





I. Introduction

In response to the request of the Government of the Lao People's Democratic Republic (hereinafter referred to as "the Government") e Government of Japan has decided to conduct the Master Plan Study on the Integrated Agricultural Rural Development Project in Savannakhet (here-inafter referred to as "the Study"), in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations in force in Japan.

Accordingly, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA"), the official agency responsible for the implementation of the technical cooperation programs of the Government of Japan, will undertake the Study, in close cooperation with the authorities concerned of the Government.

The present document sets forth the Scope of Work for the Study

H. Objective of the Study

The objective of the Study is to formulate a master plan of the Integrated Agricultural Rural Development Project in the Savannakhet Province, in which comprehensive water resources development programs are to be reviewed and developed with possible agricultural rural development projects to be identified and evaluated. The following points will be taken into consideration:

- (1) Effective use of the water resources
- (2) Increase of agricultural production
- (3) Creation of employment opportunities, and
- (4) Increase in per capital income by expanding agricultural land and improving farming systems.

III. Study Area

The study area covers a part of the Savarnakhet province, which consists of Khantabuli, Champhone, Songkhone, Outhoumphone, Kaybouli, Atsaphangthong districts and the right bank of the Xe Banghiang which is located to the west of the village, Ban

Dovergmala in the Sone Bouli district.

IV. Scope of the Study

- 1. The Study consists of two phases.
- Agricultural Rural Development Project is formulated, which comprises a study on the agricultural development plan consisting of such items as irrigation, drainage and social infrastructure, and possible agricultural rural development projects to be identified and grouped by priority. The top priority project area will be taken up for mapping in this phase.
- 1.2 In the second phase, a feasibility study on the top priority project area which is selected in the first phase is conducted.
- 2. Study items
- 2.1 Phase 1
- 2.1.1 Data collection and field survey

To collect and review available data and information relevant to the Study and to carry out a field survey on the following items:

- (1) Natural conditions
 - a. Topography
 - b. Geography
 - c. Meteorology
 - d. Hydrology
 - e. Water resources (including irrigation water requirement estimation)
 - f. Geology
 - g. Soil (including salinity)
- (2) Social conditions
 - a. Demographic characteristics (population)
 - b. Social organization
 - c. Socio-economy
 - d. Employment
 - e. Income level and distribution
 - f. Education



- g. Others
- (3) Agriculture
 - a. Farming
 - b. Land use/tenure (including farm size distribution)
 - c. Cropping patterns
 - d. Agricultural organization (support services and extention service)
- (4) Agro-economy
 - a. Farm econmy
 - b. Farmers' organization
 - c. Farm inputs and productivity
 - d. Credit
 - e. Farm machinery
 - f. Marketing system
- (5) Agricultural infrastructure
 - a. Irrigation-drainage systems and diversion schemes
 - b. Operation and maintenance of the existing irrigation systems
 - c. Flood control systems
 - d. Others
- (6) Social infrastructure
 - a. Rural roads
 - b. Electricity
 - c. Water supply
 - d. Others
- 2.1.2 To conduct a study based on the results of the above-mentioned survey.
- 2.1.3. To identify projects and put them in priority order, selecting the top priority project.
- 2.1.4. To formulate the Integrated Agricultural Rural Development Project.

2.2 Phase 2

A feasibility study on the top priority project area is conducted by the following measures.

- 2.2.1. To collect and review available data and information relevant to the top priority project area and carry out a field survey.
- 2.2.2. To determine the elements of the development plan for the top priority project, based on the analysis of the above-mentioned review and field survey.
- 2.2.3. To formulate the development plan for the top priority project.
- 2.2.4. To formulate a preliminary design of the major structures of the top priority project.
- 2.2.5. To prepare the implementation schedule.
- 2.2.6. To estimate the project costs and benefits
- 2.2.7. To evaluate the project.
- 2.2.8. Recommendation

V Study Schedule

The Study will be executed in accordance with the attached tentative





work schedule.

VI Reports

JICA shall prepare the following reports in English, and submit them to the Government.

1. Inception Report:

Twenty (20) copies at the commencement of the first phase field work.

2. Progress Report (I):

Twenty (20) copies at the end of the first phase field work.

3. Interim Report:

Twenty (20) copies at the commencement of the second phase field work

4. Progress Report (II):

Twenty (20) copies at the end of the second phase field work.

5. Draft Final Report:

Twenty (20) copies within one (1) month after the end of the second phase home office work.


The Government is requested to give comments on the draft final report within one (1) month after receiving them.

6. Final Report:

Fifty (50) copies within two (2) months after receiving the comments on the Draft Final Report.

VII. Undertaking of the Government of Lao People's Democratic Republic

- 1. To facilitate a smooth conduct of the Study, the Government shall take following necessary measures:
 - (1) To secure the safety of the Japanese study team(hereinafter



referred to as "the Team").

- (2) To permit the members of the Team to enter, leave and so jurn in laos for the duration of their assignment there is and exempt them from alien registration requirements and consular fees.
- (3) To exempt the members of the Team from taxes, duties and any other charges on equipments, machinery and other materials brought into Laos for the conduct of the Study.
- (4) To exempt the members of the Team from income tax and other charges of any kind imposed on or in connection with any emoluments or allowances paid to the members of the Team for their services in connection with the implementation of the Study.
- (5) To provide necessary facilities to the Team for remittance as well as utilization of the funds introduced into Laos from Japan in connection with the implementation of the Study.
- (6) To secure permission for entry into private properties or restricted areas for the conduct of the Study.
- (7) To secure permission for the Team to take all data and documents (including photographs and maps) related to the Study out of Laos to Japan.
- (8) To provide medical services as needed. Its expenses will be chargeable on members of the Team.
- 2. The Government shall bear claims, if any arises against the members of the Team resulting from, occurring in the course of or otherwise connected with the discharge of their duties in the implementation of the Study, except when such claims arise from gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the members of the Team.
- 3. Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (hereinafter referred to as "MAF") shall act as the counterpart agencies to the Team and also as the coordinating body in relation with other governmental and

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non-governmental organizations concerned for the smooth implementation of the Study.

- 4. MAF shall, at their own expense, provide the Team with the followings in cooperation with other organizations concerned:
 - (1) Available data and information (including photographs and maps) related to the Study.
 - (2) Counterpart personnel
 - (3) Suitable office spaces with necessary equipments in the študy area.
 - (4) Credentials for the members of the Study Team.


VII. Undertaking of JICA
