ตามข้อเสนอของรัฐบาลไทยที่มีต่อรัฐบาลญี่ปุ่นเรื่อง "โครงการศึกษาพัฒนาระบบสนับสนุนการ จัดการทรัพยากร ธรรมชาติและสิ่งแวดล้อมในระดับจังหวัด" (การศึกษา) ได้มีการดำเนินการเริ่มตั้งแต่ เดือนมิถุนายน 2550 การศึกษาดังกล่าวมีเป้าหมายที่จะเสริมสร้างประสิทธิภาพของรัฐบาล, ราชการส่วนภูมิภาค และราชการส่วนท้องถิ่น โดยผ่านการจัดทำแผนการจัดการคุณภาพสิ่งแวดล้อมในระดับจังหวัดในสองจังหวัด นำร่อง คือ จังหวัดพระนครศรีอยุธยาและสมุทรสงคราม

In response to the request of the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand (herematter referred to as "GOT"), Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA") dispatched a Preparatory Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team") handed by Mg. Kyoko Okubo from

Preparatory Study Team (terminater referred to as "the Team") handed by Mg. Kyoko Okubo from December 17 to December 28, 2006, to discuss and determine the Scope of Work (permanter referred to as "S/W") for Supporting System for Local Administrations on Natural Resources and Environmental Meagament in the Kingdom of Thatland (hereinafter referred to as "the Study").

During its stuy in Thailand, the Team vinited several sites and government agencies in relation to the Study, had a series of discussions on the druft S/W automitted by the Team with the authorities concerned, in permature with the Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (investmenter referred to as "MNRE"). The main issues of the discussions regarding the druft S/W are shown in this ministes.

#### L BACKGROUND

The Team made consultations with MNEE with regard to supporting system<sup>1</sup> for central and local administrations<sup>2</sup> on makene resources and environmental management through preparation of Provincial Environmental Quality Management Plan (hereinnites referred to as "the Provincial EQMP"). Main concerns of MNRE are as follows:

- I. Translation of the National EQMP into actions at local level meets to be undertaken.
- Control-suc-local administrations on management of natural resources and environment needs to be strongthened to respond emerging issues in more comprehensive manners.
- Linkage between control administrations and local administrations in the field of management of natural resources and cavironment needs to be strongthened.

#### IL TITLE OF THE STUDY

Both sides agreed that the title of the Study will be "Supporting System for Local Administrations on Natural Resources and Environmental Management in the Kingdom of Thailand".

#### III. SCOPE OF WORK (S/W)

The Team explained that the S/W, which stipulates the framework of the Study, will be prepared and signed by the representatives of the Office of Natural Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning (hereisafter referred to as "ONEP") of MNRE and IICA Thailand Office after notification of approval of implementation of the Study by IICA Headquarters. Both sides agreed that it is desirable that the S/W shall be signed as soon as possible after the signing of this Minutes of Meeting. Both sides also agreed on the provisional draft S/W shown as Appendix 1.

#### IV. TARGET YEAR

The Provincial EQMP shall cover a period from 2008 to 2011, in synchronous with National EOMP.

#### V. MODEL PROVINCE(S) FOR FORMULATING PROVINCIAL EOMP

The model province(s) for formulating provincial EQMP in the Study will be selected before the commencement of the Study. Japanese side requested That side to nominate a few candidate province(s) according to the following criteria, and both sides agreed to decide a model province (or two model provinces) as early as possible.

#### Selection Criteria

- The area where natural resources and environmental problems are/will be serious (to counced adverse impact on the unitual resources and environmental quality)
- 2) The area where comprehensive countermeasures are/will be needed
- 3) The area where provincial governor shows strong will for formulating provincial EQMP

Descript administrations refer to the ONEP. OFS, REO (Regional Environmental Office) and thesi administrations refer to PEO (Provincial Environmental Office), intuitionally subscribes (Tembers) and Sub-district Administrations (Cambridge).





Meeting of "System" is a series of rechanges such as Human Resource Development Plan, Management Plan of Information System, trainings, worselvon and sentings, guidelines or manuals.

#### VI. IMPLEMENTING ORGANIZATION OF THE STUDY

The implementing organizations of the Study is ONEP.

#### VII. IMPREMENTING ARRANGEMENT

Both sides agreed that for the successful implementation of the Study and effective usage of the Study results, Counterpart Team, Technical Working Committee for Provincial EQMP (provisional titte) and Steering Committee will be organized at the commencement of the Study. The functions and members will be proposed in the Appendix 2. With respect to the Technical Working, Committee, however, its formulation will be judged by the Provincial Governor in selected province(s).

#### VIII. CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT

The team and MNRE agreed the importance of espacity development of Counterpert Team. Both sides also agreed to make the maximum use of the opportunities for capacity development in the planning methods and skills in a course of the properation of Provincial EQMP. Further, it was agreed that the supporting runnials and others are necessary for the development of the capacity of central and local administrations in the Provincial EQMP formulation, implementation as well as mentioring and avaluation methods and skills have to be developed and be utilized through vegetathop on.

#### IX. COUNTERPART TRAINING IN JAPAN

The MNRE expressed their interest in availing of further counterpart training in Japan. The Team explained that their request might be considered.

#### X. EFFECTIVE USE OF THE STUDY RESULTS

The Team explained and the MNRE agreed that the results of the Snidy will be fully utilized by Thin aids.

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#### L INTRODUCTION

In response to the official request of the Coverament of the Kingdom of Theiland (hereinalies referred to as "the GOT"), the Government of Japan (leximaller inferred to as "the GOF") decided to conduct The Study on Supporting System for Local Administrations on Natural Resources and Environmental Management in Thisland (hereinafter referred to as "the Study") in accordance with the Agreement on Technical Cooperation between the GOJ and the GOT signed on November 5", 1981.

Accordingly, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (hereinafter referred to as "JICA"), the official agency responsible for the implementation of the technical cooperation programs of the OOI, will undertake the Study in close cooperation with the multicrities concerned of the GOT.

#### II, OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

Capacity of MNRE and local administrations in the field of natural resources and environmental management is strengthened through planning process of the Provincial Environmental Quality Management Plan (hereinafter referred to as "the Provincial EQMP") for model province(s).

#### III. STUDY AREA

The Study Area will cover the entire area of Thailand. The model site(s) for formulating Provincial EQMP will be selected before the communicament of the Study.

#### IV. SCOPE OF THE STUDY

In order to achieve the objectives mentioned above, the scope of the Study shall cover the following items:

#### Phase I Formulation of Provincial EQMP Taking into Account National EQMP

- 1-1 To make analysis on the relation between the environmental conditions and socio-economic conditions.
- 1-2 To identify and prioritize issues and meas that need countermeasures and examine various approaches to be employed for the countermeasures and propose framework for Provincial BOMP.
  1-3 To formulate programs and projects for implementation based on the above framework.
- 1-4 To finelize Provincial EQMP(s).

#### Phase 2 Development of supporting system for capacity development of central and local administrations regarding natural resources and environmental management

- 2-1 To summarine and analyze lessons learns through the formulation of Provincial EQMP regarding natural resources and unvironmental management.
- 2-2 To develop supporting manuals and others for Provincial EQMP planning based on the lessons mentioned above
- 2-3 To utilize supporting manuals and others mentioned in 2-2 for the capacity enhancement of contral and local administrations through workshop, training and so forth.
- 2-4 To recommend mechanisms that ensure effective and efficient linkages between MNRE and th REOs, PEOs and local administrations and relevant agencies busidus MNRE based on the basic analysis on the bordenecks observed in the Study.





#### V. SCHEDULE OF THE STUDY

The Study will be carried out in approximately sixteen (16) muonts from April 2007 with the tentative schedule is attached in the Appendix A. The schedule is subject to change upon agreement of both parties when any necessity prizes during implementation of the Study.

#### VL REPORTS

IICA shall propare and submit following reports in English to the GOT.

- Inception Report (hereinades referred to as "ICR"):
   Thirty (30) copies will be authorited at the beginning of the first work period. This report will contain the schedule and methodology of the Study. Summary of the IC/R will be prepared in Thai as well.
- 2. Interim Report (hereinefler referred to as "TI/R"): Thirty (30) copies will be submitted at the intermediate of the first work period. This report will contain outcomes of 1-1 and 1-2 in phase 1 of the Study. Interim version of the Provincial EQMP will be attached to the II/R and prepared in Thai as well.
- 3. Progress Report (hereinafter referred to as "PRVR"): Thirty (30) copies will be submitted at the end of first work period. This report will contain outcomes of 1-1 to 1-4 in phase 1 of the Study. Final version of the Provincial HQMP will be attached to the PRVR and prepared in Thai as well.
- 4. Draft Final Report (hereinafter referred to as "DF/R"): Thirty (30) copies will be submitted at the end of the second work period in Thailand. This report will contain outcomes of 2-1 to 2-4 in phase 2 of the Study. The MNRE shall setumit its consuments within one (1) month after the receipt of the Draft Final Report.

For the implementation of the Study, JICA shall take the following measures.



#### 1. INTRODUCTION

The JICA Study Team (the Team) has submitted the following number of copies of the Inception Report (IC/R) to the Office of Natural Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning (ONEP), Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MNRE).

Consequently a series of meetings was held from 7th to 14th June 2007 in Thailand to discuss the report submitted. A list of officials attending the above meetings is given in Appendix 1.

#### 2. ISSUES AND DECISIONS

2.1 Various issues were discussed and clarifications on the IC/R were made as shown in Appendix 2. Subsequently appropriate consensus on the major items of the IC/R including the objectives, the study organization and others was reached during the meetings. These issues, clarifications and consensus are outlined as follows.

#### 2.2 Objectives of the Study

In order to reflect the Scope of Work agreed upon between MNRE and JICA on 15th May 2007, the MNRE requested to change the term "Local EQMP" into "Provincial EQMP (PEQMP)" and modify the objectives of the Study as follows:

"The study aims to strengthen capacities of central government and local administrations responsible for natural resources and environmental management as well as the linkage between the twos through the formulation of the Provincial Environmental Quality Management Plan (PEQMP) taken into account National Environmental Quality Management Plan 2007 – 2011".

The Team accepted the request,

#### 2.3 Schedule of the Study

The MNRE requested the Team to extend the Phase 1 of the Study to March and submit the Progress Report (P/R) in March due to the following reasons:

- Since the new fiscal year budget preparation work will start from April, the PEQMP to be drafted in December 2007 will be able to be revised reflecting what learnt by training in Japan in order to incorporate some actions or projects in the drafted PEQMP into the budget formulation of the new fiscal year.
- The key issues of the PEQMP shall be integrated into the Provincial Strategic Development Plan (PSDP) to be formulated after the new government be established, most probably in January 2008. Therefore the reflection of PEQMP in PSDP will be reported in the P/R.

The MNRE announced they had decided to ask all 75 Provinces in Thailand to review and resubmit their PEQMPs for KPI (Key Performance Indicator for evaluation of administrative performance) in this fiscal year (October 2007-September 2008). For the review of PEQMP for KPI, the MNRE has allocated a budget for all 75 Provinces and intends to distribute the manual for the formulation of PEQMP (Revision of PEQMP for KPI) to be prepared by the Study to all Provinces. To disseminate the contents of the manual, it is necessary to train more than 200 trainees, i.e. PEO staff of 75 Provinces, staff of 16 Regional Environmental Offices and other relevant personnel.

The MNRE will hold workshops inviting responsible personnel of PEQMP for KPI in all 75 Provinces of its own expense. Since it is necessary for MNRE to conduct a number of training workshops for more than 200 trainees, it is necessary to train lecturers (trainers) for the workshops. The MNRE requested the Team to provide a trainer's training program in the Study including their materials.

#### The Meeting Suggestions:

#### 1. To use GIS on information analysis.

GIS Database will be an important part in planning the Provincial Natural Resources and Environmental Management, but it is a very expensive investment, and one must have personnel with knowledge and ability to operate the system. Moreover, the information must be up to date. The Committee suggested finding the main sector with potential (budget and personnel) to supervise and use the system, such as Orborjor or LAs which use GIS to collect tax, and then related sectors can connect to the system, especially, PEO and REO.

#### To formulate the Provincial Natural Resources and Environmental Management Plan: The Committee suggestions are to:

- 2.1 Consider Area-based planning, including integrating the approach to solve problems in nearby provinces, such as water pollution which effects the provinces from upstream to downstream. (At present, there is a Watershed Committee for 25 watersheds in order to consider the case of water management)
- 2.2 Consider details of Provincial development plan and Local plan, because the Provincial development plan and Local plan reflected requirements and targets that the Province wants in the future (depends on timing of each plan) which is a benefit in order to determine appropriate measures, and cover the present and future. However, one should consider the timing of each plan because of differences such as Provincial plan: 4 years, Local plan: 3 years.
- 2.3 Consider selecting important Local Administrations and solving the problem. In addition, make projects that conform to problems and the area.
- 2.4 Consider issue of enforcing the law and pollution monitoring in the plan.
- 2.5 Consider giving advice on ways to control using the benefits from a water resource such as requiring water pollution tax, or using other economic instruments.

#### Mechanism to Accelerate Provincial Natural Resources and Environment Plan into action.

- 3.1 Management of the natural resources and environment requires many sectors to perform the task together. There are limitations on cooperation between each sector. The Committee suggested the Consultant to analyze main sectors, such as PEO, REO, ONEP and sectors in MNRE, and propose efficiency mechanism for management compare to Japanese experience.
- 3.2 The Committee asked the Consultant to suggest a method/mechanism to urge Local Administration to give importance and invest in environmental management, because the Local Administrations control their budget but don't use it for natural resources and environmental management in the area.

#### 4. Training

The Committee agreed with the Consultant to make Training of Trainers.

# Making the Provincial Natural Resources and Environment Plan Instruction Book The Committee asked the Consultant to specify important methods and activities in detail in

the Instruction Book (Manual) on making the Plan, such as what kind of information is necessary when compiling information.

#### 6. Details in the Progress Report

The Committee asked the consultant to revise the language in the English version of the Progress Report. The Chairman asked the Committee to consider details in the Progress Report, if there are any comments or further editing, send them to the Secretary Section by January 25<sup>th</sup>, 2008.

#### I. INTRODUCTION

The JICA Study Team (hereinafter referred to as "the Team") has submitted the following number of copies of the Draft Final Report (hereinafter referred to as "DF/R") to the Office of Natural Resources and Environmental Policy and Planning (hereinafter referred to as "ONEP"), Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (hereinafter referred to as "MNRE").

Consequently a series of meetings were held from 9th to 10th July 2008 in Bangkok to discuss the report submitted. The Steering Committee (hereinafter referred to as "St/C") meeting was held on 14th July 2008. A list of officials attending the St/C is given in Appendix 1.

Following the explanation of the DF/R given by the JICA Study Team, various issues were discussed and clarifications on the DF/R were made. Subsequently appropriate consensus was reached on the major items of the DF/R including the conclusions and recommendations of the Study and other items in the St/C meeting.

#### 2. ISSUES AND DECISIONS

The issues, clarifications and consensus on the St/C meeting are outlined as follows.

#### 2.1 Issues on Administrative Capacities relating to NREM

The St/C acknowledged the following issues exist in administrative capacities of organizations and agencies relating to Natural Resources and Environmental Management (NREM) in Central Administration (CA), Provincial Administration (PA) and Local Administration (LA):

NREM in Thailand is well established within their central administration structure.
However, it is insufficiently established at the Local Administration level, although it is
the LAs that hold the jurisdiction over NREM aspects that directly affect the resident's
daily lives, such as solid waste management and wastewater management.

- The LAs in Thailand are about a tenth, in both size and population, to comparative
  administrative organization in Japan. Many NREM issues that have been devolved as
  responsibilities of LAs, simply can not be properly managed by a single LA in Thailand
  or even a few LAs working together, in terms of area and budget that must be
  considered. Thus Provincial-level solutions must be considered for some NREM issues.
- At the provincial level in Thailand, however, exist three tiers of administration, consisting of agencies of central administration organizations, PA (Changwat) and LAs (Orborjor, Tessaban, Orbortor). The Orborjor which holds jurisdiction over provincial-wide NREM is the least qualified in terms of technical expertise or human resources. Currently, Orborjor plays a minimal part in NREM.
- Therefore, the strengthening the administrative capacity of Orborjor on NREM is the crucial in concordance with supporting plan proposed in the DF/R.

# 2.2 Recommendations made by the Study Team on improvement of administrative capacities relating to NREM

The St/C acknowledged the following recommendations made by the Study Team:

- Further strengthening of LA support, through REO and PEO, is recommended for ONEP/MNRE. The regional support capacities of REO should be strengthened. The PA/LA Central Support Center for NREM (in ONEP/MNRE) will function as a window organization to direct inquiries and requests that cannot be dealt by REO. MNRE should also raise awareness among chiefs of relevant LAs, especially Orborjor, of the importance of proper NREM in areas such as solid waste management, hazardous waste managen.ent and wastewater treatment.
- The Provincial Office in the PA (Changwat) in cooperation with MNRE/REO/PEO should lead efforts to strengthen the NREM capacities of Orborjor by strongly working towards the establishment of an Environmental Division in Orborjor. Then, a NREM supporting team will be established within the PA (Changwat) to support the new Environmental Division of Orborjor.
- The REO should, with support from MNRE, strengthen its GIS Database Center's capacity to provide information and conduct public relations activities, and organize itself as a supporting agency that provides technical expertise and information for the improvement of NREM in PA (Changwat) and LA.
- The success of provincial-level NREM relies on the successful raising of awareness in each LA, especially the awareness of the chiefs of Orborjor and major Tessaban, about the necessity of improvement to the current situation of NREM in their local administration and the need to allocate sufficient staff and budget towards NREM. As most LAs in Thailand currently do not have an established NREM structure, an attempt at rapid and widespread establishment is probably unrealistic. Instead, a concerted supporting effort toward a few target provinces/ Orborjor, whose chiefs are open to the idea of improvement of NREM, is recommended. The improvement in Orborjor across Thailand should be attempted on the basis of established improvement records through such targeted efforts.

#### 2.3 Request for the further assistance from Japanese Government

The St/C requested further assistance from Japanese Government for implementing the recommendations described above in order to strengthen current weak local NREM capacities in Thailand. Including the study on the incentive measure for LAs to concern more about NREM is necessary. The St/C also emphasis on improving NREM GIS database at regional and local level as well as raising public awareness.

The Study Team replied that the Team would convey the request to JICA headquarters.

#### 2.4 Comments on the DF/R

According to the Study Team's Recommendation, the St/C request the Study Team to clarified the roles of each relevant organizations, for example the role of Provincial governor, LA (Orborjor, Tessaban, Orbortor), PEO and REO.

The Study Team requested the St/C that all comments by the Thai side to the DF/R should be given to ONEP by July 31, 2008 if they are to be considered by the Team for the preparation of the Final Report.

The St/C approved the request,

#### 3. CONCLUSION

3.1 Following the intensive and technical discussions held among participants, the DF/R was fully approved by the St/C.
