





Figure.3.4 Government Organization


Figure.5.2 Work Flow of LLPs and FPs Project














Figure 6.1 Construction Schedule of MRDP-II



Figure 7.1 Drainage Canal Standard Section (1/3) (Kachua)



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
Figure 7.1 Drainage Canal Standard Section (3/3) (Bancharampur)



I. Introduction

In response to the request of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh (hereinafter referred to as "the GOB"), the Government of Japan has decided to conduct the Master Plan Study on the Model Rural Development Project Phase II (hereinafter referred to as "the Study"), in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations in force in Japan.

Accordingly, The Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA"), the official agency responsible for the implementation of the technical cooperation programs of the Government of Japan, will undertake the Study, in close cooperation with the authorities concerned of the GOB.

The present document sets forth the Scope of Work for the Study.

II. Objective of the Study


The objective of the Study is to formulate the Model Rural Development Project Phase II Plan for Kachua, Nabi Nagar, Bancharampur, Debidhar Upazilas (hereinafter referred to as "MRDPPII").

III. Study Area

The study area covers the total area of the Kachua, Nabi Nagar, Bancharampur, Debidhar Upazilas in the Old Comilla District.

IV. Scope of the Study

The Study consists of two stages. In the first stage, a preliminary formulation of MRDPP II is made. In the second stage, the MRDPP II is formulated, which includes a detail study that focuses on the priority project components.





1. First Stage

1-1. Data collection and field survey

To collect and review available data and information relevant to the Study and to carry out a field survey on the following items:



Twenty (20) copies at the end of the first stage field work.

3. Interim Report:

Twenty (20) copies at the commencement of the second stage field work

4. Progress Report (II):

Twenty (20) copies at the end of the second stage field work.

5. Draft Final Report:

Twenty (20) copies within one (1) month after the end of the second stage home office work.

GOB is requested to give comments on the draft final report within one (1) month after receiving them.

6. Final Report:

Fifty (50) copies within two (2) months after receiving the comments on the Draft Final Report.

VII. Undertaking of the GOB

- 1. To facilitate smooth conduct of the Study, the GOB shall take following necessary measures:
 - (a) To secure the safety of the Japanese study team(hereinafter referred to as "the Team").
 - (b) To permit the members of the Team to enter, leave and sojourn in Bangladesh for the duration of their assignment therein, and exempt them from alien registration requirements and consular fees.
 - (c) To exempt the members of the Team from taxes, duties and any other charges on equipments, machinery and other materials brought into Bangladesh for the conduct of the Study.
 - (d) To exempt the members of the Team from income tax and other charges of any kind imposed on or in connection with any emoluments or allowances paid to the members of the Team for their services in connection with the implementation of the Study.
 - (e) To provide necessary facilities to the Team for remittance as well as utilization of the funds introduced into Bangladesh from Japan in connection with the implementation of the Study.
 - (f) To secure permission for entry into private properties or restricted areas for the conduct of the Study.
 - (g) To secure permission for the Team to take all data and documents (including photographs and maps) related to the Study out of Bangladesh to Japan.
 - (h) To provide medical services as needed. Its expenses will be chargeable on members of the Team.





- 2. The GOB shall bear claims, if any arises against the members of the Team resulting from, occurring in the course of, or otherwise connected with the discharge of their duties in the implementation of the Study, except when such claims arise from gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the members of the Team.
- 3. The Bangladesh Rural Development Board (hereinafter referred to as "BRDB") and the Local Government Engineering Bureau (hereinafter referred to as "LGEB") shall act as the counterpart agencies to the Team and also as the coordinating body in relation with other governmental and non-governmental organizations concerned for the smooth implementation of the Study.
- 4. BRDB and LGEB shall, at their own expense, provide the Team with the followings in cooperation with other organizations concerned:
 - (1) Available data and information related to the Study.
 - (2) Counterpart personnel
 - (3) Suitable office spaces with necessary equipments in Dhaka and the study area.
 - (4) Credentials for the members of the Study Team.

VM. Undertaking of JICA

For the implementation of the Study, JICA shall take the following measures;

- 1. To dispatch, at its own expense, the Team to Bangladesh.
- 2. To pursue technology transfer to counterpart personnel in the course of the Study.

IX. Consultation

The counterpart agencies mentioned above and JICA shall consult with each other in respect of any matter that may arise from or in connection with the Study.

In response to the request of the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh (GOB) a preliminary survey team (the Team) of the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) visited Bangladesh from December 5th to December 14th in 1989, to carry out the field reconnaissance survey, and had a series of discussion with the organizations concerned of the Model Rural Development Project Phase II for Kachua, Nabinagar, Bancharampur and Shahrasti Upazilas in the People's Republic of Bangladeh.

LGEB, BRDB and the Team reached mutual agreement on the Scope of Work.

The following is the items expressed during the course of discussion.

- 1. LGEB and BRDB requested that the study area be changed from the four Upazilas, Kachua, Nabinagar, Bancharampur and Shaharasti to the four Upazilas, Kachua, Nabinagar, Bancharmpur and Debidwar.
- 2. LGEB and BRDB requested that the following items be included in the study.
 - (1) Livestock
 - (2) Sanitation and nutrition
 - (3) Intensified homestead production program
 - (4) Cluster formation of rural housing

The Team expressed that the items, (1) and (2) could be included in the study and that the items, (3) and (4) should wait to be discussed until the inception of the study.

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- 3. LGEB, BRDB and the Team confirmed that the coordination necessary for the formulation of the study (e.g. the coordination between Ministries concerned in Bangladesh) will be arranged by LGEB and BRDB.
- 4. The Bangladesh side requested that a training in Japan for a counterpart be given by JICA.

4. Agenda

4.1 General

The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) dispatched the Study Team to Dhaka, and the Team paid courtesy calls to the Authorities concerned, and submitted thereto the Inception Report prepared in accordance with the agreed Scope of Works and authorized by the Advisory Committee of the JICA for the master plan study on the Model Rural Development Project, Comilla District, Phase-II.

At the same time, the Team made a briefing of the report firstly in the BRDB on September 19, 1990, and then in the Rural Development and Cooperatives Division, Ministry of Local Government Rural Development & Cooperatives (hereinafter referred to as "MLGRDC") and Local Government Engineering Bureau (hereinafter referred to as "LGEB") on September 20, 1990 respectively.

In response to the briefing of the report, a joint meeting chaired by Dr. Shah Mohammad Farid was held between the Bangladesh Authorities concerned (BRDB and LGEB) and the Study Team in the BRDB Conference Room on September 22, 1990.

After opening address by the chairman, the technical discussion on the Inception Report was made. The followings are mutually confirmed and agreed upon between both parties throughout the discussion in the meeting.

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4.2 Confirmation

In accordance with Clause VII of the agreed Scope of Works (hereinafter referred to as S/W), the Study Team requested to the Bangladesh side an immediate arrangement on the following items:

- i. The latest topographic maps covering four Upazilas stipulated in the S/W,
- ii. Thirteen (13) counterpart personnel according to the speciality of the assigned experts,
- iii. Suitable office space with necessary furniture in both Dhaka and the study area, and
- iv. Issuance of credentials for the members of the Study Team.

In response to the request of the Study Team, the Bangladesh side promised the arrangements of their undertakings as follows:

- i. Some of maps covering the study area are available in the LGEB. The procurement of the remaining maps will be arranged by the LGEB as early as possible.
- ii. The requested counterpart personnel will be nominated in both the BRDB and the LGEB in advance of the substantial commencement of the study.
- iii. The suitable office space in Dhaka will be provided in the Head Office of LGEB. Meanwhile, that in the study area will also be provided in the proper location.
- iv. The credentials for the members of the Study Team will be issued soon by the BRDB.

In addition to the above, the Study Team strongly requested to set up a coordination committee for the Study among the BRDB and LGEB. In response to the request, the Bangladesh side accepted to set up the committee, and appointed Mr.Mahbubar Ruhaman, Deputy Director of Planning, BRDB, as a coordinator for the time being.

4.3 Comments

The GOB side basically accepted the Inception Report and suggested to pay the particular attention to the following aspects.

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- A concept of "model" rural development should be further clarified.
- ii. The master plan should be formulated taking into account the Fourth Five-Year Development Plan, in which the top priority is placed on poverty alleviation in the rural areas.
- Social sectors, namely eduction, training, etc, should be studied at detail in order to iii. ensure the development of economic sectors proposed under the project.
- In-depth study is required on the new cooperative policy, which is set up on the iν. basis of the past experience of the cooperative activities.
- Executing agencies at the project implementation stage should be defined through the ν.
- Sustainability of the project should be examined to ensure operation and maintenance vi. of the project.
- vii. The commencement year should be tentatively assumed for setting up the implementation program on the MRDP.
- viii. Woman development should be focussed on as an important factor of the human development.

The Study Team noted all the comments and suggestions pointed out by the GOB side. As for Item (i), the Study Team explained that the relevant study would be initiated by review of the Comilla Model to establish the concept of the "model" rural development though the Study.

The Joint Meeting between the JICA Study Team and the Counterpart Team was officially opened at 2:30 pm on 22nd November, 1990 under the chairmanship of Mr. Syed Kamaluddin, Director of Planning of BRDB. Mr. M. Koyama, Acting Team Leader for the JICA Study Team, was invited by the Chairman to brief the objectives of the meeting, and the following agenda was confirmed by all the attendants.

- (1) Progress report by the JICA Study Team
- (2) Technical Note on Development Concepts for the Project

5. Progress Report

According to the Scope of Work (S/W), the JICA Study Team has carried out the component-based study for the Model Rural Development Project for Old Comilla District (the Project) in collaboration with the counterpart personnel form BRDB and LGEB. The work progress was briefed by the JICA Study Team as follows.

(1) Inventory Surveys of Rural Infrastructures

The existing studies and development activities are comprehensively reviewed for each rural infrastructure component stipulated in S/W, namely (i) irrigation, drainage and flood control, (ii) feeder and rural roads, (iii) growth center, (iv) drinking water supply, (v) rural electrification, (v) communication, (vi) education and training, and (vii) sanitation and nutrition. In parallel, the

overall data collection has also been undertaken at Upazila offices. Most of data are collected and being analyzed. The additional data required are (i) meteo-hydrological data and (ii) topographic map on a scale of 1:15,860, which are indispensable for the study of drainage and minor flood protection plan.

(2) Questionnaire Surveys to Local Governments, Cooperatives and Households

The following questionnaire surveys are now undertaken aiming at clarification of current situations of local governments, cooperatives and local peoples, and their general attitudes to rural development activities.

- i. General interview to Upazila and Union chairmen was completed.
- ii. Cooperative Survey (CS): field interview to four (4) UCCA and 100 primary societies are on-going.
- iii. Socio-economic Baseline Survey (SEBS): field interview to 800 households was completed.

The survey is carried out partly by employing the ample experiences of local consultants. The data analyses are now undertaken by applying the data-base analytical method with micro-computers in Dhaka.

(3) Review of Institution and Support

The ministries and agencies concerned with rural development activities in Bangladesh are being studied in terms of their objectives, functions, authorities and responsibilities. The functions of BRDB and its cooperative operation are focused on by paying particular attention to (i) two-tire cooperative structure, (ii) marketing support and (iii) credit schemes.

(4) Others

The following studies are initiated by the data collection and preliminarily analyses.

- i. Socio-economic background of the Project including analyses of agro-census and national development policies
- ii. Inland fishery studies highlighting (i) organization concerned, (ii) cooperative activities, (iii) development potentials as a part of rural development

- iii. Field survey and investigation for preparation of technical specifications for (i) topographic survey, (ii) soil mechanic survey, (iii) drinking water quality test, and (iv) soil survey to be sublet to local contractor(s).
- iv. Other components, i.e. agricultural industry, livestock, intensified homestead production, women in development, etc.

5. Discussion on Technical Note

The JICA Study Team compiled the fact findings obtained through the initial study stage into the Technical Note (T/N), which was submitted to the Counterpart Team on 8th November, 1990. The T/N stipulated (i) current situations, (ii) constraints and (iii) development prospects for the selected project components, namely irrigation, rural roads, growth centers, drinking water supply, and institutional issues. On the basis of the studies of those components, the development concepts (principles of plan formulation) were preliminarily worked out.

All the attendants basically agreed that the Project is to be formulated by attaching higher priority to components for production sector activation, which should be well-linked in line with integrated development concept.

The Counterpart Team requested the JICA Study Team to correct some descriptions in the T/N by referring to the comments (Attachment-2) and to make in-depth study on the following aspects.

(1) Human development

For successful rural development, human development is essential. The Project should place more emphasis on institutional development consisting of five (5) aspects, i.e. organization, training, credit, input supply, and marketing.

(2) Credit schemes under direct management by BRDB

The existing credit schemes for cooperative members are facing two major constraints: (i) complex and time consuming banking sanction and (ii) the less favourable loan conditions of the existing cooperative credits in comparison with ones of other credits accessible for individual farmers. BRDB has studied the possibilities to establish new banking system for cooperative members under direct management by BRDB, namely Rural Development Bank as one of the departments of BRDB by evolving the existing Credit Department.

A project sponsor is to finance BRDB directly. An advisory group sent by the project sponsor will be attached to BRDB in order to supervise the credit operation including setting of eligibility criteria, allocation of credit fund and preparation of disbursement schedule. According to the schedule, credit fund as self-revolution fund will be disbursed and realized directly through the existing BRDB-cooperative channels. This system will largely contribute to timely disbursement of credit and reduced administrative expenditure for loan operation resulting in favourable loan conditions particularly for lower interest. The simplification of credit transaction has been tried to the certain extent currently under the RD-12 project financed by CIDA.

6. Work Schedule

The JICA Study Team requested the Counterpart Team to organize the next Join Meeting on 8th December, 1990, in which the Progress Report (I) will be presented.

The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) Study Team has arrived in Dhaka on April 27, 1991 and the Study Team paid courtesy calls to the Authorities concerned. Twenty (20) copies of the Interim Report for the Model Rural Development Project Phase II for Kachua, Nabinagar, Bancharampur and Debidwar Upazilas were submitted thereto in accordance with the Scope of Work (S/W) concluded on December 13, 1989 between the Government of Bangladesh (GOB) and the Government of Japan (GOJ) through Bangladesh Rural Development Board (BRDB) and Local Government Engineering Bureau (LGEB) of the GOB side and JICA of the GOJ side.

A joint meeting on the Interim Report were held between the JICA Study Team and his counterpart personnels appointed by BRDB as well as LGEB on May 9, 1991 under the chairmanship of Dr. Shah Mohammad Farid. After official opening by the chairman, the JICA Study Team explained the Report.

The GOB presented their comments on the selected priority projects. The JICA Study Team basically accepted to pay all their efforts to take up the GOB's requests in the Draft Final Report provided that the GOB makes arrangement for the availability of all the data and information including topographic maps (approximately 1:15,000 scaled) indispensable for the feasibility study of the priority projects within a week.

5. Confirmation

The followings are mutually confirmed through discussion and agreed upon by all the attendants.

- (1) The Interim Report was prepared on the basis of the Progress Report I submitted in December, 1990. All the comments by the GOB side on the Progress Report I were fully taken into consideration in the Interim Report.
- (2) The Stage-II study will be made for (i) elaboration of the master plan stipulated in the Interim Report and (ii) execution of plan formulation of the following four (4) priority projects selected through the stage-I study at the feasibility study level.
 - i. Irrigation development by promotion of low lift pumps (LLP)
 - ii. Improvement of the existing feeder roads
 - iii. Improvement of the growth centers
 - iv. Creation of employment opportunities and income generation through cooperative activities
- (3) Irrigation water resources in the study area shall be comprehensively studied. Based on the study, a plan for water resources development shall be formulated at the master plan level.
- (4) Irrigation development by LLP has been selected as the priority project in the Interim Report. Drainage improvement for minor drains and creeks, as well as irrigation development, seems to be essential for crop production in the study area. Minor drainage improvement shall be incorporated in the priority project.
- (5) Rural roads are essential for the economic activities in the rural area. In addition to the improvement of existing feeder roads, therefore, provision of the related structures to rural roads shall be incorporated in the priority project.
- (6) Navigational aspects are taken into account in the study of rural transportation at the master plan level.

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(7) Within the framework of the priority project (iv) mentioned above, an examination will be carried out on the feasibility of new credit scheme to be managed directly by BRDB aiming at timely disbursement of credit and reduced administrative expenditure for credit operation. The GOB side, through BRDB, will provide all the information concerning the new banking system introduced to RD-12 with the CIDA finance by May 12, 1991.

At the completion of the home office work of Stage II, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (IICA) Study Team has compiled all their study results into the Draft Final Report and forwarded its 20 copies to the Bangladesh side on August 25, 1991.

A Joint Meeting on the Draft Final Report was held between the JICA Study Team and the counterpart personnels appointed by BRDB as well as LGEB on August 27, 1991 under the chairmanship of Mr. Syed Marghub Murshed, Director General of BRDB.

Firstly, all the attendants confirmed that all the official comments on Progress Report II submitted by BRDB and LGEB were incorporated into the Draft Final Report according to the mutual agreement attained in the previous joint meeting held on June 18, 1991. Secondly, the JICA Study Team explained the contents of the Draft Final Report. In response to the explanation, the GOB side made their comments. As a result of the discussion, in principle, the Draft Final Report was accepted by the GOB side. The followings were discussed and mutually confirmed in the joint meeting.

5. Discussion and Confirmation

5.1 Discussion and Confirmation on the Draft Final Report

(1) Training aspects are important for successful implementation of the priority projects of MRDP II. The Draft Final Report takes up only the training programmes required for implementation of the priority projects. The contents of training are

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more important than provision of facilities and equipments for general training purposes.

- (2) Because of the purposes of the Study, i.e. plan formulation, the Draft Final Report does not mention fund sources as well as further financial arrangement for MRDP II.
- (3) The implementation of UCCA facilities will be executed by BRDB's construction section.
- (4) The responsible organization for road construction and maintenance should be properly described on page 20 of the main report.
- (5) The GOB contribution should be clarified in the report in terms of budgetary arrangement, staffing, etc.

5.2 Official Comments on the Draft Final Report

The further comments by BRDB and LGEB on the Draft Final Report will be submitted directly to the JICA Study Team by September 25, 1991 without any delay. They are to be incorporated into the Final Report to be submitted to the GOB side by December, 1991.
