

# **Sub-contracted Survey: Socio-economics in Fisheries Communities**

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE

#### 1. Background

The Master Plan Study on Fisheries Development (here after Fisheries master plan project) launched in January 2001. The project is executed and funded by Japan International Cooperation Agency.

The expected outputs of the project are the fisheries development master plan which provide guidance to the government and donors countries for fisheries policy implementation, covering whole Tanzanian mainland. The project will also be expected to emphasize immediate priorities and necessary actions for accelerating growth of the sector and improvement of fishers lives condition in coming decade.

In order to develop this master plan, the project will conduct socio-economic survey in the early stage of the study by hiring local consultants. This survey is expected to provide both quantitative and qualitative analysis on the sector situation and fishers life which is necessary for the master plan.

#### 2. Activities of local consultants

- (a) To undertake household and marketing survey.
- (b) To prepare the report that will comprise an analysis of findings and recommendation for selected issues as included in the objectives.
- (c) To undertake activities outlined in the methodology section.

#### 3. Objectives of the survey

The followings are main objectives of the survey:

- To provide data for measuring living condition of household in fishing communities and different fisheries groups, with a view of making fisheries policy for some development issues.
- To provide data to be used in investigating saving and credit scheme for fishers group
- To supply data of fishers opinion for fisheries development and government support
- To supply data which are used in identifying poverty line of fishers household
- To provide information of fish consumption characteristics of consumers
- To provide information for forecasting fish demand for consuming market, with a view of quality, price, species, processing type, etc.

#### 4. Methodology

- (b) Household survey, Market survey and consumer survey
- (c) Focus group discussion (using leading questions)
- (d) Physical surveys (observation)
