IN THE FIELD OF MOTHER AND CHILD HEALTH IN GEORGIA




The Team held discussions with the officials concerned of Georgia and conducted a field survey at the study area.

The objective of the Project is to improve and strengthen the prenatal medical service and Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI) activity in Georgia, through the procurement of medical and cold chain equipment.

2. Project sites

The sites of the Project are as described in Annex-1.

3. Responsible and Implementing Agency

Responsible and Implementing Agency is Ministry of Labour, Health and Social Affairs.

4. Items requested by Georgia.

After discussions with the Team, the items described in Annex-2 were finally requested by the Georgian side. JICA will assess the appropriateness of the request and will recommend to the Government of Japan for approval.

5. Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

- 5-1 The Georgian side understands the Japan's Grant Aid Scheme explained by the Team, as described in Annex -3.
- 5-2 The Georgian side will take the necessary measures, as described in Annex-4, for smooth implementation of the Project, as a condition for the Japan's Grant Aid to be implemented.

6. Schedule of the Study

- 6-1 The consultants will proceed to further studies in Georgia until May 9, 2003.
- 6-2 JICA will prepare the draft report in English and dispatch a mission in order to explain its contents in July 2003.
- 6-3 In case that the content of the report is accepted in principle by Georgia, JICA will complete the final report and send it to Georgia around September, 2003.



7. Other relevant issues

- 7-1 The Georgian side has agreed to secure and allocate the enough budgets to operate and maintain the medical equipment supplied by the Grant Aid properly and effectively.
- 7-2 The both parties confirmed that all requested project facilities would not be privatized in the future.
- 7-3 The Georgian side explained that some facilities for prenatal diagnostics might be consolidated according to the 'Master Plan of Optimization and Restructuring of Medical Facilities in Georgia (2000-2009)'. The both parties confirmed following principals;
- i) The area and the beneficiaries covered by each facility would not be changed by the consolidation.
 - ii) The Georgian side has responsibility for all necessary arrangements based on grant aid procedures, in case of site change caused by the consolidation.
- 7-4 The Georgian side stressed that unified equipment for prenatal medical service shall be provided to the all project sites in order to ensure equal medical services in the both urban and rural areas. The team explained that the appropriateness of the project sites and the equipment to be procured would be assessed in Japan according to criteria such as;
- i) A number of registered pregnant women and/or patients of the each medical facility
 - ii) Medical staffs' capability of operation and maintenance of the equipment
 - iii) Electricity supply condition at the each site, etc.
- 7-5 The team confirmed that the project sites where to be supplied cold chain equipment had not been decided as of April 13, 2003. The team requested the Georgian side to submit EPI activity plan and necessary information such as project sites list, electricity supply condition, etc. by the end of April.
- 7-6 The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side would take necessary measures for delivery of the equipment on the territory of Georgia in case this project is implemented.
- 7-7 In relation with the project, the team confirmed the following projects were under planning;
- i) 'Primary Health Care Development Project' by World Bank
 - ii) 'Support for Expanded Program for Immunization Activity' by Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI).

The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side would coordinate with the donors in order to avoid duplication and to carry out the each project efficiently.



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Japan's Grant Aid Program

1. Japan's Grant Aid Procedures

(1) The Japan's Grant Aid Program is executed by the following procedures.

Application (request made by a recipient country)

Study (Basic Design Study conducted by JICA)

Appraisal & Approval (appraisal by the Government of Japan and approval by the Cabinet of Japan)

Determination of Implementation (Exchange of Notes between both Governments)

Implementation (implementation of the Project)

(2) Firstly, an application or a request for a Grant Aid project submitted by the recipient country is examined by the Government of Japan (the Ministry of Foreign Affairs) to determine whether or not it is eligible for Japan's Grant Aid. If the request is deemed appropriate, the Government of Japan assigns JICA to conduct a study on the request.

Secondly, JICA conducts the study (Basic Design Study), using (a) Japanese consulting firm(s).

Thirdly, the Government of Japan appraises the project to see whether or not it is suitable for Japan's Grant Aid Program, based on the Basic Design Study Report prepared by JICA and the results are then submitted to the cabinet for approval.


Fourth, the project approved by the cabinet becomes official with the Exchange of Notes signed by the Government of Japan and the recipient country.

Finally, for the implementation of the Project, JICA assists the recipient country in preparing contracts and so on.

2. Contents of the Study

(1) Contents of the Study

The purpose of the Basic Design Study conducted by JICA on a requested project is to provide a basic document necessary for appraisal of the project by the



Japanese Government. The contents of the Study are as follows:

- a) confirmation of the background, objectives, benefits of the project and also institutional capacity of agencies concerned of the recipient country necessary for project implementation,
- b) evaluation of the appropriateness of the project for the Grant Aid Scheme from a technical, social and economical point of view,
- c) confirmation of items agreed on by the both parties concerning a basic concept of the project,
- d) preparation of a basic design of the project,
- e) estimation of cost of the project.

The contents of the original request are not necessarily approved in their initial form as the contents of the Grant Aid project. The Basic Design of the project is confirmed considering the guidelines of Japan's Grant Aid Scheme.

Final project components are subject to approval by the Government of Japan and therefore may differ from an original request. Implementing the project, the Government of Japan requests the recipient country to take necessary measures involved which are itemized on Exchange of Notes.

(2) Selection of Consultants


For smooth implementation of the study, JICA uses (a) registered consulting firm(s). JICA selects (a) firm(s) based on the proposals submitted by the interested firms. The firm(s) selected carry(ies) out a Basic Design Study and write(s) a report, based upon terms of reference set by JICA.

The consulting firm(s) used for the study is (are) recommended by JICA to a recipient country after Exchange of Notes, in order to maintain technical consistency and also to avoid any undue delay in implementation should the selection process be repeated.

3. Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

(1) What is Grant Aid?

The Grant Aid Program provides a recipient country with non reimbursable funds to procure the equipment and services (engineering services and transportation of the products, etc.) for economic and social development of the country under principles in accordance with relevant laws and regulations of Japan. The Grant Aid is not supplied through the donation of materials or such.



(2) Exchange of Notes (E/N)

Both Governments concerned extend Japan's Grant Aid in accordance with the Exchange of Notes in which the objectives of the Project, period of execution, conditions and amount of the Grant Aid etc., are confirmed.

(3) "The period of the Grant Aid" means one Japanese fiscal year which the Cabinet approves the Project for. Within the fiscal year, all procedure such as Exchange of Notes, concluding a contract with (a) consulting firm(s) and (a) contractor(s) and a final payment to them must be completed.

(4) Under the Grant, in principle, products and services of origins of Japan or the recipient country are to be purchased.

When the two Governments deem it necessary, the Grant may be used for the purchase of products or services of a third country.

However the prime contractors, namely, consulting, contractor and procurement firms, are limited to "Japanese nationals". (The term "Japanese nationals" means persons of Japanese nationality or Japanese corporations controlled by persons of Japanese nationality.)

(5) Necessity of the "Verification"

The Government of the recipient country or its designated authority will conclude contracts denominated in Japanese yen with Japanese nationals. The Government of Japan shall verify those contracts. The "Verification" is deemed necessary to secure accountability to Japanese tax payers.

(6) Undertakings Required to the Government of the Recipient Country

In the implementation of the Grant Aid project, the recipient country is required to undertake such necessary measures as the following:

a) to secure land necessary for the sites of the project prior to the installation work in case the project is providing equipment,

b) to provide facilities for distribution of electricity, water supply and drainage and other incidental facilities in and around the sites,

c) to secure buildings prior to the installation work in case the project is providing equipment,

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d) to ensure all the expenses and prompt execution for unloading, customs clearance at the port of disembarkation and internal transportation of the products purchased under the Grant Aid,

e) to exempt Japanese nationals from customs duties, internal taxes and other fiscal levies which will be imposed in the recipient country with respect to the supply of the products and services under the Verified Contracts,

f) to accord Japanese nationals whose services may be required in connection with the supply of the products and services under the Verified Contracts, such facilities as may be necessary for their entry into the recipient country and stay therein for the performance of their work.

(7) Proper Use

The recipient country is required to maintain and use the equipment purchased under the Grant Aid properly and effectively and to assign staff necessary for the operation and maintenance as well as to bear all expenses other than those covered by the Grant Aid.

(8) Re-export

The products purchased under the Grant Aid shall not be re-exported from the recipient country.

(9) Banking Arrangement (B/A)


a) The Government of the recipient country or its designated authority shall open an account in the name of the Government of the recipient country in a bank in Japan. The Government of Japan will execute the Grant Aid by making payments in Japanese yen to cover the obligations incurred by Government of the recipient country or its designated authority under the Verified Contracts.

b) The payments will be made when payment requests are presented by the bank to the Government of Japan under an Authorization to Pay issued by the Government of the recipient country or its designated authority.

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



JICA will complete the final report in accordance with the confirmed items and send it to the Government of Georgia around September 2003.


4. Other Relevant Issues

- 4-1. The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side should secure and allocate enough budgets to operate and maintain the medical equipment to be procured through the Grant Aid properly and effectively.
- 4-2. The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side would have training on diagnosis with 'ultrasound equipment' for doctors of all project sites in order to deepen their skills.
- 4-3. The instruction on the operation and maintenance of 'ultrasound equipment' will be hold in Kutaisi and Tbilisi after the delivery by a Japanese supplier. The Georgian side ensured to take necessary arrangement so that the personnel of all project sites could join it.
- 4-4. The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side ensured to prepare electric power sources for the following 3 (three) facilities before the equipment under the project was supplied.
 - Polyclinical Ambulatory Unit, Shuakhevi district in Adjara region
 - Polyclinic for IDP from Abkhazia, Kutaisi district in Imureti region
 - District Polyclinic, Oni district in Racha-Lechkhumi region

- 4-5. The Japanese side will cover a delivery of the equipment to Tbilisi and Poti. The Georgian side ensured to take responsibility for the delivery from the said 2 (two) cities to the all project sites.
- 4-6. The both parties confirmed that Georgian side would confirm the completion of the delivery of the equipment to each site in collaboration with the consultant.
- 4-7. The both parties confirmed that the Georgian side would have monitoring on the maintenance and the operation of the equipment to be procured through the Grant Aid periodically.
