JICA

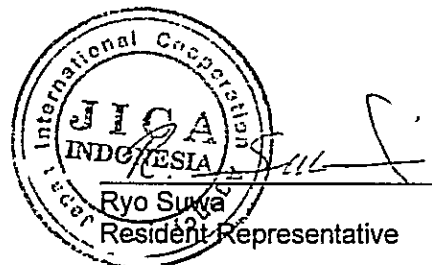

In order to make significant contributions to the development of recipients of Japanese ODA such as Indonesia, JICA is constantly looking for improving the implementation of its technical assistance. Introduction

Introduction

I. Background

Although only limited documentation is available, Non-governmental Organizations (NGOs) have gradually increased their role in addressing development-related issues. Their activities are wide-ranging and cover socio-cultural issues (health, education, eviction, poverty, etc.), economic issues, housing provision, and environmental issues, both in the urban and rural areas.

NGOs are non-profit organizations, which can be further divided into two categories¹. NGOs in the first category include philanthropic, nonprofit NGOs, or donatively supported organizations such as charities for low-income groups, socio-cultural organizations, and institutions dedicated to research. The second category includes the so-called "commercial" nonprofit NGOs, or those who receive virtually all of their income from the sale of services rather than from donations. NGOs in this category provide services to health maintenance organizations, clinics or nonprofit hospitals, and community health centers.

An NGO is defined as a body of nonprofit organizations consisting of individuals associated with any of the following three purposes: (1) to perform public tasks that have been delegated to them by the government, (2) to perform public tasks for which there is a demand which is not met either by the government or the for-profit sector; and in some cases (3) to influence the direction of the government's policy or profit/nonprofit sectors².

In Indonesia, there are some NGOs working on the local-level (i.e. community-based organizations), or others which cover a wider area and range of activities. Some NGOs are involved in supporting government programmes such as IDT (the government's funds for backward villages), KIP (Kampung Improvement Program), environmental projects, family planning, etc. Other NGOs work independently, usually on a voluntary basis, to express their concern on issues such as human rights, community empowerment (by giving training and education), on health (disease)-related issues and by conducting relevant studies. In some cases, national development programmes have adopted community activities organized by NGOs.

In the present era of globalization, the situation at this moment is becoming more dynamic. As a result, development-related issues (gender, lack of infrastructure, environmental degradation, environmental risks/disease, compulsory education, labour issues, and so on) are being given more attention. Despite its responsibility to provide basic social services, there is a limit on the Government's ability to manage and control development and rapid changes. The private sector is by nature profit-oriented and is therefore not in a position to provide such services.

A triangle of development actors (government, private and community) already exists. However, cooperation among the actors is not yet optimal. Concrete efforts to involve NGOs as 'partners' are still inadequate. It should be realized that mutual partnerships with non-governmental organizations is a strategic key for both the government and the community to cope with the present dynamic situation and in facing challenges in the future.

II. Indonesia: Present Condition

The present economic turmoil in Indonesia has brought more attention on working more frequently and closely with non-governmental and community organizations. As a result of the monetary crisis, the government has become more limited in undertaking its responsibilities, while the private sector is also facing difficult conditions at this time. Thus, particularly the irregular, low and middle income community, including those working in the informal sector, have suffered from the present crisis such as through the rise in prices, food shortage, and dismissal from employment.

In order to overcome the current economic crisis, many solutions have been suggested. One of the important steps is to support, collaborate and form partnerships with NGOs, either in accordance with government programmes, in supporting their independent actions, or in the form of collaborating activities. NGOs are recognized as organizations which are actively involved with the community (such as low-income groups), and which have experience on the implementation level. Moreover, many NGOs have undertaken useful and important research and studies, together with the documentation of important data.

All the above statements stress the importance of keeping an up-to-date inventory on the activities and profiles of NGOs in Indonesia. A study on the identification of the capabilities of the NGO is an initial step to open the opportunity of effective governance through partnerships and collaboration, including mobilization between/among the community groups (NGO), government, and the private sector; in order to overcome the current problems and in facing the future challenges of this country. Moreover, the directory is an effort to achieve an optimum synergy among the three stakeholders, as well as international organizations, research institutions, and donor agencies.

Despite several attempts by other institutions and organizations to create an NGO directory including NGO profiles and activities, such information is generally partial and limited to a particular sector. The purpose of this study is to identify NGOs involved in several sectors including social, economic, cultural, and environmental issues.

III. NGOs in Indonesia

General Development

Currently, it is said that there are approximately 8,000 (registered) NGOs throughout the country, whereas others claim that more than 15,000 NGOs exist in Indonesia³.

In the beginning of the new government era in 1966 (referred as Orde Baru) rural development (poverty) became the focus of national development, and consequently development efforts were directed towards rural development in the form of rural infrastructure and basic productive means. This orientation towards rural development has also influenced the type of community organization which has evolved in Indonesia. Most of the NGOs established in the 60s were active in rural development in various forms, as it was perceived as the most important issue. The 1980s are referred to the golden ages for NGOs (the decade of NGOs). More attention was given to human development (instead of hardware development), and many NGOs were established in the 80s. Along with the changes and dynamic condition of Indonesia, NGOs today cover a wider range of issues, and are continuing to develop.

Based on their activities, community organizations can be divided into two categories:

- ◆ The Action Group. There are two types of NGOs in this group. The first type includes NGOs that are involved in the action stage in relation to infrastructure such as construction of low-cost housing, implementation of appropriate technology, and sanitation improvement. The second type of NGO deals with other issues such as mainstreaming the development of small enterprises, development of micro-credits and income generation.
- ◆ The Concern Group. Those who focus on concern and undertake observation, analysis, advocacy, as well as the application of pressure. NGOs belong in this category are usually those who conduct demonstrations.

Opportunities

In short, NGOs - as community based organizations - are widely considered to have greater flexibility and capabilities in comparison to government bureaucracy, especially when it is necessary to work hand-in-hand with the community. Different NGOs have different entry points in community development, but generally they all have the commitment to strengthening the capacity of the community at grass root levels, mainly through micro-enterprise development and community empowerment. NGOs also have a strong commitment to the poor and some NGOs work on a voluntary basis. Some NGOs are willing to take on great risks in the name of meaningful causes, while others have the ability to implement alternative policies. In addition, NGOs are usually highly interdependent while maintaining a certain level of autonomy.

Constraints

Despite the important role of NGOs, many cases have shown that only limited opportunities are available for partnerships between NGOs and the other actors involved in development. This may be attributed to the psychological barrier between the public and private sector and community organizations, due to unnecessary distrust and prejudice. In addition, there is a lack of a thorough documentation on the activities undertaken by NGOs, both in terms of best practice and lessons learned. In this respect, more efforts should be undertaken to stimulate a mutual partnership between and among the stakeholders, particularly in strengthening the partnerships with NGOs.

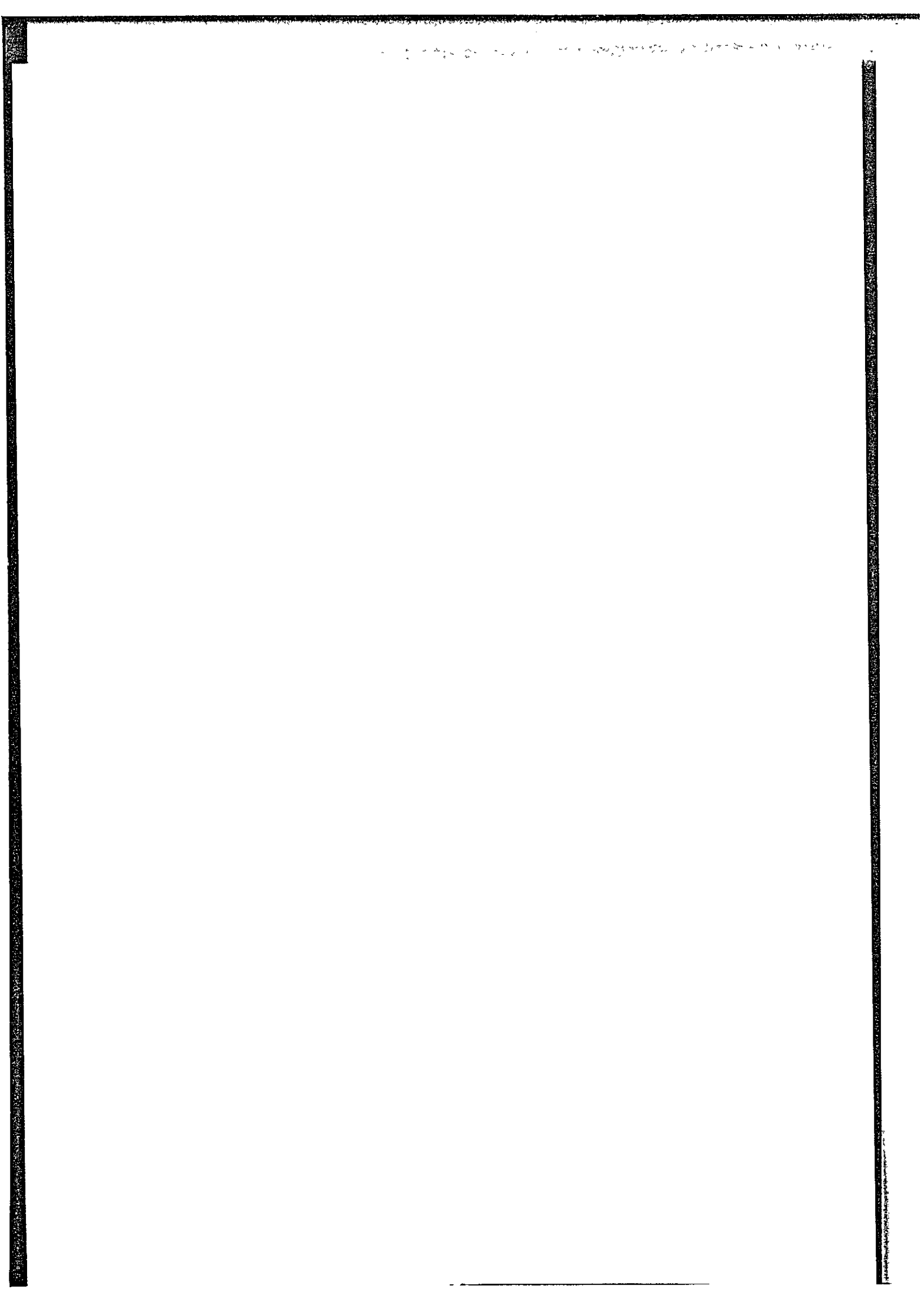
IV. NGO Study

Along with the recognition that NGOs will have a greater role in the future and the expectation that many organizations will work more frequently and closely with NGOs, Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) - Indonesia Office has initiated a study on NGOs in Indonesia. The main objective is to collect in-depth information on NGOs in Indonesia (with a focus on NGOs located in Java) in the following fields: Education, Environment, Gender, Poverty, Health, Regional Development, and Agriculture.

The study began in January 1998, was completed in March 1998, and was conducted in collaboration with Urban and Regional Development Institute (URDI). The activities consisted of the following steps:

- Production of "NGO List" through collection of data and information combined with existing directories which were collected from :
 - (1) NGO associations and forums such as Indonesian Forum for Environment (WALHI), Partnership in Development Forum (PDF), International NGO Forum on Indonesian Development (INFID), and the Urban NGO Networking.
 - (2) NGOs who have established their own directory such as Yayasan Dian Desa (YDD) Yogyakarta, Akatiga (Bandung), and Yayasan WISNU (Bali).
 - (3) International organizations, *i.e.* World Bank and UNDP.
 - (4) Government offices, *i.e.* the Social Department and the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- This was followed by creating and sending questionnaires to most of the NGOs on the list. A total of 270 questionnaires were sent, and 130 filled questionnaires were returned. In addition, several interviews with resource persons were held to collect first-hand information on their organizations as well as to collect general information on NGOs in Indonesia.
- To meet the purpose of the study, more than 50 NGOs (including some from academic research institutions) have been selected to be listed in the Directory. In accordance to the main objective of this study, based on the information provided by each NGO, this Directory attempts to cover organizational structure and scope of activities including main projects and publications in the recent years.
