VI PRIVATE SECTOR

VI-1 Summary of Private Sector

The private sector contributes 90 percent of employment in Cambodia. The agricultural sector has the largest share, 70 percent of total employment, followed by the service sector with 15 percent and the industrial sector with 8 percent. On the other hand, the agricultural sector accounts for only 35 percent of total GDP, while the service sector and the industrial sector account for 35 percent and 20 percent, respectively.

In the industrial sector, the number of small companies with less than 50 employees is about 27,000, while that of medium and large enterprises is about 300. As shown in Table VI-1 below, 80 percent

of small companies are related to food, beverages and tobacco. On the contrary, 80 percent of large companies are operating in the textile and apparel industries.

VI-2 Issues on Business in Cambodia

Through a series of interviews with private companies operating in Cambodia, the JICA Study Team identified several problems in doing business in Cambodia that are typically pointed out by those companies. Some of these problems and the government countermeasures and improvement are shown in Table VI-2.

VII LIVING ENVIRONMENT FOR EXPATRIATES

VII-1 Housing

In Phnom Penh City, there are more than ten five-star and four-star hotels and serviced apartments, together with many tree-star hotels, which are widely used by business persons and tourists. Some indication of prices are shown in Table VII-1 and Table VII-2 below (prices are for reference only.).

VII-2 Medical Services

Although available medical services are still limited for expatriates, International SOS and Raffles Medical Center in Phnom Penh City are widely used by them.

VII-3 Education

There are about ten international schools in Phnom Penh. Most of them are English-language school and offer curriculums to students from grades 1 to 12. The school fees of some of the international schools are shown in Table VII-3 to Table VII-5 below.

VII-4 Security

Japan's MOFA's latest security information issued on February 2006 cautions that robberies and pickpockets have been reported in Phnom Penh City. Regarding mines buried during the civil war era, urban areas and majority of the rural land have already been cleared but in some northwest provinces, such as Battambang and Banteay Meanchey, some mines still remain. The sites of Special Economic Zones are reportedly cleared of mines before their operations start.
