will undertake the Study, in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations in force in Japan.

On the part of GOP; Department of Agrarian Reform (hereinafter referred to as "DAR"), shall act as a counterpart agency to the Japanese study team and also as a coordinating body in relation with other governmental and non-governmental organizations concerned for the smooth implementation of the Study .

The present document constitutes the implementing arrangement between JICA and DAR under the above mentioned Notes Yerbales exchanged between two governments.

II. OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

The objective of the Study is to formulate an integrated rural development project in Jalajala Municipality and to verify technical, economical and financial feasibility of the project.

· Π. STUDY AREA

The study area covers about 4,100 hectares in Jalajala Municipality in

Rizal Province.

IY. SCOPE OF THE STUDY

The Study will consists of two Phases.

I. Phase I

6) Project evaluation

V. REPORTS

JICA shall prepare and submit the following reports in English to GOP.

1. Inception Report

Thirty (30) copies at the commencement of the Phase I study.

2. Progress Report (I)

Thirty (30) copies at the end of the field study of the Phase I study.

3. Interim Report

Thirty (30) copies at the commencement of the Phase II study.

4. Progress Report (II)

Thirty (30) copies at the end of the field study of the PhaseII study.

·S. ·Draft Final Report

Thirty (30) copies at the end of Phase II study.

GOP shall provide JICA with its comments on the draft final report

within one (1) month after the receipt of it.

6. Final Report

Fifty (50) copies within one(1) months after the receipt of the comments of GOP on the Draft Final Report.

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VI. STUDY SCHEDULE

The tentative work schedule is shown in the Appendix.

VIL UNDERTAKING OF GOP

In accordance with the Notes Verbales exchanged between GOJ and GOP, GOP shall accord privileges, immunities and other benefits to the Japanese study team and, through the authorities concerned, take necessary measures to facilitate smooth conduct of the Study.

- 1. GOP shall be responsible for dealing with claims which may be brought by third.parties\_against the member's of the Japanese study team and shall hold them harmless in respect of claims or liabilities arising in the course of, or otherwise connected with the discharge of their duties in the implementation of the Study, except when such claims or liabilities arise.from\_gross\_negligence on willful misconduct of the above-mentioned members.
- 2. DAR shall, at its own expense, provide the Japanese study team with the following, if necessary, in cooperation with other agencies concerned:
- (1) Available data and information related to the Study,
- (2) Counterpart personnel,
- (3) Suitable office space with necessary equipment both in Metro Manila and in the project site,
- (4) Credentials or identification cards to the members of the Japanese study team.
- 3. DAR shall make necessary arrangements with other governmental and nongovernmental organizations concerned for the following:
- (1) to secure the safety of the Japanese study team
- (2) to permit the members of the Japanese study team to enter. leave and sojourn in the Philippines for the duration of their assignment therein: and exempt them from alien registration requirements and consular fees:

(3) to exempt the genoers of the Japanese study team from taxes duties. ... fees and other charges on equipment, machinery and other gaterials. brought into the Philippines for the conduct of the Study:

- (4) to exempt the members of the Japanese study team from income tax and charges of any kind imposed on or in connection with any emolument or allowance paid to the members of the Japanese study team for their services in connection with the implementation of the Study:
- (5) to provide necessary facilities to the Japanese study team for remittance as well as utilization of the funds introduced into the Philippines from Japan in connection with the implementation of the Study:
- (6) to secure permission for entry into private properties or restricted areas for the conduct of the Study:
- . (7) to secure permission to take all data and documents (including photographs) related to the Study out of the Philippines to Japan by the study team:
  - (8) to provide medical services as needed and its expenses will be chargeable against the memoers of the Japanese study team.

WE. UNDERTAKING OF GOJ

In accordance with the Notes Verbales exchanged between GOJ and GOP, through JICA, shall take the following measures for the implementation of the

Study:

1. to dispatch, at its own expense, study team to the Philippines:

2. to pursue technology transfer to the Philippine counterpart:

3. to provide necessary equipment for the implementation of the Study, which

will remain the property of JICA unless othermise agreed.

#### IX. CONSULTATION

JICA and DAR shall consult with each other in respect of any matter that way "arise from or in connection with the Study.

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The Preliminary Survey Team headed by Mr. Satoshi Yamamoto (hereinafter referred to as the "Team") was dispatched by JICA from April 9. to April 18, 1989 for the Feasibility Study on Integrated Jala-Jala Rural Development Project in the Republic of the Philippines (hereinafter referred to as the "Study").

The Team and the officials of Department of Agrarian Reform (hereinafter referred to as "DAR") and other authorities concerned discussed and exchanged their views and finally agreed on the Implementing Arrangement of the Study on April 17, 1989.

The salient results of the discussions are as follows:

- 1. At the meetings on 10 and 14 April 1989, DAR requested that the study schedule should be shortened to within nine months or by June 1990. But the Team said that this would be difficult because the preparation of the topographic map will take a longer time. Both sides agreed that JICA would undertake the study schedule in a period shorter than seventeen months.
- 2. Both sides agreed that JICA could prepare a topographic map in the scale of 1/5,000 which covers the study area using an aerial photograph.
  - 3. As for the undertaking of GOP 3. (7), DAR requested that the sentence should be changed as follows:

"to secure permissions to take data and documents (including photographs) related to the Study out of the Philippines to Japan by the study team on a case-tocase basis." The team pointed out that it would be difficult for the study team to do the feasibility study if they cannot bring the necessary documents to Japan. Both sides agreed that they would prevent any problem in order to conduct the feasibility study smoothly.

- 4. DAR requested JICA to provide the Department with three (3) vehicles for the implementation of the study to be turned over to DAR after the study. The team agreed on the necessity of the vehicles and that they would favorably endorse it to JICA.
- 5. DAR requested JICA to provide the training of counterparts in Japan. The team agreed on the necessity of counterpart training in Japan and that they would favorably endorse it to JICA.
  - DAR requested that Filipino consultancy firms be tapped in the conduct of some of the components of the feasibility study. The team agreed to favorably endorse the request to JICA.



#### 5. MINUTES OF DISCUSSION

A. Summary

This meeting of the Technical Monitoring Committee (TMC) was presided by the TMC Chairman, Hon. Undersecretary Renato B. Fadilla of the Department of Agrarian Reform. The Chairman pre-mented the general agenda to the participant members of TMC and furned over the presentation of the Draft Final Report to Mr. Tadashi Sakamoto, Leader of the JICA Study Team.

After some discussions, the development plan and principal features of the development components as identified

and verified by the JICA Study Team were basicaly accepted by the TMC. To finalize the feasibility study, successfully and satisfactorily, the TMC members will contribute their comments and recommendations to the JICA Study Team after further careful review and study of the draft final report. These will be sent to the JICA Headquarters in Tokyo thru JICA Philippine Office on orbefore 20th of August, 1990. As for the project organization necessary for the implementation and operation cum management of the project facilities, including the Rural Development Center, DAR agreed to submit its written recommendations to JICA on or before 20th of August, 1990.

B. Issues Raised

After the presentation of the Team Leader of the JICA Study Team, the following issues and concerns were raised:

(1) Proposed Features and Major Development Components:

- Water charges and NIA's contribution (subsidy) to the farmer beneficiaries.
- Electic power supply for pump operation
- Farm mechanization vis reinforcement of draft animal use.
- Technical extension cum training for promotion of the agro-forestation

- Road network and its economic benefits

- Area for proposed forestation

(2) Implementation Schedule

The JICA Study Team suggested that the TMC take note of the need for a synchronized implementation of the interrelated project components, i.e., power transmission lines vis-a-vis irrigation facilities.

(3) Economic Evaluation of the Project

The Team Leader explained the results of economic evaluation of this Project and suggested that NEDA take special consideration in the evaluation and endorsement of the Project implementation which was affirmed by the HEDA representative.

(4) Project Organization and Management

The Study Team requested the THC to clearify the implementing and management arrangements for the Project as wellas the Rural Development Center. DAR committed to submit in writing the said arrangements on or before 20th of
