## Baucau District – An Overview

Baucau District is the second largest district in East Timor in population terms, and Baucau City the second city. As a city and a district, Baucau has been a very important centre in the East Timorese people's struggle for independence and will continue to be important in the building of an independent East Timor. Baucau is also a key centre for the eastern region of the territory; in both political/organisational and logistics/planning terms

Population figures are not absolutely clear: the District population is between 93,500 (OCHA) and 106,900 (CNRT) people. Baucau City population is approximately 16,000 (depending on where the boundaries are drawn). The main language group in the District are the Makassae speaking people (with dialect variations between the eastern mountainous areas of Quelicai, Laga and Baguia and the central areas of Baucau sub-district and Venilale). Waim'ua is the other main language group, spoken more in the western area of the District. Tetum is used as the lingua franca, but is not the mother tongue of people in this area, and so at village level it is not always spoken.

Baucau District is a significant centre for the CNRT, with both its traditional role as a heartland in the independence movement and strong current leadership. It is the centre of the Diocese of Baucau and the home of Bishop Basilio Nascimento, who is an important local, regional and national leader much respected and loved by the District community. The Church plays an important role in education, youth development, social leadership, humanitarian and pastoral care. Traditional leaders, the Liurais, are present at each village; some have continued on from the Indonesian times, others have been elected in communities since October. The East Timor Student Solidarity Council is the only other major community group, and in Baucau District is said to have 600 members; it is proudly independent and keen to participate in community-based planning and work.

As East Timor's second city, Baucau has the potential to be a major cultural and economic centre. It has the territory's largest airport and excellent port facilities (Carabella). Education is a major focus of the District, especially through the church system. With resources and training, the District has the foundation of a well educated community, a strong sense of identity, and the capacity to lead the country in many areas of development. The city has potential to be an attractive centre for economic and cultural activities, including tourism. In Portuguese times, in the early '70s, a small tourism industry had emerged and the community has expressed interest in developing this once again. It lies approx. 400 metres above sea level, with a milder climate than the coastal plain.

Baucau District ranges from dry coastal plain and limestone plateau (eg sub-districts of Vemasse and Laga) to the interior mountainous areas which are more fertile (eg. parts of Laga, Quelicai, Baguia, Venilale and Baucau sub-districts). These geographical variations produce local micro-climates, which in turn produce various types of agriculture and land use.

Agriculture is the main economic activity of the Baucau District community: corn/maize and rice (wet and dry planting) are the main crops, with peanuts, coconuts and vegetables additional crops. The hot dry season is basically between June to September-October, with the wet season building from November and running till May.

Small business has re-emerged since September, but is much hampered by difficulties with transport and other infrastructure problems such as power and supply of necessary goods. The previously large Indonesian administration accounted for a large proportion of the economic activity of this central eastern District. Training and small-scale programme development will be essential in kick-starting the District economy.

Until recent weeks, the security situation in the District has been unproblematic since UNAMET returned in late September. Problems in the past two weeks seem to emerge from certain youth groups, with background in old rivalries, dating to the Indonesian times and with links to clandestine groups in this time this has extended in some cases to ethnic divisions between Makassae and Wai'mua groups, and some community members talk of broad political motivation. It is clear that the great majority of the community

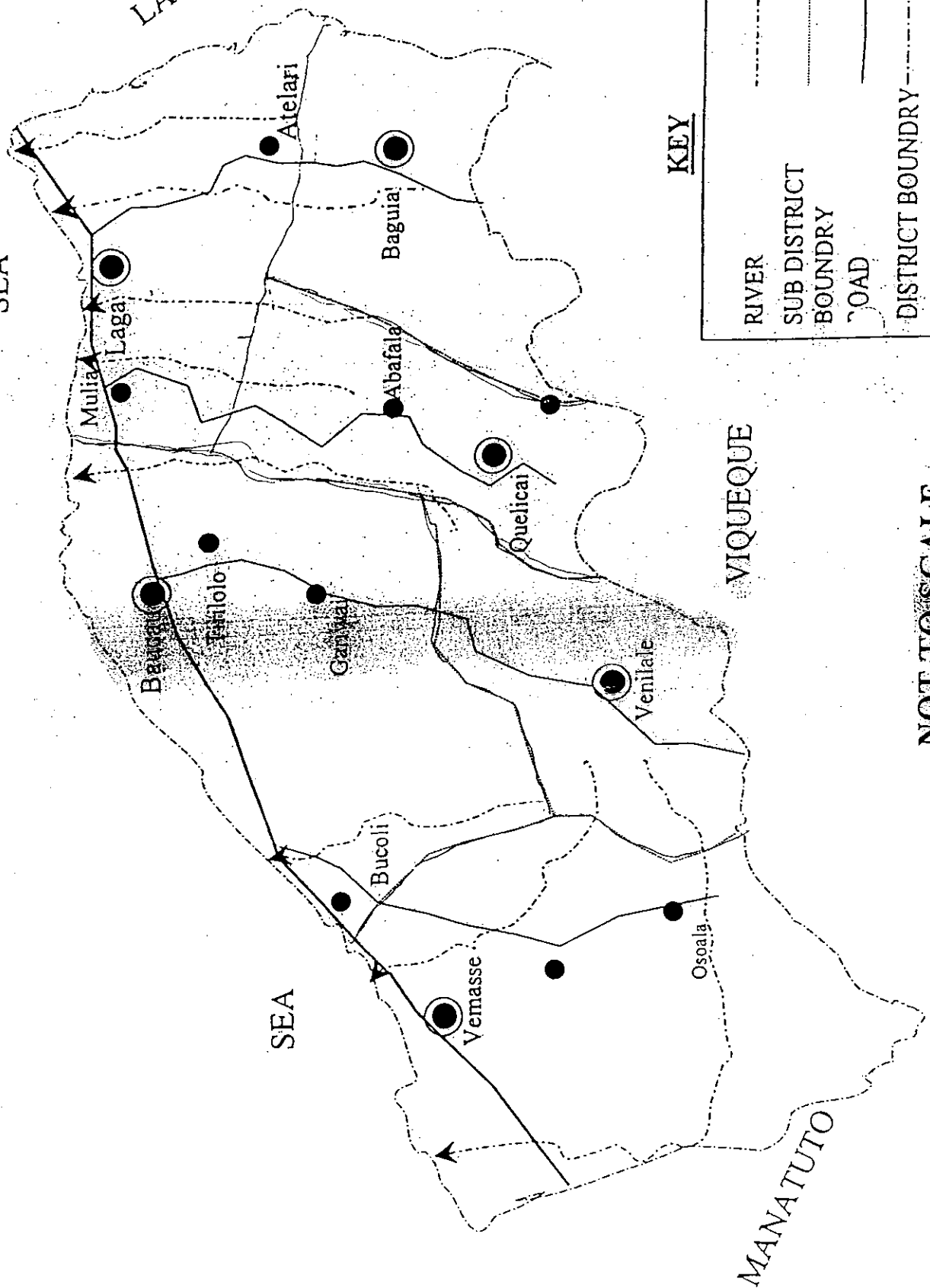
wish to live in peaceful conditions and to abide by the law. They seek clear law and order, upheld by the UNTAET CivPol, and this is supported by the Baucau District CNRT and FALINTIL leaders. Economic development and the increase of employment opportunities would be a valuable tool in decreasing unrest fermented by bored and disenfranchised youth.

In summary, Baucau District and city are important places in the future development of East Timor. With population and towns largely intact, with strong education and community leadership, Baucau is in a strong position to be a leading community in the development of an independent East Timor.

## BAUCAU SUB-DISTRICT – An Overview

### Introduction

Situated 129 km away from Dili, Baucau is the second biggest district in East Timor. The district, having a population of between 93 500 - 106 000 (depending on the source of data), is divided into six sub-districts: Baucau, Laga, Venilale, Vemasse, Quelicai, and Baguia. Baucau sub-district having 40 % of the population of the district is the second biggest city in East Timor. Of the total population of Baucau district, approximately 40490 people live in the Baucau sub-district.

### Number of villages

Baucau sub-district comprises of the following 11 villages: Bahu, Tirilolo, Caibada, Buruma, Seical, Buibau, Samalari, Uailili, Gariuai, Triloka and Bucoli.

### Post Consultation Destruction

131 Public buildings destroyed or damaged to varying extents. 312 houses destroyed in the sub-district.

### Reports of people killed in the crisis (investigations continue)

Buruma – 5; Caibada – 3; Seical - 1; Triloka - 3

### Health

2 hospitals: 1 managed by MSF; 1 managed by Timorese Hospital workers  
Health Clinic (Puskesmas) in Bucoli, Buibau and Uailili. Most common health problems: malaria, diarrhea, flu, tuberculosis. Some reports of malaria and diarrhea epidemics.

### Communication

No postal or telecommunications. A number of bad spots on primary, secondary and feeder roads exist – some being fixed by Australian Interfet Road Building team.

### Electricity

Enatic: The lack of regular electricity in the sub-district has started causing incidents of civil unrest where the power station has been stoned and threats made against workers at the power plant. Power is a key issue for the community.

### Water supply

Drinking water quality not adequately tested. Baucau city has water in lower town, but required pump pipe repairs and fuel for upper city supplies.

### Trade and commerce

Market operates daily in New Town. Produce available: fish, beef, chicken, vegetables, fruit, eggs, cassava, bread. A number of shops selling batteries, mosquito coils, cigarettes, beer, condensed milk, sugar and other basic goods. Some goods now available from Indonesia (border area and Surabaya) and Australia. 3 Restaurants have opened in town (since November); 1 Hotel: Antika Hotel

### Education

Baucau District is a major educational center. As from 1 November 1999 some schools have started operating. As at 1 January 2000 there are 24 primary schools in Baucau sub-district operating with a total of 6744 pupils and 428 teachers. All elementary school teachers are on Food for Work Programme receiving 50 kg of rice per month and an incentive of 150 000 Rupiahs per month.

### Priority civil projects needed

1) Water supply and safe drinking water 2) Electricity 3) Agriculture: seeds and agricultural equipment/tools 4) Employment/incoming generating projects

**Labour/occupations**

50 – 100 % of persons (depending from village to village) are farmers. Other occupations include: electricians, carpenters, vehicle mechanics, drivers, fishermen, architect/draftsperson, lawyers, construction workers, blacksmiths, brickmakers, plumbers, sewers/tailors, weavers.

## LAGA SUB-DISTRICT - An Overview

### Demographic Information:

Laga Sub-District is about 25 k.m. away from Baucau District. There are 9 villages under this Sub -District and population of Laga is 17363 (according to CNRT). Quelicai, Lospalos, Baguia and Baucau District bound Laga Sub- District. The scenic beauty of Laga is very attractive.

### Infrastructures:

There are very few infrastructures in Laga. The only Baucau- Laga bituminous carpeting road, which is very good, and it is connected with Quelicai and Lospalos Sub - District. There is not any big building in Laga. The good houses in Laga are having CI sheet roof, concrete wall and concrete floor. Government offices, church, school, hospital, clinic and other public buildings and very handful number of private houses are under this category. The rest of the houses are straw roof with bamboo fences in the whole Sub-District.

### Social Institutions:

There are 16 Primary Schools, 11 Churches, 5 clinics, 3 markets, 1 powerhouse and only one salt field in Laga Sub- District. (according to CNRT)

### Power supply:

There were two Generators operating for power supply in Laga and Indonesian army has taken those away. At present Laga is dependent on power supply from Baucau, which is irregular, and insufficient

### Health Service:

Health service in Laga is not sufficient. Only one clinic at Laga Sub- District HQ is operating twice in a week by MSF, which cannot address the health problem of the whole sub- district. People have been suffering from malaria in many villages and treatment facility is very poor and many places treatment facility is not available at all. People cannot come to Laga due to inadequate transport facility and lack of money to meet up transport cost.

### Water Supply:

The water supply system broke down in many places. People are drinking river, well, and spring water around the sub- district, which is dangerous for the health.

### Refugee/ Returnees:

It is reported that 183 people have returned to their houses up to December 1999, out of 839 people who were forced to leave their houses (according to CNRT).

### Agriculture:

Rice seed in farmers are not available. In some villages militias have looted rice seed and in some villages people were bound to consume it as food due to their poverty ness. German Agro Action is planning to supply rice seed in association with CRS but that will not be sufficient according to the demand.

### Main Problem faced by the people in Laga:

Food, education, water supply, power supply, treatment facility, transport and communication, rice seed and agricultural tools are the main problems in Laga. The security situation so far is satisfactory. But it may deteriorate any time due to acute employment problem in the locality.

### Feeling of community people:

People are very anxious to know about the actual time frame of transition of power to the East Timorese. Because they feel that the earliest transition of power to the people will help to create employment facility and will help to solve problems more quickly. Appropriate laws for the administration should be made as quickly as possible to deal with crisis by UNTAET.



## Sub-district Quelicai : A Brief Overview

**Introduction** : Having its boundary with Laga and Baguia on north and east respectively and Baucau and Venilale sub-districts on west and Viqueque district on south, Quelicai is the second biggest sub-district in Baucau district. Matabian, the second highest mountain of the country with its height of 2300 meters, is standing on this sub-district with all its sublimity and grandeur.

**Distance from the District Head quarter** : 34 kilometers.

**Road condition** : Good tarmac road. However 5 kilometers road ahead of Quelicai HQ is comparatively worse and needs repairing.

Number of sub-villages -- 56

**Population** : House holds : 4209  
Total population : 18154.

**Returns** : So far 176 persons have returned from West Timor through UNHCR.

**Power & Electricity** : Before the September '99 crisis there was a generator in the sub-district head quarter. But on September '99 that has been burnt by the militias. At present there is no power facility available in the area.

**Hospital/Clinic** : There is one ten-bed hospital in the area. But it is not functioning at the moment. However there were seven clinics during the Indonesian time. But one of these seven has been burnt by the militias. Other six clinics are only standing with their poor structures without any service facilities. MSF is providing medical services to the locality twice a week in two villages.

**Market** : There is no permanent market in the area. There is a market-shed market sits twice a week. Normally different kinds of vegetables are sold there. There is no shop for finished goods.

**Food** : The first round food distribution under general food distribution program has been completed. The second round distribution is under process.

**Present Requirement** : 1. Power (Electricity)  
2. Agricultural tools  
3. Health Facility

## VEMASSE SUB-DISTRICT - An overview

### GENERAL OVERVIEW

Vemasse sub-district is the western most of the six sub-districts into which Baucau District has been divided. It has a total population of 6966 inhabitants made up largely of subsistence farmers and sparsely scattered small communities of artisanal fishermen and pastoralists who also take up part-time food cultivation during the cropping season. In view of the rugged and hilly nature of the terrain human settlements and activities in the area are confined mainly along the northern coastal strip, where the fresh water swamplands can support agricultural activities, and the southern plains beyond the central highlands, which have divided the sub-district into two parts.

The main agricultural activity in the sub-district is rice production along the coastal swamps and upland plains. Other crops cultivated include corn, cassava, groundnuts and yams. Some vegetable gardening and horticulture are also undertaken, but these are largely done by the womenfolk in the upland areas around Ostico and Uatolari. Artisanal fishing activities take place in the coastal area around the villages of Vemasse and Carabella from around March to December but storage and marketing facilities have not been fully developed for this activity to play any significant role in the economy of the area. Apart from their active role in food crop production, the womenfolk who constitute over 50% of the total population also engage in the weaving of traditional cloth and food processing activities to supplement the family income. In spite of the difficult mountainous terrain Vemasse sub-district is well endowed with a fertile soil and three main rivers that can support viable agricultural activities. Indeed in more settled times the sub-district had enjoyed some measure of food self-sufficiency and security.

The post Popular Consultation violence in East Timor brought in its wake a great deal of problems to the sub-district and its populace. In view of the fact that the sub-district headquarters, the main village of Vemasse and its seven sub-villages, are all located along the Dili-Baucau main road, nearly all of them were the subject of large-scale destruction during those disturbances. Vemasse village in particular had 300 residential houses destroyed or partially damaged. Apart from the damage to private property, there was also the destruction of public facilities and infrastructure like school buildings and materials, offices, water supply system, electricity and telecommunication facilities, agricultural machinery and irrigation canals as well as farm animals (water buffaloes). There were two reported deaths from the hands of the militias and a total of 174 inhabitants of the sub-district were reported to have been abducted and forcibly taken to West Timor during the crisis; only 9 of whom have returned so far.

The population is in a desperate situation and life in the sub-district is generally very difficult presently. Different communities in the area have a different perspective of their priority needs. However from an overall review of the whole situation in the area and having regard to the prevailing conditions in which the whole of East Timor is the following would be a more realistic and pragmatic short to medium term priority list of projects for the area:

#### Critical need for Vemasse people:

1. The provision of a reliable source of safe, potable drinking water for the villagers particularly those in the northern coastal settlements where there is saline intrusion in the local wells and fresh-water springs are located far from the villages.
2. Assistance in the provision of agricultural inputs viz- rice, corn and vegetable seeds, fertilizers as well as light farm machinery like hand tractors and power tillers.
3. The provision of a Health Center with outreach maternal & child health care services.
4. The reconstruction / rehabilitation of destroyed schools and their re-equipment.
5. Improved road transportation links for the outlying five main villages to the south to give them greater access to social services and markets in the coastal areas.
6. The restoration of the electricity supplies system to the sub-district and its extension to the other villages including those in the south.

## Sub-district Venilale : Brief Over view

### **Introduction:**

Venilale sub-district is bordered in the north by Baucau, south by Viqueque, west Vemasse and the east by Quelicai. The area is generally mountainous and has one of the highest mountains in East-Timor known as Mt. Mundo Padido in the low lying areas exist the hot springs. The sub-district is composed of eight villages known as; Badu-hoo, Baha-mori, Fatulia, Uai-Laha, Uai-oli, Uatu-halo, Uma-ana-ulo and Uma-ana-ico. The villages overlook the mountain hence they are sheltered with cool weather and magnificent scenery.

### **The Distance from Head quarters.**

The distance from Baucau town is 28 kms and averagely it takes 46 minutes to reach the sub-district.

**Food and other needs:** The first phase of food distribution was done and the second phase is under way. The area being agricultural based they require agricultural implements and income generating projects.

### **Road condition:**

The road condition is average though in some parts it requires heavy maintenance.

### **Population:**

The total number of house-holds is 4462 families with an average of five people per family and the total population is 2670 persons.

### **Education:**

Most of the schools are in session mostly through the initiative of the church. There are 14 elementary schools 3 junior secondary schools and 1 vocational school.

### **Militia havoc:**

The infrastructure wasn't destroyed apart from a single incident were it is reported that militia destroyed the house of an individual.

### **Returnees:**

It is reported that 72 persons and 25 families fled the villages but up to now they have not returned.

### **Power and electricity:**

The power station has two functioning generators with a capacity of 148kv and they are able supply electricity to about 193 families.

### **Hospital/clinic:**

The area has three main clinics one of which is managed by a German nun doctor, however the other main clinic is grossly under equipped though with a staff of 36 nurses.

### **Market:**

There exists a road side seasonal market and on the market days quite a number of produce is sold which signals hope that life is steadily returning to normal.

## Baguia Sub-district – An Overview

### Introduction:

Baguia sub-district is the most distant sub-district from the city of Baucau, approx. 2 hours travel time by road. It is the mountainous region at the foot of Mount Matebean. Its population is 9507 (CNRT), with 9 villages.

### Villages:

The 9 villages of the Baguia Sub-district are: Afloica, Alava, Defauasi, Hae-coni, Larisual, Lavateri, Ossu-una, Samalari, Ua-cala.

### Post-consultation destruction:

Minimal, with government buildings in the main town undamaged.

### Reports of People killed in the crisis:

Nil

### Health:

MSF operate a visiting clinic to Baguia twice a week (if the road is open). Isolation from main hospital facilities is a problem, and access to the clinic from remote mountain villages is also difficult for sick people.

### Communications:

Difficult, both prior to and after the consultation. The mountain makes radio contact problematic, and must attempt to communicate through UNTAET Los Palos. No post or telecommunications. Road access is difficult in the wet season, with two wash-away spots. Need for bridge/culvert construction in one key spot on the main access road to the sub-district. Feeder roads are in even worse condition. This isolates the sub-district in terms of access to services and markets, and many people are entirely reliant upon travel by foot. This is a key issue for the Baguia community.

### Electricity:

Baguia has a functional generator, and is supplied when possible with fuel from Dili. It operates approx. 5 hours per night. Supply to all village areas is not possible.

### Water Supply:

Water is present, but must be carried long distances by most villagers. Need for development in this field.

### Trade and commerce:

Access to larger markets is hampered by road and transport infrastructure. Agriculture is the main economic activity of the sub-district, with a diversity of maize, rice and vegetable crops in the fertile mountain environment.

### Education:

Schools have recommenced.

### Priority Projects:

1) Road repairs; 2) Water supply projects; 3) agricultural development inc. tools; 4) small-scale income generating projects

At the end of the mission's work our remaining members will visit your office to report the result of fact findings.


I hope you see JICA' Volunteers arriving in Dili in near future.

Excellency,

I have the honor to refer to the recent discussions held between the representatives of the Government of Japan and the UNTAET concerning the dispatch of volunteers to the UNTAET under the Japan Overseas Cooperation Volunteers Program (hereinafter referred to as " the Program " ) with a view to promoting technical cooperation between the UNTAET and the Government of Japan, and to confirm on behalf of the Government of Japan the following understandings reached between them :

1. At the request of the UNTAET, the Government of Japan will, in accordance with the laws and regulations in force in Japan, take necessary measures to dispatch the volunteers to East Timor for the purpose of contributing to the social and economic development of East Timor, according to schedules to be separately agreed upon between the authorities concerned of the UNTAET and the Government of Japan.
2. The Government of Japan will, subject to budgetary appropriations, take necessary measures to bear the cost of international travel between Japan and East Timor and living allowances in East Timor for the volunteers, and to make available such equipment, machinery, materials and medical supplies as may be necessary for the performance of their functions.
3. The UNTAET will grant the volunteers the following privileges, exemptions and benefits:
  - (1) Exemption from customs duties, taxes and charges of any kind in respect of the importation of the equipment, machinery, motorcars, materials and medical supplies mentioned in paragraph 2 above, provided that such effects will be brought back with the volunteers when they depart the UNTAET. Such effects may be donated to the UNTAET on its approval.
  - (2) Exemption from customs duties, taxes and charges of any kind other than those for storage, cartage and similar services in respect of the importation of their personal and household effects.

- (3) Exemption from income taxes and charges of any kind on any emoluments or allowances to be remitted to them from overseas such as the living allowances mentioned in paragraph 2 above.
  - (4) Free medical care during their term of assignment in the UNTAET.
  - (5) Free housing with basic furnishings at places where they are to perform their functions to be assigned to them by the UNTAET to the fullest extent possible.
  - (6) Permission to the volunteers, to install and use radio-communication sets, necessary for the performance of their functions.
  - (7) Issuance of identification cards from the UNTAET to the volunteers to facilitate the performance of their functions.
4. (1) The UNTAET will accept a Representative and Co-ordinators who will discharge the functions to be assigned to them by the Japan International Cooperation Agency, the executing agency for technical cooperation by the Government of Japan, relative to the activities of the Program in East Timor.
- (2) The UNTAET will grant the Representative and the Co-ordinators the following privileges, exemptions and benefits:
- (i) Exemption from customs duties, taxes and charges of any kind in respect of the importation of the equipment, machinery, motorcars, materials and medical supplies, necessary for the performance of their functions.
  - (ii) Permission to open an office to perform their functions.
  - (iii) Exemption from customs duties, taxes and charges of any kind other than those for storage, cartage and similar services in respect of the importation of their personal and household effects.
  - (iv) Exemption from income taxes and charges of any kind on any emoluments or allowances to be remitted to them from overseas.

- (v) Importation free of duties (or purchase from bond in East Timor ) of one motorcar for each of the Representative and the Co-ordinators.
  - (vi) Permission to the Representative and the Co-ordinators, to install and use radio-communication sets, necessary for the performance of their functions.
  - (vii) Issuance of identification card from the UNTAET to the Representative and Co-ordinators to facilitate the performance of their functions.
5. The UNTAET will bear claims, if any arises, resulting from, occurring in the course of, or otherwise connected with any action performed or omission made in the course of official functions by the volunteers in East Timor, except when the UNTAET and the Government of Japan agree that such claims arise from gross negligence or willful misconduct on the part of the volunteers.
  6. The UNTAET and the Government of Japan will hold consultations from time to time for the successful implementation of the Program in East Timor.
  7. The understandings set out above may be amended by an exchange of notes between the UNTAET and the Government of Japan and terminated by either the UNTAET or the Government of Japan by giving to the other six months written notice of its intention to terminate them.

I have further the honor to propose that this Note and Your Excellency's Note in reply confirming on behalf of the UNTAET the foregoing understandings shall be regarded as constituting an agreement between the UNTAET and the Government of Japan, which will enter into force on the date of Your Excellency's reply.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurance of my highest consideration.
