ANALYSIS QUESTION 4

How have you benefit from the program ?

The benefit from participating in the Friendship Program for the 21st Century, between Thailand and Japan, are categorized into the following several categories, namely they benefited that they:

About 84.8% of the respondents stated that through this program they could directly witness the work with the Japanese people. From this observation, it is hoped they would apply it in their daily activities. This is in line with learning about the society of Japan.

The other benefits from this program are that they could increase their knowledge in their respective profession but not too much. About 41.3% of the respondents stated that they have choose the right program group while participating in the friendship programme so it could increase their capability in their respective profession. This friendship programme also has a beneficial impact in increasing mutual understanding between the youth of Thailand and Japan.

The participants from Thailand also have the opportunity to meet their counterparts from other ASEAN countries during their stay in Japan. This brought direct impact to strengthening their friendship as suggested in the study that 63.0% agreed the program could promote mutual understanding, especially with Japanese.

With the variation of programs conducted in Japan, such as the in-house seminars, discussion with Japanese youth and general lectures gave the opportunity for the participants to discuss the different issues, 71.0% of the respondents agreed that the program brought understanding to them about the importance of international exchange.

Besides the fact that their global horizon increases, 81.9% of the respondents also agreed that the program brings pride of their respective country, in this case Thailand, and they feel they have the obligation to develop their country through the knowledge they have gathered in Japan.

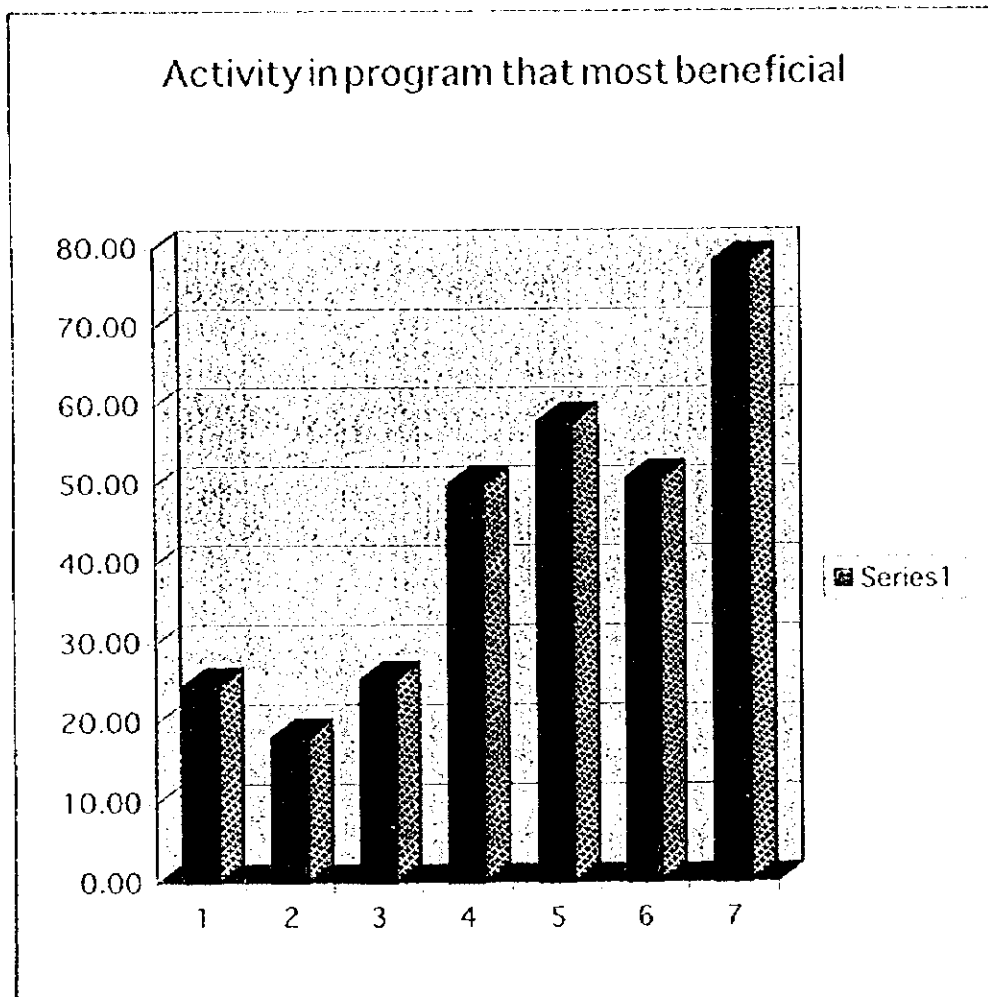
The majority of the respondents , 49.3% also partly agreed that the program is essential in changing their way of thinking , especially when it concerns their global thinking. The program also gives the opportunity to learn how to communicate with people from different culture, 71.7% of the respondents agreed with this statement.

Because this program are conducted in groups, about 86.2% of the respondent also agreed that their program could give them the opportunity to act in good order as a group member. In relevance with career advancement, 45.7% of the respondent partly agreed that the program has brought benefit to their respective career advancement.

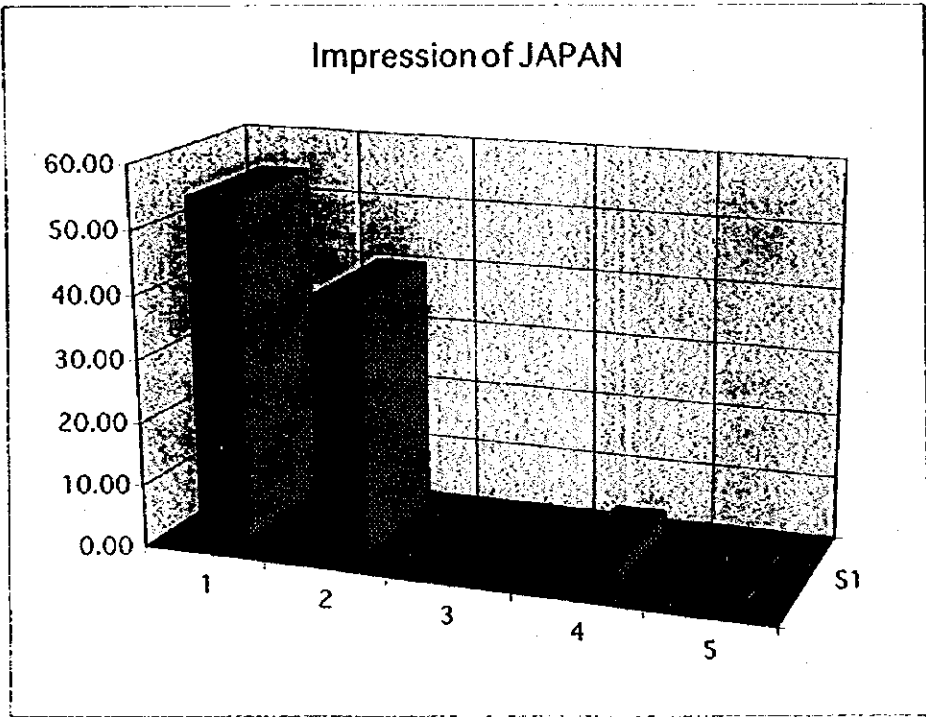
The whole duration of the Friendship Program for the 21st Century, several activities are carried out during the one-month stay in Japan is:

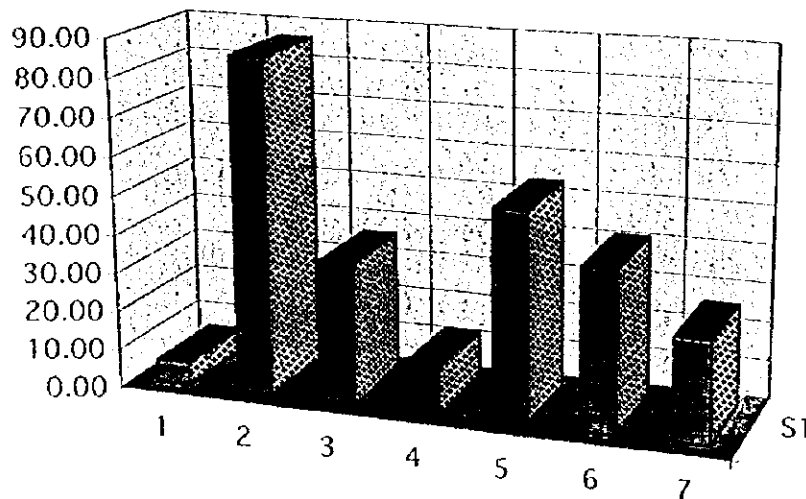

Are you still in touch with the people you meet in the program ?

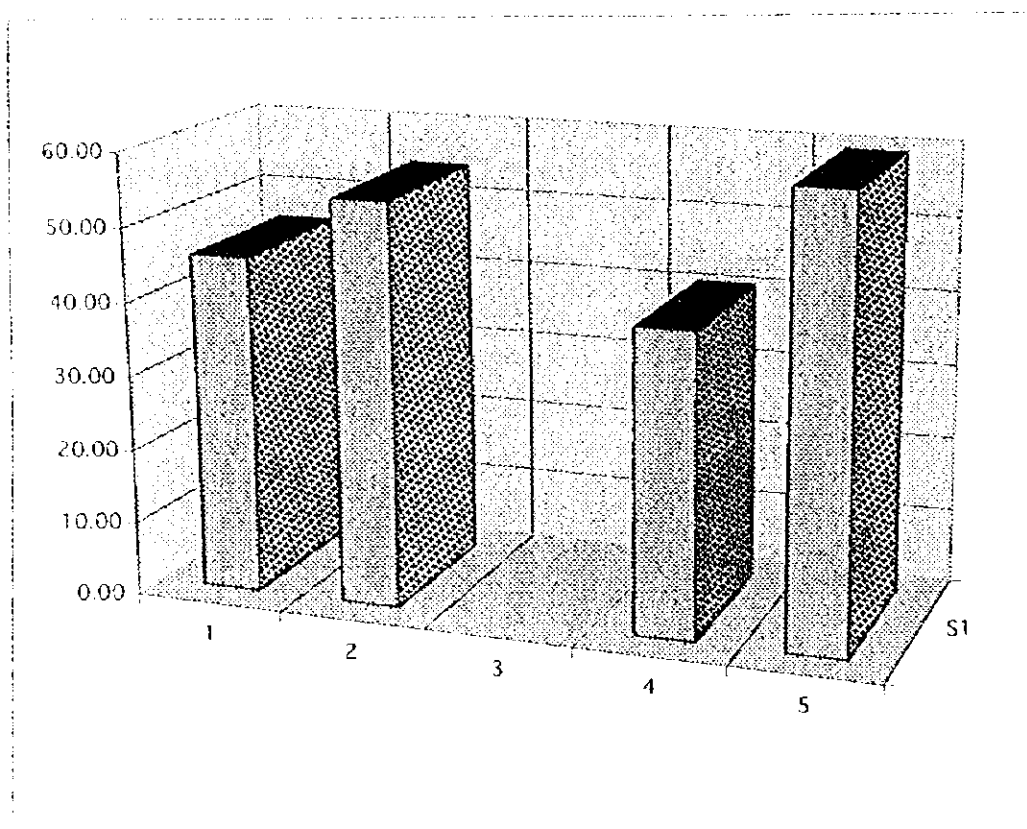

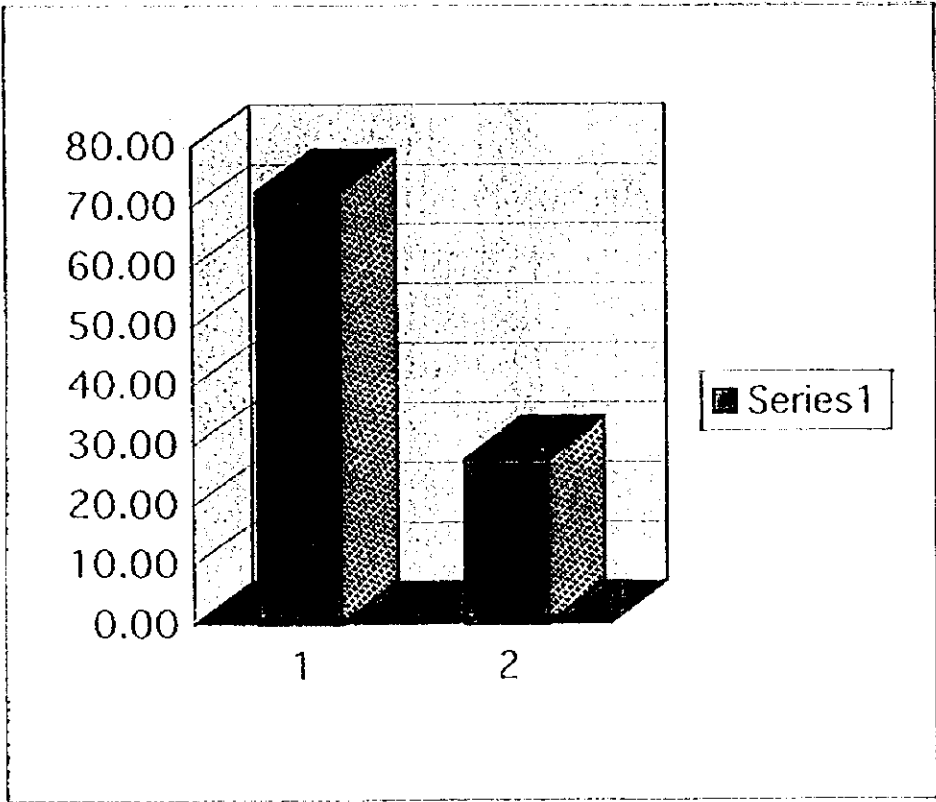
The survey that was conducted among Thailand respondents shows that 54.35% claimed that the aspect to promote international exchange is more important than the providing professional knowledge in their respective field.

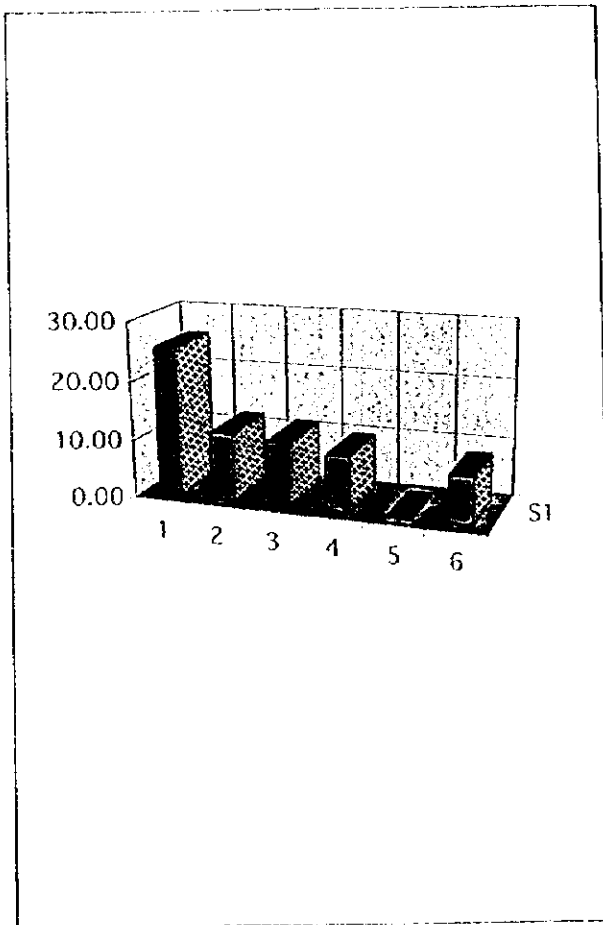
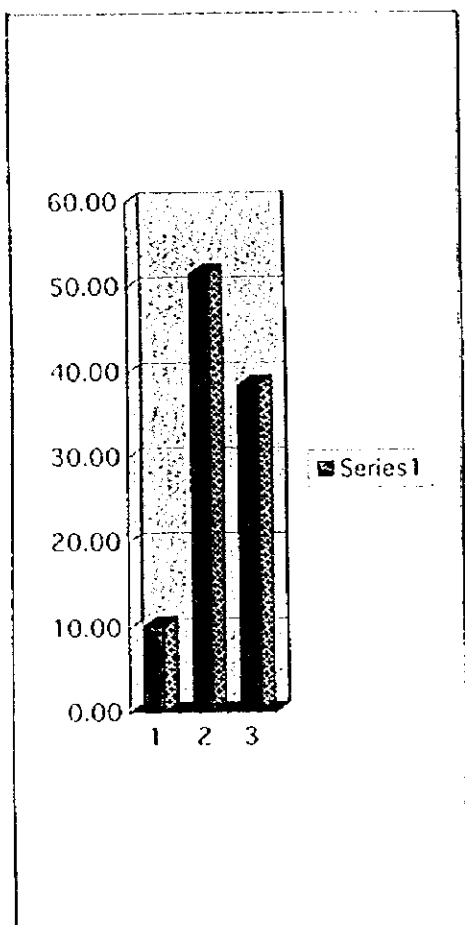

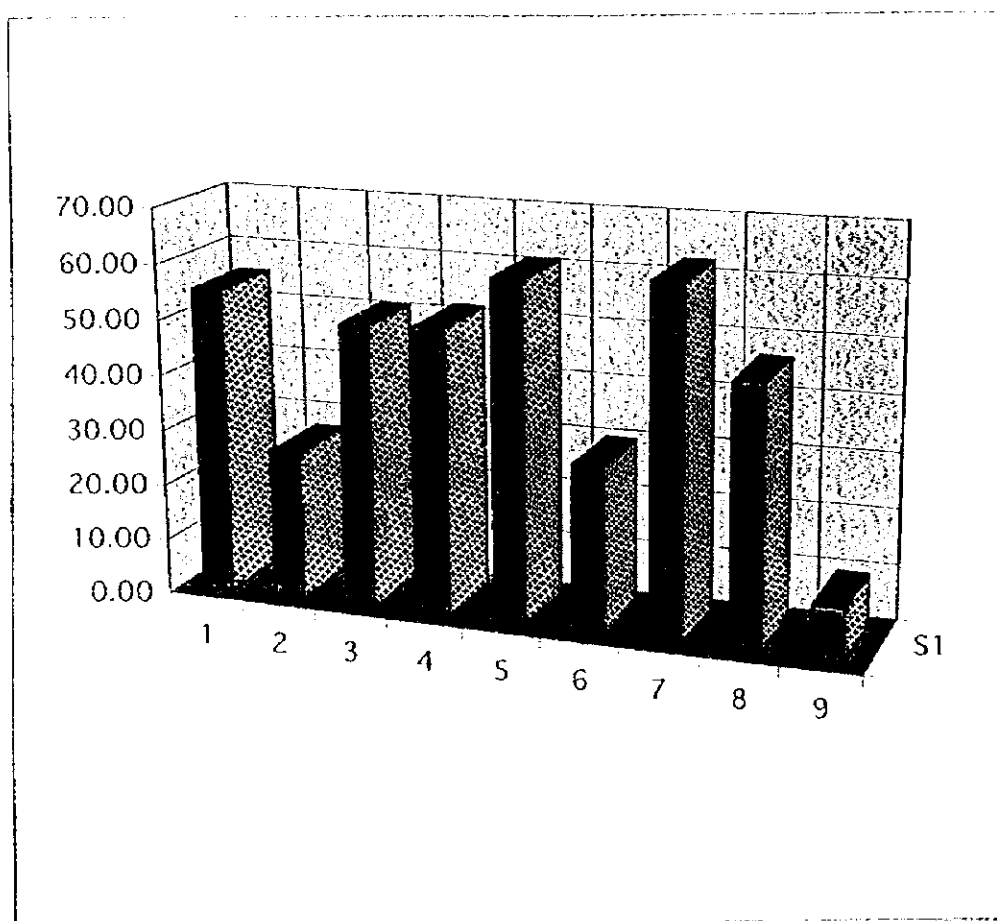

AFTER-CARE TEAM PROJECT.

JICA After-Care Team Visit to Thailand every year. They stay in Bangkok not a long time , about 7 days. and also go to other countries of ASEAN for that matter had an important aim of assessing the various elements of the Friendship Programme for the 21 st Century activities and reviewing about the program contain, benefits and feedback of the programme as was set out in the past. FYAA have always expressed satisfaction on their method of implementing the After-Care Team visit, as their visit and implementation side has always been taken care of by FYAA.

The trip of the After-Care Team Visit is not only useful for JICA and FYAA but more so for ex-participant because they was homestay with FYAA member. This is a good thing to do, but if it possible, we want to increase number of person in this team up to 8-10 person. We want Japan youth must be receive this benefit also.

Some of FYAA member want to expand the time of this program up to 2 weeks or 1 month. and do this care team project like a Friendship Programme for the 21 st Century in Japan, and the program will cooperate between JICA and FYAA.

SUB-PROGRAM IN JAPAN.

A great focus should be made on attending the in-house seminar and the related homestay programme. These are the modules that should be looked into more detailed as these are the main activities that participants find most beneficial. Less time could be allocated to staying in Tokyo area, shifting the rest of the time to concentrate in the local and regional cities. There is probably a need to have this sector expanded to ensure maximum. The utilization of participants' time in Japan. Participants will gain more first hand benefits and experiences during observation tours, in-house seminars and site visits in the local programme.

For the lectures on Japan given in Tokyo during the earlier part of the programme, Some of ex-participant think that not necessary for them because before goto Japan they have this program contain in pre-orientation already. The team finds that the reason for this could be true because participants' acquired knowledge on this subject during their Pre-Departure Orientation Training programme in Thailand are quite adequate and therefore do not necessitate any more further lectures in Tokyo.

What could be recommended is that such lectures could be presented during their PreDeparture Orientation Training programme in Thailand just to fortify participants' knowledge on Japan, rather than giving them in Tokyo. This could save a lot of time and your money in this section. May be JICA can arrange this time for participant to go to Museum, Sience park, Marine park etc.

SUSTAINABILITY AND CONSTRAINTS OF THE PROGRAM

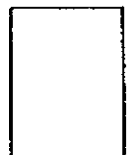
