In July, 2001 the Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA") dispatched a Basic Design Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team") on the Project for the Consolidation of Educational Television and Radio Recording Studios (hereinafter referred to as "the Project") to the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia (hereinafter referred to as "the Ethiopia") and final study report was made in January, 2002.

Based upon the final study report, Exchange of Notes for the Project was made in February, 2002 and the Project was implemented at only three studios among the proposed ten studios because the works to be undertaken by the Ethiopian side at seven studios had not been completed by the dead line.

Subsequently, the Ethiopian side made a request for Grant Aid for the Project for the remaining seven studios. The Government of Japan has sent the Implementation Review Study Team to Ethiopia, which is headed by Mr. YABE Yujiro, JICA Ethiopia Office from 19th May to 6th June, 2003, in order to gather necessary information for cost estimate and to explain and consult with the Ethiopian side on the draft list of equipment of the Project and the undertakings of both sides.

As a result of discussions, both sides have confirmed the main items described on the

attached sheet.

ATTACHMENT

1. Objective of the Project

The Objective of the Project is to improve educational access, quality, equity and efficiency of education in rural area in Ethiopia by strengthening educational television and radio recording studios.

2. Project sites

The sites requested by Ethiopian side are as follows; The location map is shown in ANNEX 1.

The Japanese side explained to the Ethiopian side the evaluation criteria for sites covered by the Project from the technical point of view. Both sides confirmed that the criteria as attached in ANNEX 2 would be used for the evaluation of the proposed sites. The Team will report the results of the evaluation to the Government of Japan. Both sides agreed that the Project site(s) to be implemented would be decided by the Government of Japan on the basis of the evaluation.

With respect to Makalle TV studio, the team after the field survey in Makalle from the 20th to the 22nd May 2003, proposed to exclude the studio from the Project because the Team found out that the necessary arrangement for the program production and broadcasting had not been finalized yet. The Ethiopian side requested the Team to include Makalle TV studio to the Project because the preparation work for the installation of equipment was completed, a letter of confirmation to rent the transmitters from Ethiopian Television was obtained, and remaining conditions would be fulfilled in due course. The Team agreed to convey the request made by Ethiopian side to the relevant authorities in Japan so as to include Makalle TV studio to the Project provided that the Ethiopian side could prepare the document as described in ANNEX 8 by the last day of the study (6th June 2003), which were necessary for implementation of the Project in Makalle and the suitability of studio condition to install the equipment could be justified.

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- 3. Responsible and Implementing Agency
- 3-1. The Responsible Agency is the Ministry of Education (MOE).
- 3-2. The Implementing Agency is the Educational Media Agency (EMA).
- 3-3. The organization chart of MOE is attached as ANNEX 3

4. Items requested by the Government of Ethiopia

After discussions with the Team, the items described in <u>ANNEX 4</u> were finally requested by the Ethiopian side. JICA will estimate in Japan the total cost for the Project to be implemented and will recommend the findings to the Government of Japan for approval.

5. Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

- 5-1. The Ethiopian side understands the Japan's Grant Aid Scheme explained by the Team, and as described in ANNEX 5.
- 5-2. The Ethiopian side will take the necessary measures, as described in ANNEX 6, for the smooth implementation of the Project, on condition that the Japan's Grant Aid is extended to the Project.
- 5-3. The Ethiopian side will provide counterpart financing to meet the undertakings as described in ANNEX 6.

6. Schedule of the Study

- 6-1. The consultants will proceed to further study in Ethiopia until 6th June 2003.
- 6-2. JICA will prepare the report in English in August 2003 and will send it to the Ethiopian side in September 2003.

7. Other Relevant Issues

7-1. Necessary Measures to be taken by the Ethiopian side

Both sides agreed that EMA and related education bureaus would take necessary measures as described in ANNEX 7 before the installation of equipment.

7-2. Customs Clearance

Both sides agreed that the Ethiopian side has all the responsibility of customs clearance of procured equipment and materials after unloaded at Djibouti. And Ethiopian side will secure the necessary budget for customs clearance immediately after the conclusion of the Exchange of Notes for the Project.




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Mekelle TV Recording Studio Equipment





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ANNEX 5 The Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

The Grant Aid Program provides a recipient country with non-reimbursable funds to procure the facilities, equipment and services (engineering services and transportation of the products, etc.) for economic and social development of the country under principles in accordance with the relevant laws and regulations of Japan. Grant Aid is not supplied through the donation of materials as such.

(1) Grant Aid Procedure

1) Japan's Grant Aid Program is executed through the following procedures.

Application (Request made by a recipient country)

Study (Basic Design Study conducted by JICA)

Appraisal & Approval (Appraisal by the Government of Japan and Approval

by Cabinet)

Determination of Implementation (The Notes exchanged between the Governments of

Japan and the recipient country)

2) Firstly, the application or request for a Grant Aid project submitted by a recipient country is examined by the Government of Japan (Ministry of Foreign Affairs) to determine whether or not it is eligible for Grant Aid. If the request is deemed appropriate, the Government of Japan assigns JICA to conduct a study on the request. If necessary, JICA send a Preliminary Study Mission to the recipient country to confirm the contents of the request.

Secondly, JICA conducts the study (Basic Design Study), using Japanese consulting firms.

Thirdly, the Government of Japan appraises the project to see whether or not it is suitable for Japan's Grant Aid Programme, based on the Basic Design Study report prepared by JICA, and the results are then submitted to the Cabinet for approval.

Fourthly, the project, once approved by the Cabinet, becomes official with the Exchange of Notes signed by the Governments of Japan and the recipient country.

Finally, for the implementation of the project, JICA assists the recipient country in such matters as preparing tenders, contracts and so on.

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(2) Basic Design Study

1) Contents of the Study

The aim of the Basic Design Study (hereinafter referred to as "the Study"), conducted by JICA on a requested project (hereinafter referred to as "the Project"), is to provide a basic document necessary for the appraisal of the Project by the Government of Japan. The contents of the Study are as follows:

- confirmation of the background, objectives and benefits of the Project and also institutional capacity of agencies concerned of the recipient country necessary for the Project's implementation;
- evaluation of the appropriateness of the Project to be implemented under the Grant Aid
 Scheme from the technical, social and economic points of view;
- c) confirmation of items agreed on by both parties concerning the basic concept of the Project;
- d) preparation of a basic design of the Project; and
- e) estimation of costs of the Project.

The contents of the original request are not necessarily approved in their initial form as the contents of the Grant Aid project. The Basic Design of the Project is confirmed considering the guidelines of Japan's Grant Aid Scheme.

The Government of Japan requests the Government of the recipient country to take whatever measures are necessary to ensure its self-reliance in the implementation of the Project. Such measures must be guaranteed even through they may fall outside of the jurisdiction of the organization in the recipient country actually implementing the Project. Therefore, the implementation of the Project is confirmed by all relevant organizations of the recipient country through the Minutes of Discussions.

2) Selection of Consultants

For the smooth implementation of the Study, JICA uses a consulting firm selected through its own procedure (competitive proposal). The selected firm participates in the Study and prepares for a report based upon the terms of reference set by JICA.

At the beginning of implementation after the Exchange of Notes, for the services of the Detailed Design and Construction Supervision of the Project, JICA recommends the same consulting firm which participated in the Study to the recipient country in order to maintain the technical consistency.

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(3) Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

1) Exchange of Notes (E/N)

Japan's Grant Aid is extended in accordance with the Notes exchanged by the two Governments concerned, in which the objectives of the project, period of execution, conditions and amount of the Grant Aid, etc., are confirmed.

2) "The period of the Grant" means the one fiscal year which the Cabinet approves the project for. Within the fiscal year, all procedure such as exchanging of the Notes, concluding contracts with consulting firms and contractors and final payment to them must be completed.

However, in case of delays in delivery, installation or construction due to unforeseen factors such as weather, the period of the Grant Aid can be further extended for a maximum of one fiscal year at most by mutual agreement between the two Governments.

3) Under the Grant, in principle, Japanese products and services including transport or those of the recipient country are to be purchased.

When the two Governments deem it necessary, the Grant Aid may be used for the purchase of the products or services of a third country.

However, the prime contractors, namely consulting, contracting and procurement firms, are limited to "Japanese nationals". (The term "Japanese nationals" means persons of Japanese nationality or Japanese corporations controlled by persons of Japanese nationality.)

4) Necessity of "Verification"

The Government of the recipient country or its designated authority will conclude contracts denominated in Japanese yen with Japanese nationals. Those contracts shall be verified by the Government of Japan. This "Verification" is deemed necessary to secure accountability to Japanese taxpayers.

- 5) Undertakings required from the Government of the recipient country
 - a) to secure land necessary for the sites of the Project and to clear, level and reclaim the land prior to commencement of the construction;
 - b) to provide facilities for distribution of electricity, water supply and drainage and other incidental facilities in and around the sites;
 - c) to ensure all expenses and prompt execution for unloading and customs clearance at

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ports of disembarkation in the recipient country and internal transportation therein of the products purchased under the Grant Aid;

- d) to exempt Japanese nationals from customs duties, internal taxes and other fiscal levies which may be imposed in the recipient country with respect to the supply of the products and services under the verified contracts;
- to accord Japanese nationals whose services may be required in connection with the supply of the products and services under the verified contracts such as facilities as may be necessary for their entry into the recipient country and stay therein for the performance of their work;

"Proper Use" 6)

The recipient country is required to operate and maintain the facilities constructed and equipment purchased under the Grant Aid properly and effectively and to assign the necessary staff for operation and maintenance as well as to bear all the expenses other than those covered by the Grant Aid.

7) "Re-export"

The products purchased under the Grant Aid shall not be re-exported from the recipient country.

8) Banking Arrangement (B/A)

- The Government of the recipient country or its designated authority should open an a) account in the name of the Government of the recipient country in a bank in Japan (hereinafter referred to as "the Bank"). The Government of Japan will execute the Grant Aid by making payments in Japanese yen to cover the obligations incurred by the Government of the recipient country or its designated authority under the verified contracts.
- The payments will be made when payment requests are presented by the Bank to the Government of Japan under an Authorization to Pay (A/P) issued by the Government of recipient country or its designated authority.

9) Authorization to Pay (A/P)

The Government of the recipient country should bear an advising commission of an Authorization to Pay and payment commissions to the Bank
