

Letter of Transmittal

Dear Mr. Kawakami.

We are pleased to submit to you the study report on Water Supply and Sanitation in Lindi and Mtwara Regions in the United Republic of Tanzania.

The report presents the study results on the present socioeconomic conditions, especially of the water supplies in the two regions of southern Tanzania, the monitoring results of the pilot water supply schemes, and the water sources development potential of the area. Also addressed in the report is the plan for a water supply project using groundwater as the supply source in the prioritized 100 villages out of 913 villages.

The study consists of four separate volumes, including the Summary, the Main Report, the Supporting Report and the Data Book. The Summary states concisely all the results of the Study. The Main Report describes the results of the Study and analysis including the project implementation plans for the priority villages and an evaluation of the project. The Supporting Report contains tables on conditions of present water use and supply facilities of the 95 villages visited for sampling surveys and the 100 villages for feasibility studies, respectively. It also includes summary sheets of the hydrogeological conditions of each of the 100 villages and the roles of the village water committees currently established at the pilot scheme sites. The Data Book contains the tables listing all the villages in the two regions (913 villages with 510 sub-villages), various data from hydrogeological and geophysical field surveys, and the results of water quality tests on 161 samples.

We are confident that implementation of the proposed project would greatly contribute to improving the water supply conditions in the two regions of southern Tanzania.

We wish to take this opportunity to express our sincere gratitude to your agency and the Japanese Embassy in Tanzania. We also wish to express our deep appreciation to the Ministry of Water and Livestock Development and other authorities concerned of the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania for the close cooperation and assistance extended to us during our activities in the Study Area.
