7. SOCIOECONOMIC SURVEY

In order to grasp the actual conditions of local residents in the survey area, as well as their relations with forests and timber, we conducted surveys on villages and individual peasant households through holding interviews with the persons concerned.

7.1. Village Survey

In order to grasp the relationship that local residents have with forests and their use of timber, we held interviews with the people in four village. We interviewed them in accordance with the survey items stated below, which were prepared jointly with our counterparts. (Figure 11)

7.2. Survey of Individual Peasant Households

In order that the actual conditions might be grasped in detail, five peasant households were selected from each of the four villages surveyed (20 households in total), and our interviews were based on the questionnaire whose contents are provided below. The selection of the peasant households subject to the survey and preparation of the questionnaire were conducted through discussions with our counterparts. (Figure 12)
