## 10.3.5 Supporting Projects for Strategy 5: Regional Development for Poverty Reduction

The Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam (CLV) and Japan summit was held in Vientiane on 30 November 2004. At the summit, the CLV Prime Ministers reiterated the initiatives and decisions taken at the meetings to establish the CLV Development Triangle with a view to accelerating economic growth, poverty reduction, social and cultural progress in the area of the Triangle on the basis of making full use of their respective countries' potentials and complementary advantages.




 Figure 10.3.12

Based on this policy, supporting roads in the CLV Development Triangle, as shown in **Figure 10.3.12**, shall be improved to assist in the reduction of poverty.

## 10.4 Comparison with Existing MPWT's Road Master Plan in 2005




Figure 10.4.1 Existing Road Master Plan in 2005 by MPWT

In 2000, Cambodia had proposed the formulation of Road Network Master Development Plan in 2005 (MP2005) as shown in **Figure 10.4.1**. Some roads included in MP2005 and excluded in MP2020 are shown in **Table 10.4.1**. These roads were not adopted in MP2020 by following reasons, very little traffic volume or alternative routes or crossing the reserved area or costly.
