12 PRIORITY PROJECTS

According to the strategies which developed based on the current situation and problems and needs assessment to achieve the set objectives, the team proposes the several projects for the implementation by the government and donors/NGOs.¹

12.1 PROJECT FOR IMPROVEMENT OF ACCESS AND QUALITY OF RCH SERVICES

12.1.1 Project Purpose

The project purpose is to improve the RCH coverage and quality of services through management capacity building, health and communication skill development, referral service establishment, provision of equipment and upgrading/construction of health facilities.

12.1.2 Project Location

(1) Year 1

- Damoh District Recommended pilot area: Hatta Block
- Tikamgarh District Recommended pilot area: Baldevgarh Block

(2) Year 2 ~ 8

After an evaluation of the activities and results in the first year, area for implementation will be extended to two to three blocks in the second year. If results of evaluation on the project for two years are positive, the project area will be extended to cover all blocks of the entire two districts.

- Damoh District all blocks
- Tikamgarh District all blocks

12.1.3 Target Beneficiaries

(1) Year 1

- Direct beneficiaries: the women of reproductive age who reside in Damoh and Tikamgarh district, and their children, particularly neonates.
- Indirect beneficiaries: the families and communities of the direct beneficiaries.

12.1.4 Project Duration

Eight (5) years in total;

- (1) Preparation and pilot phase in one demonstration block per district: the first year
- (2) Expansion phase 1 in two to three blocks per district: the second years

- (4) Continuous phase of full implementation in the entire district: the forth and fifth years
- (5) Adding project sub-components under the project to achieve the master plan objectives in the sixth and eight years

12.1.6 Project Components and Activities

The Project Activities fall under four major sub-components.

The first step in project activities is to establish a coordinating committee in each district, composed of donor, district, state, and block stakeholders, to oversee and support the project.

This committee will be responsible for assuring smooth implementation of the project and will monitor the quality of its implementation on an on-going basis. Next a reassessment must be conducted to ascertain the status of the target health facilities and infrastructure, equipment, skills and recent training, communication and management. This reassessment is necessary because of the time elapsed between the original project design and its implementation.



Dr. Yoichi YAMAGATA Leader Preparatory Study Team Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) The Japanese Preparatory Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team"), organized by Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA") visited the state of Madhya Pradesh from 12th to 20th April 2000, during which the Team had a series of meetings with officials concerned of Government of Madhya Pradesh (hereinafter referred to as "GOMP"). The list of those who attended the meetings is shown in the Appendix I.

The Minutes of Meetings have been prepared for the better understanding of the Scope of Work agreed upon between GOMP and the Team on 20th April 2000. The main items discussed and agreed by both sides are as follows.

I TITLE OF THE STUDY

Both sides agreed that the title of the study be changed to "The Development Study on Reproductive Health in the State of Madhya Pradesh, India" in order to clarify the object of the study.

II. STUDY AREA

- 1. Both sides agreed that the Study would cover Sagar Revenue Division and prioritize on Tikamgarh and Damoh districts.
- 2. GOMP requested the Team that Ujjain Division of the state of Madhya Pradesh (see Appendix II) should also be included in the study area since women's health status in this division showed one of the lowest figures in the state. The Team explained that this kind of request needs to be submitted to the Government of Japan through the diplomatic channel for their consideration. It would therefore not be realistic to include Ujjain Division in the Study. In the mean time, the Team assured that they should bring this request to Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Japan and JICA Head Quarters.

III. TARGET YEAR

Both sides agreed that the target year of the Master Plans designed be 2010 in accordance with the National Socio-Demographic Goals for 2010.

IV. SCOPE OF THE STUDY

Both sides agreed that Full-Scale Study Team consisting of Japanese consultants



(hereinafter referred to as "the Consultants Team") should follow ICPD guidelines in the course of the Study.

V. WORK SCHEDULE

GOMP requested the team that duration of the Study should be shortened from proposed 18 months to 12 months in order to catch up with the rapid developments taking place in the State. The Team assured GOMP to consider this request.

VI. UNDERTAKING OF GOVERNMENT OF INDIA

- 1. As to 4. (2) of the Scope of Work, the Team requested GOMP that counterpart personnel should be identified who accompany the Consultants Team while going for field survey for ensuring better cooperation, to which GOMP agreed. A nodal officer to be nominated for this by GOMP.
- 2. As to 4. (3), GOMP notified the Team that office space would be provided in Health and Family Welfare Sector Reform Bureau Building in Bhopal and in the Training Center in Sagar District for the use of the Consultants Team. GOMP will provide them any further office space if requested. As for necessary equipment and furniture, GOMP requested Japan to provide the same, to which the Team agreed to consider.
- 3. As to 4. (5), GOMP notified the Team that GOMP shall provide the Consultants Team with support in transportation as far as possible.

VII. OTHERS

- 1. Both sides agreed that the Study would cover newborn baby as well as children up to five years.
- 2. Both sides agreed the result of the Study be open to the public.





(4) Justification of the Project

Present condition of the sector. Population situation in India requires immediate attention as it continues to grow at a high rate. For the period 1995-2000, the average annual population growth rate in India has been estimated to be 1.8 per cent per year which is higher than the Asian average rate of 1.5 per cent according to UNFPA. There is a projection that the population

of the country would be largest in the world at this rate of growth. It is therefore urgent to tackle issues related to population growth in India.

Sectoral development policy of the national/local government. Government of India as well as government of Madhya Pradesh are committed to tackle the problem of rapid population growth in a manner that is conducive to social and economic development and well-being of the society, especially the poor and the most deprived sections. The population stabilization programme is one of the top priority programme of the national and the state government.

Problems to be solved in the sector. One of the alarming facts in the population issues in India is the extremely low level of women's reproductive health. Maternal mortality rate in India, estimated on the basis of data collected from 109 hospitals in 23 districts, is 500 deaths per 100,000 live births. As long term solution to the India's population challenge, it is crucial to promote women's empowerment through improvement of their reproductive health among women in reproductive age, to raise awareness about health and to build an environment in which women themselves can control their reproductive health.

Outline of the project. The project will focus on the improvements in women's reproductive health through the expansion of services concerning safe motherhood. Specifically, it will focus upon



MINUTES OF MEETING ON DRAFT FINAL REPORT FOR

Bhopal, Mar. 4, 2002

The Counterpart Meeting was convened on 31 January 2002 at Jehan Numa Palace Hotel to explain and discuss the Draft Final Report, which was submitted to the Government of Madhya Pradesh.

After the presentation of the Draft Final Report by JICA Study Team, discussion was made and the following points were agreed upon between the Indian side and the Japanese side.

- The following items were discussed and confirmed by both sides.
 - (1) The strategy to strengthen cooperation and coordination between the health infrastructure and the political system (PRI/Gram Sabha) should be two folds:
 - (a) To strengthen the service providers
 - (b) To strengthen the motivators

The motivator will be under the gamut of 'Village Health Committee' but could be an anganwadi worker, a self-help group or any good opinion leader either as individual or as an organization.

Their capacity building shall be done to promote participatory planning & and implementation.

- (2) Linkages between the community and the government health sector will be important and help generate demand for health services.
- (3) It is recommended that micro planning be included in the priority projects.
- (4) Proposed projects should be discussed in the Strategic Planning Meeting, prior to finalization for implementation, in order to avoid duplication.
- 2. The following comments expressed by the Indian side shall be considered by JICA.
 - (1) The priority projects of the district master plan should extended to the entire two districts of Damoh and Tikamgarh within three years in accordance with the new state health strategies. 'Convergence', Micro-planning', 'Implementation' and

Mhaama A-54 HS

'Monitoring' are the key guidelines of the new state health strategies for the strategic approach with 40 points activities to achieve the mission of population policy.

- . (2) The priority projects will be started with small-scale projects at one block in each district, Damoh and Tikamgarh. The small-scale projects should be replicable to all blocks in the two districts.
 - (3) To improve the access to high quality RCH services, the State Government of Madhya Pradesh would prefer to incorporate the concept of 'Convergence of services of social sector' (hygiene sanitation, women's income, women's empowerment, nutrition, etc.) into the implementation phase of the priority projects. The convergence of activities of different department at grass root level should focus to maximize their efforts.
 - (4) GIS will give a very good user-friendly alternative to see graphic display of information. Village wise user-friendly GIS package would also be available and it should be used maximally for micro-planning. The GIS developed by the Government of Madhya Pradesh is recommended to be used.
 - (5) 'Micro-planning' shall be introduced for better implementation of activities in the priority projects. In the new state health strategies, the 20% area of selected districts will be covered in the first year for intensive activity, and gradually expanded to the in whole area of the districts in a phased manner.
 - (6) The strategy shall include proper 'monitoring' tools. Performance indicators shall be worked out in the priority projects using HMIS and GIS for better monitoring of implementation.
 - (7) The State Government of Madhya Pradesh understands that the terms of reference for JICA Study Team was to prepare the master plan for improvement of reproductive health for Tikamgarh and Damoh Districts. Based on the plan, the priority projects may be undertaken by the government and/or any development partners.
- 3. The State Government of Madhya Pradesh agreed to send the comments on the Draft Final Report by March 8, 2002 to JICA headquarter through JICA India Office.
- The State Government of Madhya Pradesh will accept the Final Report after the study team gives necessary correction to the Draft Final Report based on the comments agreed on by both the State Government of Madhya Pradesh and JICA Study Team.


