MINUTES OF DISCUSSIONS ON THE BASIC DESIGN STUDY ON THE PROJECT FOR REHABILITATION OF DILI PORT IN THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF TIMOR-LESTE

Based on the results of the Preparatory Study, the Government of Japan decided to conduct a Basic Design Study on the project for rehabilitation of Dili Port (hereinafter referred to as "the Project") and entrusted the study to the Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA").

JICA sent to the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste (hereinafter referred to as "Timor-Leste") the Basic Design Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team"), which is headed by Mr. Tsutomu Shimizu, Project Management Group III, Grant Aid Management Department, JICA, and is scheduled to stay in the country from February 29th, 2005 to March 28th, 2005.

The Team held discussions with the officials concerned of the Government of Timor-Leste and conducted a field survey at the study area.

As a result of discussions and field survey, both parties confirmed the main items described on the attached sheets. The Team will proceed to further works and prepare the Basic Design Study Report.

1. Objective of the Project

The objective of the Project is to recover safe and smooth operation of Dili Port through rehabilitation of the existing wharf.

2. Project site

The site of the Project is Dili Port located at Av. Portugal, Dili city, Timor-Leste.

3. Responsible and Implementing Agency

The Responsible and Implementing Agency is the Ministry of Transport, Communication and Public Works (hereinafter referred to as "MTCPW").

4. Items requested by the Government of Timor-Leste

After discussions with the Team, the following items were finally requested by the Government of Timor-Leste. The locations of requested items are shown in Annex-1. JICA will assess the appropriateness of the request and will recommend to the Government of Japan for approval. Both parties confirmed that the final components of the Project will be decided after further analysis in Japan.

- (1) Rehabilitation of the east part of the wharf (Block 1 and 2)
- (2) Rehabilitation of the center part of the wharf (Block 3 and 4)
- (3) Rehabilitation of the access road (Block 7)
- (4) Rehabilitation of the revetment of Block 1 and 2
- (5) Construction of the yard (Block 9)

5. Japan's Grant Aid Scheme

The Government of Timor-Leste understands the Japan's Grant Aid Scheme and the necessary measures to be taken by the Government of Timor-Leste as explained by the Team and described in Annex-I and Annex-II of the Minutes of Discussions signed by both parties on September 7th, 2005.

6. Schedule of the Study

- 6-1. The consultants will proceed to further studies in Timor-Leste until March 28th, 2005.
- 6-2. The Study consists of two phases; Phase I and II. In Phase I, JICA will prepare the draft report which includes a basic concept of the Project and its basic design. In Phase II, JICA will prepare the draft final report which includes the engineering design on the basis of the study results of Phase I. The final report will be completed by JICA through integration of the study results of both Phases I and II.
- 6-3. JICA will prepare the draft report in English and dispatch a mission to Timor-Leste to explain



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its contents around June 2005.

- 6-4. Based on the results of discussions of the draft report, JICA will proceed with further examination of the study results in Japan by July 2005.
- 6-5. JICA will prepare the draft final report in English and dispatch a mission to explain its contents around August 2005.


7. Other relevant issues

- 7-1. Based on the investigation on the foundation of the transshipment shed (Block 9), the Team pointed out that the reinforced concrete structures of this block are also damaged as same as next blocks. In response to that, the Government of Timor-Leste strongly requested to include the construction of the yard after demolishing the transshipment shed as an additional component of the Project. The both parties confirmed that the construction of the yard at the Block 9 will be decided based on the further analysis in Japan.
- 7-2. Regarding the above issue, the Government of Timor-Leste explained as follows;
 - (1) The Government of Timor-Leste has a plan to remove the existing transshipment shed and to utilize the space as a yard because the wharf in front of the transshipment shed is too narrow to operate equipment smoothly.
 - (2) The necessity of the existing transshipment shed is low because most of cargos are containers and the Port Authority owns three warehouses other than the transshipment shed.
- 7-3. The Government of Timor-Leste agreed to demolish the existing transshipment shed by its own expenses before the commencement of the rehabilitation work, if the construction of a yard at the Block 9 is included in the Project.
- 7-4. MTCPW shall prepare an Environmental Management Plan (EMP) and obtain the official approval of the rehabilitation work from the Ministry of Development and Environment before the signing of the Exchange of Notes.
- 7-5. The Government of Timor-Leste shall secure the site for disposal of waste before the commencement of the rehabilitation work.
- 7-6. The Government of Timor-Leste shall allocate the budget for its undertakings to be done in a timely manner.
- 7-7. The Government of Timor-Leste shall be responsible for the results of the execution of the Project on the basis of all documents and drawings prepared as a result of the study.
- 7-8. The Government of Timor-Leste requested counterpart training in Japan on Port Management under a technical cooperation by JICA.


Other Relevant Issues
