The Managing Director, KWSB, welcomed the participants and requested to apprise him of the issues.

After briefings about issues and discussions, questions and cross questions on those issues, following decisions were made:

To avoid the confusion in understanding the clientele issue, it was explained as:

JICA is the client of JICA Study Team. The Consultants working in the Study Team are acting on behalf of JICA and JICA under inter-governmental arrangements is helping the citizens of Karachi through KWSB.

The JICA Team explained that Progress Report No. 2 was merely a progress report, not the final report. They would incorporate the comments, observations and reservations of all the members of Steering Committee including those of KWSB in the next report i.e. Interim Report to be submitted in July 2007.

Regarding the issues like the authenticity of 35% leakages, the Team leader was requested to name the study he had referred to as the supporting evidence. The Team Leader agreed to the point.

After listening to the detailed versions of both sides on the issue of not circulating the Progress Report No. 2, the Managing Director, KWSB, directed the Chief Engineer (Projects), KWSB / Secretary, Steering Committee, to circulate the Progress Report No. 2 along with the Minutes of Steering Committee, the questionnaires of KWSB and JICA Team's replies to them. He further asked to request the members of the Steering Committee to give their comments within 15 days.

The Managing Director, KWSB, enquired about the coordination and cooperation between JICA Study Team and the CDGK Master Plan Department. He emphasized that both the Master Plans (CDGK and JICA) should be aligned. Responding the concern of the Managing Director, KWSB, the Team Leader, JICA Study Team, informed the participants that initially they had some problems but now the things have been resolved and now coordination and cooperation with CDGK Master Plan Department is proceeding in the right direction with exchange of information.

Mr. Mahmood A Jilani, Dy. Notes of Meeting held on 01 March 2007 regarding Progress Report No.2, specifically related to water supply and institutional strengthening aspects.

Those present at meeting:

MD, DMD (Planning) & CE (Projects) of KW&SB

Mr Sawara, Mr Oga & Mr De Seta of JICA Study Team (JST)

- (01) KW&SB requested that 3 copies of future progress reports in draft form should be made available 2 weeks prior to steering committee meetings. It was agreed that the JICA Study Team (JST) would inform JICA of this request.
- (02) KW&SB handed over 2 questionnaire documents (Annex-A & Annex-B) detailing questions regarding Progress Report No.2 and Appendices. It was agreed that JST would provide a written response to the questions raised. No timescale was specified.
- (03) KW&SB suggested that JST considers KW&SB as the 'client', rather than JICA. JST agreed to inform JICA of the suggestion.
- (04) KW&SB requested that JST conduct a detailed study (by flow measurement) to determine accurate figures for leakage within the bulk supply system, water trunk mains, distribution and service mains. The agreed JICA scope for the project does not include this activity, however, JST agreed to inform JICA of the request.
- (05) KW&SB requested that 'unconstrained' water demand projections be forecast rather than taking the 1200 cusecs (stipulated in the K-IV study report) as the finite availability of water from the source by 2025. JST agreed to superimpose on the current demand projection graph 'unconstrained' water demand projections based on the per capita water demand of 54 gpcd which has been adopted by KW&SB in the planning of various projects in the past. Meanwhile, JST suggested that, for purposes of facility planning, it would not be prudent to project water availability beyond realistic capacity of the water sources, which is 1365 mgd as shown in the presentation slide no.33 (used by JST during the February 28, 2007 Steering Committee).
- (06) It was agreed by both parties that a separate study should be conducted to determine whether Kinjhar Lake has sufficient capacity to yield 2400 cusecs of silt-free water for abstraction for drinking water supply purposes. It was further agreed that the scope of the JICA masterplan should be confined to downstream of the Kinjhar Lake.
- (07) KW&SB requested that Figure 22.2.1 on page 2-10 should not indicate the siting of future filtration plants as the route of K-IV has yet to be agreed by KW&SB. JST understand that whilst various routes have been studied by the K-IV project, the siting of the filtration plants are common to all routes. JST would suggest therefore, that for purposes of facility planning, it would be sensible for JST to retain the current siting of the filtration plants.
- (08) Both parties agreed that DNI as detailed in the presentation slides no.37 and no.38 (used by JST during the February 28, 2007 Steering Committee) will be selected as the priority project which will be subjected to feasibility study during Phase 3 of the JICA study. However, KW&SB suggested that both parties should hold detailed discussions to determine the exact location of the DNI area when JST returns Karachi next time.
- (09) It was agreed that KW&SB would confirm to JST whether all the major housing development schemes have been included in Table 21.2.2 on page 2-3.

- (10) Both sides agreed that where it was technically and economically feasible, advantage of the natural topography (high ground/hillocks) would be used for the siting of reservoirs where this provides a net saving on pumping arrangements.
- \*(11) KW&SB have agreed the need for 3 hydraulic zones divided by the Malir and Lyari rivers and NOT town-wise distribution even where this means valving off or metering supplies where trunk mains cross from one zone to another; for example across the rivers.
- (12) KW&SB requested that JST provide more reform options especially related to governance and splitting of bulk and retail supplies. JST agreed to look at further governance options as a priority during the next input scheduled for late April 2007.

Notes of Meeting held on 02 March 2007 regarding Progress Report No.2, specifically related to the sewerage/drainage aspects.

- (01) KW&SB stressed the importance of ensuring that for existing as well as future schemes, sewage flowing into sewage treatment plants and industrial effluents are treated in accordance with Pakistan NEQS. JST confirmed that these standards had been adopted in the master plan.
- (02) KW&SB stressed the need to relate expected sewage generation with projected water demand figures and that 60% of water demand would be sewage generation. JST mentioned that it adopted the figure of 70% as the ratio of water consumption to sewage generation which was adopted in S-III document prepared by KW&SB.
  - In determining effluent volume projections, KW&SB were eager to ensure that JST included effluent volumes expected from the numerous agencies other than the Cantonments, DHA etc., mentioned in the progress report. JST replied that sewage generation from these agencies was estimated as 70% of water consumption.
- (03) KW&SB requested that JST give a separate breakdown of the non-domestic sewage. Currently, industrial or trade effluent is combined with commercial as this breakdown is not provided for water consumption projections. JST agreed to check whether this was included in the JST scope of work and if not included would pass on the request to JICA. JST have assumed that industries will comply with the EPA and pre-treat effluents prior to discharge into sewers.
- (04) KW&SB could not find reference to existing effluent quality of nallahs. JST stated that analysis results of nallah's were presented in Progress Report No.1.
- (05) KW&SB stated that S-III scheme was based on removing pollution load through interceptors from the two main rivers JST replied that the JICA Master Plan was prepared based on the same concept.
- (06) KW&SB suggested that if the report mentions areas where sewage was spilling into roads or open areas JST should identify these for priority projects in the master plan. JST replied that it was just guided to a few spots where sewage was discharged to open spaces. Since it is too difficult to identify these spots in the whole city, JST will delete the description.
- (07) KW&SB requested that the DNI took into account the need for improved sewerage/drainage services and infrastructure. JST agreed that this would be taken into account.

As agreed at the Steering Committee Meeting on 28 February 2007, meetings between the JICA Study Team and KW&SB took place on 01 March 2007 and 02 March 2007 to discuss and resolve issues raised by KW&SB regarding Progress Report No.2. 3	Both 35% leakage and 45% Non Revenue Water (NRW) quoted in the JST's report are not based on actual measurements. JST should be required to establish leakage and NRW accurately by conducting field measurements of water losses in the major components of the existing water supply system, such as bulk water supply system (canals, conduits, water filtration plants, reservoirs), water trunk mains, distribution pipes and service mains. These field measurements can be conducted without difficulties. Is it possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include such field measurements?	It is not possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include such field measurement. In the meantime, JICA understands that the current levels of leakage (35%) and NRW (45%) presented in the JST's report are shown for reference purposes only and they do not affect the formulation of future facility development plans. Under the circumstances (and as long as KW&SB feels uncomfortable with those percentages), JST is advised to show these levels only in a broad range (eg. leakage: 25-35%; NRW: 35-45%) in the report.
4	JST estimates the future per capita water demand by dividing the total capacity of water sources available for use by the number of future population in the city with the preoccupation that Karachi would be able to get only 1,200 cusecs of additional water from the Indus River by 2025. However, KW&SB is of the opinion that the future per capita water demand should be determined based on the actual needs of the citizens without being dictated by the capacity of water sources, and that the future water demand should be projected using such a per capita water demand. As a result of this water demand projection, Karachi may need more than 1,200 cusecs of additional water sources by 2025. In such a case, JST should conduct a study on the exploitability of the Haleji and Hadero Lakes as the potential water sources for Karachi.	JST is advised to show in the report both (a) unconstrained water demands which could possibly emerge if Karachi has water sources of an unlimited capacity to meet its water demand and (b) constrained water demands which could possibly emerge if Karachi can get only 1,200 cusecs of additional water from the Indus River by 2025 as referred to in the K-IV Study and the Strategic Master Plan of CDGK. JST is also advised to formulate future facility development plans in accordance with the stage-wise development plans proposed by the K-IV Study for bringing additional 1,200 cusecs of water from the Kinjhar Lake to Karachi by 2025. With respect to the development of the Haleji and Hadero Lakes as the water sources for Karachi, KW&SB is advised to provide the JST, if any, with the reports of previous studies that evaluated the exploitability of these lakes as the potential water sources for Karachi.

(5)	In Karachi, many industries are discharging their wastewaters into the public sewerage system or natural/man-made water courses without complying with the requirements of the "National Environmental Quality Standards for Municipal and Liquid Industrial Effluents (NEQS)". Under the circumstances, KW&SB is of the opinion that industrial wastewaters should be sorted into different groups based on the types of industries, mixed with domestic sewage for dilution and treated at "Combined Effluents Treatment Plants (CETP). This requires a study on the quality and quantity of wastewaters generated in Karachi. Is it possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include such a study?	The present scope of the JICA Study includes sewerage but does not include the management of industrial wastewaters. It is not possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include the management of industrial wastewaters. JICA understands that the existing NEQS in Pakistan requires industries to construct/operate their own wastewater treatment facilities to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in their wastewaters to certain acceptable levels before discharging them into the public sewerage system. In formulating the sewerage master plan therefore, the JST shall proceed on the basis that industrial discharges shall comply with the NEQS effluent standards in force prior to discharging into the KW&SB sewerage system. At the same time, it is recommended that KW&SB will increase the awareness of the general public, industries, legislators and the Sindh Environmental Protection Agency (SEPA) to ensure the enforcement of the NEQS.
6	JST explains that the present scope of the JICA Study does not include the formulation of a storm water drainage master plan. If it is the case, then why did JST investigate the conditions of existing storm water drainage facilities during the "Phase 1: Basic Study"? Is it possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include the formulation of a storm water drainage master plan?	The scope of the present JICA study does not include the formulation of a storm water drainage master plan. Neither does it include any feasibility study on storm water drainage projects. These have been agreed upon between the Pakistan side and JICA in a meeting held in Karachi on 13 July 2005. "Phase 1: Basic Study" of the JICA study included the investigation of existing storm water drainage facilities only because they are partly used for collection and conveyance of sewage in Karachi. It is not possible for JICA to expand the present scope of the JICA Study to include the formulation of a storm water drainage master plan.
