

JICA Study Team explained about the selection of the pilot project.


The counterparts understood that National Trunk Road No. 7 was selected as the candidate for the pilot project.

Appendix 1:The contents of the Discussion**1. Selection of the pilot project**

The JICA Study Team has explained the Burundian counterpart about candidate sites for the pilot project.

The Burundian counterpart has agreed with the JICA Study Team on the selection of a site for the pilot project; National Trunk Road No. 7 (NR7).

The Burundian counterpart asked the JICA Study Team that the traffic jams will not be improved without road width widening of NR7.

The JICA Study Team replied that the road widening should not be implemented as pilot project because of the prevention of lands acquisition or house compensation. The traffic jams along NR7 would be partially improved with the installation of some bus stops.

Mr. Vital and Mr. Didas explained their counterparts the content of the emergency study for Urban Transport in Bujumbura and the role of a pilot project in the so-called study.

2. Exemption of taxes, charges for the pilot project.

Mr. Vital said that he would ask the Ministry of Finance to consider and take action for exemption as soon as JICA study Team gives the list of equipment and construction material to be exempted.

3. Others

Mr. Vital requested to take into account the rehabilitation of the central business area roads, if there is remainder in the budget.

The steering committee meeting will be held on 5th April for the discussion and getting the approval by the steering committee members.

Appendix 1.The contents of the Discussion

The content of discussion will be presented, checked and approved by the steering committee during the meeting which will be held on 5th April.

a) Progress of the Study

The Steering Committee members has no comment on the progress of the Study

b) Pilot project

The JICA Study Team has explained about the selected site for the pilot project to the Steering Committee members.

The Steering Committee members have approved the selection of NR7 by the JICA Study Team as the pilot project.

The General Manager of OTRACO advised that it is better to extend the rehabilitated area up to after the parking space at the filling station, because there is still bad road condition after filling station. Mr. John, who is the technical advisor of Road Department, has the same opinion.

The JICA Study Team replied that the road length for the rehabilitation would be determined by the detailed design.

The OTRACO General Manager asked the JICA Study Team the countermeasures of the bus terminal/parking space located at the filling station.

The JICA Study Team replied that the parking space would be paved due to keep the roadside pavement condition and because of the prevention of the deterioration at the road side edges by the private buses.

The OTRACO general manager asked the question of knowing who will be in charge of construction material; the client or the contractor. He also said the contractor in its offer would suggest a relatively high price for the construction material and it would be better to check if the proposed price is reasonable. He recommended to the JICA Study Team to discuss with the members of the steering committee in order to establish the tender document.

The JICA Study Team replied that the construction material would be procured by the contractor and that it would discuss with the steering committee members and counterparts during the preparation of a tender document in order to determine the construction material to be acquired.

Mr. Didas advised that improvement of storm water drainage would be necessary.

The JICA Study Team explained that the rehabilitation of port area roads and other required rehabilitation projects with appropriated required improvement of storm water drainage network would be proposed in the master plan.

The Steering Committee members and JICA Study Team agreed on what they will collaborate during the implementation of a detailed design and the preparation of a tender document.

c) Population of Bujumbura City and Future Development

The JICA Study Team explained the Steering Committee members that it would be better to converge, to include the population of Kanynsa commune in Bujumbura City for a better distribution.

The OTRACO General Manager said he is in possession of a population datum according to which the population of Bujumbura was 600,000.

The JICA Study Team requested the Director to give the written proofs or evidences of that population. The population data owned by the JICA Study Team seem to be official and some other data not reliable.

Mr. John asked how to estimate the vehicles number based on the population of each commune.

The JICA Study Team explained that future traffic volume would be determined in consideration of vehicle registration number and the mode of transport, and others.

Main opinions and questions from participants were as follows:

- Regarding traffic safety, besides installation of safety facilities, regulations of traffic safety are important.
- Regarding road safety in Bujumbura, separation of traffic lanes among vehicles, bicycles and pedestrians is important.
- Thirteen accidents occurred in last year near Musaga I School where 2,500 students commute. The humps and pedestrian crosswalks are expected to reduce traffic accidents.



- The administrative office will hold a meeting with the local people on this project and order the owners of the illegal shops and container in the right of way to remove them in advance the commencement of construction works.
- District office will enlighten this project to the local people to get their cooperation in the construction works.
- The cooperation of Japanese side to the minimal requests from the local residence in the construction pried is expected for the success of this project.
- Q1: How to decide on the construction company, by tender?
A1: By JICA's system including tender.
- Q2: Are signs, street lamps and bus shelters included in this project?
A2: These facilities are not included in this project.
- Q3: How were the three installation points of side ditch caps selected? There were four official bus stops along the section in the past.
A3: According to site survey, the points where many buses are stopping were selected.
- Q4: Is bridge rehabilitation included in this project?
A4: Bank protection works to one river and one channel are included in this project.

Contents of discussions:

JICA study team explained the Interim Report of "THE EMERGENCY STUDY ON URBAN TRANSPORT IN BUJUMBURA CITY". The Main subjects are as follows:

1. Urban Transport in Bujumbura City
 - Extent of Interim Report
 - Road Network Condition
 - Traffic Count Survey Result
 - Public Transport Condition
 - Existing Problems
 - Urban Planning
 - Future Traffic Demand and Analysis
 - Social and Environmental Consideration
 - Urban Transport
2. Community-based Development
 - Results of Collected Data

Main opinions and questions from participants were as follows:

- Because the infrastructure in Bujumbura city is poor condition and developing now, installation of bus lanes may be difficult.
- The considerations of the economical capacity of Burundi and the present data analysis in Bujumbura are indispensable in the study.
- Burundian side requested more positive technical transfer on the study, especially in baseline survey methods.




- Burundian side requested continuous cooperation to implement the project in the Master Plan after the completion of the study.
- Q1: Is it possible to shift from private car users to public transportation users, any case of success?
A1: Public transportation systems have priority over private cars in some large cities in Asian countries.
- Q2: Is the economic analysis of each project included in the Master Plan?
A2: Depending on the economic analysis and present status, the immediately feasible projects and step-by-step projects will be considered in the Master Plan.
- Q3: How to manage the bicycle taxis in the future?
A3: The bicycle taxis will be reduced in the future. However, because the bicycle taxis are important local transportation mode, the Master Plan will include the bicycle taxis and suggest the traffic regulations for the bicycle taxis as countermeasures of the accidents.
- Q4: Is the future traffic demand considered the urban planning and future land use?
A4: The future traffic demand is based on the growth of population in each zone. Because the zoning is large scale, the detailed land use is not reflected in the future traffic demand.
- Q5: The private buses are the main transportation mode in Bujumbura city at the present day. Will OTRACO be able to have the enough capacity to serve the main transportation mode?
A5: The demarcation between OTRACO bus and private buses will be suggested in the Master Plan as an idea.
