Japanese Institute for Training Car Maintenance for Saudis

At the attendance of Dr. Ali Al-Namlah, Minister of Labor and Social Affairs and Ambassador of Japan, H.E. Dr. Ali Al-Ghafis, Governor of the General Organization for Technical Education and Vocational Training (GOTEVT) and Mr. Yukio OTSU, Vice President of Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) signed an agreement for setting up the Saudi-Japanese Automobile High Institute Project.

The Institute will be established in Jeddah at a cost of SR100 Million. Graduates from high school students will study two year in automobile maintenance which will help them to work at car maintenance workshops, General inspection, Maintenance of passenger and commercial automobiles.

The period of agreement between the two countries is 5 years and expected to train 600 students

The Minister of Labor said that this agreement is a good step for the creation of jobs to the Saudis and will pen the country for acquiring Japanese expertise, and contribute for Saudization which needs qualified students and we hope that this will happen by acquiring Japanese expertise.

On the other hand, Dr. Al-Ghafis elaborated that this agreement is within the cooperation agenda between the two countries following the landmark visit of Crown Prince Abdullah, Deputy Premier and Commander of the National Guard, to Japan in 1998. He added that this project will be followed by other projects which shows the strength of the relation of the two countries.

The Institute is located in 25 Km South East Jeddah on an area of $70,000 \text{ m}^2$. of which the total floor area for buildings reaches 24,000 m². The number of technical instructors in the Institute is 24 teachers, 15 teachers for general subjects and 18 administrative staffs.

Minister of Labor and Ambassador of Japan Patronize Signing Agreement

SR100 Million to Establish and Operate the Saudi-Japan Automobile High Institute

Dr. Al-Ghafis: The Project is the result of the Crown Prince Abdullah's visit to Japan two year ago

H.E. Dr. Ali Al-Ghafis, Governor of the General Organization for Technical Education and Vocational Training (GOTEVT) signed an agreement for setting up the Saudi-Japanese Automobile High Institute Project which costs 100 Million Saudi Riyals.

Mr. Yukio OTSU, Vice President of Japan International Cooperation Agency (IICA) visiting the Kingdom for this project put his signature on behalf of the Japanese side. The agreement that took place at Hyatt Regency Hotel and was patronized by H.E. Dr. Ibrahim Ali Al-Namlah, Minister of Labor and Social Affairs and the Chairman of GOTEVT and Mr. Shotaro OSHIMA, Ambassador of Japan to the Kingdom.

After the signing formalities, Dr. Al-Ghafis made a speech elaborating the importance of this agreement in the field of qualifying the Saudi youth and Saudi Businessmen. He also pointed out that this agreement is within the cooperation agenda between the two countries following the landmark visit of Crown Prince Abdullah, Deputy Premier and Commander of the National Guard to Japan in 1998.

C \lambda!-Ghafis then reviewed the history of the technical cooperation between GOTEVT and IICA and the completed joint projects. He asserted that GOTEVT is making efforts for having better technology and international experience for the achievement of the Kingdom's development in all aspects.

After that, JICA's Vice President made his speech expressing his happiness of this agreement, and he considered it as a transitional step forwards in the cooperation between Saudi Arabia and Japan.

Mr. OTSU said that he is confident that this project will positively affect teaching of the technical education and the Saudi labor market and contribute for Saudization.

In a press statement, the Minister of Labor said that this agreement is a good step for the creation of jobs to the Saudis and will open the country for acquiring Japanese expertise, and that similar agreements will be followed in the field of electronics.

It is indicated that the Government of Japan will contribute SR30 Million for this project, which is the cost of equipment and experts, while the Government of Saudi Arabia will provide a land at the cost of SR20 Million. The cost of setting up the project, which cost around SR 50 Million is divided between Japan Automobile Manufacturers Association (JAMA) and the Japanese Automobile Distributors in

the Kingdom (JADIK) which are; TOYOTA, NISSAN, SUZUKI. MAZDA and DAIHATSU., while Honda and Mitsubishi in the Kingdom are still studying and considering the project.

In accordance with the statement issue in this concern, the object of this project is to promote Saudization in the Automobile Engineering Sector, when the students complete two-years study in automobile maintenance and acquire practical study at the Institute's workshops. Completing this study, the student will receive a certificate equivalent to the third Japanese National license in Automobile Mechanic.

The term of this agreement between the two countries is 5 years, during which 3 batches of more than 600 graduates. It is expected to accept annually 200 High School graduates as the students in the Institute for a two years study, whereas they will study general inspection, maintenance of passenger and commercial automobiles.

The Institute is located 25 Km South East Jeddah on an area of 70 thousand m² of which the total floor area for buildings reaches 24,000 m².

The number of technical instructors in the Institute is 24 teachers, 15 teachers for general subjects and 18 administrative staffs.

The opening of the Institute will be in 2002.

Japan Assisted Saudi Arabia for Setting up Automobile Institute at the Cost of \$26 Million

Japs: International Cooperation Agency (JICA) and Technical Education and Vocational Training (GC.EVT) signed an agreement for setting up the Saudi-Japanese Automobile High Institute Project which costs 100 Million Saudi Riyals (\$26.6 Million) in cooperation with Japan Automobile Manufacturers Association (JAMA) and the Japanese Automobile Distributors in the Kingdom (JADIK) which includes 11 companies. The project will be established in Jeddah on an area of 70 thousand m2

The Minister of Labor said that this agreement is a good step for the creation of jobs to the Saudis and he asserted that there is a good job opportunities for Saudis in the Kingdom, but the only thing they need is qualifications. He also urged the government of Japan to implement other industrial projects in the field of technology, instruments and equipment to contribute in the qualification of Saudi youth and train them to work in these fields, in addition to the transfer of Japanese technology to the Kingdom through opening branches of the Japanese factories and companies in the Kingdom.

GOTEVOT, JICA ink cooperation pact

RIYADH — The General Organization for Technical Education and Vocational Training and Japan International Cooperation Agency signed here yesterday an SR80 million cooperation agreement for setting up the Saudi-Japanese Automobile High Institute Project in Jeddah. The move is expected to promote Saudization in the automobile maintenance sector.

The agreement was signed by Dr. All ibn Nasser Al-Ghafia, governor of GOTEVOT, and Yukio Olsa, vice president of IICA. Minister of I Labor and Social Affairs Dr. Ali Al-Namla, Japanese Ambassador Shotaro Oshima and Kuniaki Nagata, IICA resident representative in Riyadh, were present at the signing ceremony.

were present at the signing ceremony. Speaking on the occasion, Al-Ghafis said the agreement lends a new direction to the bilateral relations following the landmark visit of Crown Prince Abdullah, deputy premier and commander of the National Guard, to Japan in October 1998.

Since then, Saudi-Japanese relations have been developing in various fields, including cultural and youth exchange programs, sports as well as cooperation in the establishment of an automobile technical training institute.

He said the agreement symbolizes cooperation between GOTEVOT and JICA on the one hand and between the Japan. Automobile Manufacturers' Association (JAMA) and the Japanese Automobile Distributors in

the Kingdom (JADJK) on the other. He thanked the Repunese ambassador, JAMA and JADJK for their untiring efforts in laying the foundation of the project.

The GOTEVOT governor hoped that the example set by JAMA and JADIK would inspire other multinational companies in the Kingdom to establish similar projects.

Six Japanese automobile manufacturers — Toyota, Niasan, Mazda, Suzuki, Isuzu and Daihatsu — are cooperating in the venture, while Honda and Missubishi are examining the project. When completed, it will provide new job opportunities for the Saudis in the repair and maintenance of Japanese velicies.

Of the SR80 million cost of the project, JICA is contributing SR29 million over a five-year period toward the cost of equipment. The balance for the construction of the institute, will be raised by JAMA and JADIK. The government has allocated a 70,000-square kilometer plot for the project free of cost southeast of leddah city.

The institute will graduate three batches of more than 600 trainees over a five-year period, It will accept 200

The institute will graduate three batches of more than 600 trainers over a five-year period. It will accept 200 high school graduates who will be put through a two-year training program at the institute. The graduates will be trained on regular and routine repair work of passenger cars and commercial vehicles.

The teaching staff will consist of 24 technical instructors, 15 general education teachers and 18 administrative personnel.


