I INTRODUCTION

In response to the request of the Government of the Republic of Panama (hereinafter referred to as "Panamanian side"), the Government of Japan decided to conduct The Study on Solid Waste Management Plan for Municipality of Panama in the Republic of Panama (hereinafter referred to as "the Study") in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations in force in Japan.

Accordingly, Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA"), the official agency responsible for the implementation of the technical cooperation programs of the Government of Japan, will undertake the Study in close cooperation with the authorities concerned of Panamanian side.

The present document sets forth the scope of work for the Study.

II OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

The objectives of the Study are:

- 1.to formulate the master plan for solid waste management for Municipality of Panama;
- 2. to conduct feasibility study on priority project(s) which will be selected from the master plan; and
- 3. to pursue technology transfer to the counterpart personnel in the course of the Study.

III STUDY AREA

The Study shall cover Municipality of Panama shown in the attached sheet of Appendix 1.

IV SCOPE OF THE STUDY

VI REPORTS

Twenty (20) copies at the beginning of Phase II.

3 Draft Final Report:

Twenty (20) copies at the end of the Study in Panama.

Panamanian side shall submit their comments within one (1) month after the receipt of the Draft Final Report.

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 Final Report: Twenty (20) copies.

VII UNDERTAKING OF PANAMANIAN SIDE

- 1. To facilitate the smooth conduct of the Study, Panamanian side will take the following necessary measures:
- (1) to secure the safety of the Japanese study team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team");
- (2) to permit the members of the Team to enter, leave and sojourn in Panama for the duration of their assignment therein, and exempt them from foreign registration requirements and consular fees:
- (3) to exempt the members of the Team from taxes, duties, fees and any other charges on equipment, vehicles, machinery and other materials brought into and out of Panama for the conduct of the Study;
- (4) to exempt the members of the Team from income tax and charges of any kind imposed on or in connection with any emoluments or allowances paid to the members of the Team for their services in connection with the implementation of the Study;
- (5) to provide necessary facilities to the Team for remittance as well as utilisation of the funds introduced into Panama from Japan in connection with the implementation of the Study;
- (6) to secure permission for the Team to enter into private properties or restricted areas for the conduct of the Study;
- (7) to secure permission for the Team to take all data and documents (including photographs and maps) related to the Study out of Panama to Japan, and
- (8) to provide medical services as needed. Its expenses will be chargeable to the members of the Team.
- 2. Panamanian side shall bear claims, if any arises, against the members of the Team resulting from, occurring in the course of, or otherwise connected with the discharge of their duties in the implementation of the Study, except when such claims arise from gross negligence or wilful misconduct on the part of the member of the Team.
- 3. Municipality of Panama shall act as a counterpart agency to the Team and also as a coordinating body in relation with other governmental and non-governmental organisations concerned for the smooth implementation of the Study.
- 4. Municipality of Panama shall, at its own expense, provide the Team with the following, in cooperation with other organisations concerned:
- (1) available data and information related to the Study,
- (2) counterpart personnel,
- (3) suitable office space with necessary equipment in Panama City, and
- (4) credentials or identification cards to the member of the Team.

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WI UNDERTAKING OF JAPANESE SIDE

For the implementation of the Study, Japanese side shall take the following measures:

- 1. to dispatch, at its own expense, the Team to Panama,
- 2. to pursue technology transfer to the counterpart personnel in the course of the Study.

IX CONSULTATION

ЛСА and Municipality of Panama will consult with each other in respect of any matter that may arise from or in connection with the Study.


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The Scope of Work is prepared in English and Spanish, and both versions are signed by the both partners. In case any doubt arises in interpretation, the English text shall prevail.

In response to the request of the Government of Republic of Panama (hereinafter referred to as "Panamanian side"), the Preparatory Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team") was sent by Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA") to discuss the Scope of Work for The Study on Solid Waste Management Plan for Municipality of Panama in the Republic of Panama (hereinafter referred to as "the Study") with Municipality of Panama and the concerned officials of Panamanian side.

A series of discussions and field survey in the study area were held from July 31 to August 7, 2001. The main issues on the discussions regarding the Scope of Work are as follows:

1. Title

Both sides agreed that the title of the Study would be "The Study on Solid Waste Management Plan for Municipality of Panama in the Republic of Panama" as described in the Scope of Work.

2. Target year

Both sides agreed that the target year for the master plan would be the year 2015.

3. Types of solid waste

Both side agreed that the types of solid waste to be studied would be domestic waste, industrial waste and medical waste.

Problem identification would be carried out as for industrial waste and medical waste.

4. Contents of master plan, feasibility study and pilot project(s)

Panamanian side tentatively requested the Team to examine the following contents for master plan, priority project(s) for feasibility study and pilot project(s);

- 1) Master plan
- a) Improvement of collection system
- b) Tariff collection system
- c) Improvement and expansion of street cleaning system
- d) Improvement of maintenance system
- 2) Feasibility study
- a) Transfer station including small recycling system
- b) Recycling plant
- 3) Pilot projects
- a) Education program in communities and schools
- b) Collection experiment (collection route, frequency)
- c) Separate collection
- d) Separate disposal area in Cerro Patacon (hazardous, medical, etc)
- e) Participatory improvement of solid waste management

The highest priority was placed on a), followed by b), c), d), e).


The team explained that the contents of the study would be selected, within the capacity of the study team, over the discussion between Panamanian side and Japanese side.

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Panamanian side agreed that municipality of San Miguelito shall provide necessary cooperation for the study such as submission of data and information, permission for the field survey of the study team.

6. Steering committee

Panamanian side assured that for the smooth implementation of the study and effective use of the study results the steering committee be organized at the commencement of the Study upon consultation with the study team. The steering committee would be chaired by municipality of Panama, and composed of representatives of organizations concerned such as follows.

Ministry of Economy and Finance Ministry of Health National Environmental Authority Municipality of San Miguelito

7. Reports

Panamanian side requested the Team to prepare the same number of copies in Spanish for each report for better understanding of the study result as a reference. The Team assured to convey the request to JICA Headquarters for further consideration. Panamanian side also agreed that in case any doubt arises in interpretation, the English version shall prevail.

Panamanian side agreed that the reports would be open to the public.

8. Vehicles

Municipality of Panama agreed to make endeavour to provide necessary number of vehicles with drivers as situation permits. The Team agreed to convey the situation to JICA Headquarters.

9. Technology transfer

Panamanian side requested the Team to provide counterpart training in Japan and to hold a seminar during the study to transfer technology. The Team agreed to convey the request to JICA Headquarters.
