The purpose of the Study was to develop the implementation plan and framework for the Project aiming at the promotion of social participation of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs).

The Team exchanged views, had series of discussions and consultations with authorities concerned of Government of Pakistan (GOP).

As a result of the discussions, both sides agreed to report to their respective Governments the matters discussed in the attached documents.

#### 1 Introduction

#### 1.1 Background

The National Plan of Action (NPA), 2006 was developed for the implementation of approved National Policy for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). The overall vision of the National Policy for PWDs is to provide an enabling environment that would allow full realization of the potentials of PWDs through their integration into mainstream society. However, most of PWDs don't have access, lack inclusion and equal opportunities of participation in social activities.

Federal Government of Pakistan requested JICA for its Technical Cooperation Project assistance for the implementation of NPA in August 2006. In response to this official request, JICA constituted and dispatched a Project Formulation Study Team, from May 2007 to June 2007, to Pakistan. The Team was mandated to: a) identify possible areas of support in line with the GOP priorities, national policies, and international commitments; and b) propose a strategic framework for JICA's long term potential support for PWDs in Pakistan. For this purpose a series of meetings and discussions took place between Federal, Provincial (NWFP), District (Abbottabad) Government and concerned NGOs with visible participation from PWDs. The results of the study and discussions clearly indicated and brought in the spot light the importance of promotion of social participation of PWDs; and District Abbottabad¹ was identified as the Project target area. Since the focus of the project was shifted to District Abbottabad, therefore, it necessitated the submission of official request from District Abbottabad, which was received by JICA through Economic Affairs Division on 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2007.

This process also indicated that the non-participation/lack of participation of PWDs in social activities also hinders the implementation of other key areas of NPA, such as provision of medical treatment, education, vocational training, and employment opportunities to PWDs. Clearly, there is need for such approaches that not only focus on providing more quality services, but should also aim at promoting social participation of PWDs, which would eventually improve their overall situation.

With this background and process in place, JICA Pakistan office invited an expert, Mr. Naoto Ikeda from May 2008 to Sep 2008, to undertake preparatory study in District Abbottabad. The study focused on understanding three aspects relating to the project, i.e., 1) situation analysis of PWDs; 2) social inclusion of PWDs in society; and 3) status of female PWDs in District Abbotabad. This was followed by series of discussions between Federal, Provincial, District Governments and JICA on the planning, activities, formulation of Project Design Matrix in line with the results of the preparatory study including pilot survey.

#### 1.2 Objective of the study

The objectives of the preparatory study are summarized below:

- To confirm the needs of PWDs and relevance of the project
- To confirm the objective / goal of the project
- To agree with the Pakistani side on the framework of the project
- To agree on Project Design Matrix (PDM) and Plan of Operation (PO)
- To confirm the necessary procedure to be followed by both Japanese and Pakistani sides before the launching of the Project

#### 2 Framework of the project

#### 2.1 Project Title

Both parties agreed that the project title shall be changed and referred to as "Promotion of Social Participation of Persons with Disabilities".

#### 2.2 Implementing Organization

The implementing organization of the Project is Department of Social Welfare and Community Development, District Abbottabad.

#### 2.3 Key Project Partners

#### 2.3.1 GOP

Since the project aims at facilitating the implementation of NPA, therefore, it is pertinent to have a coordinated arrangement, linkages, and participation from all four key project partners, i.e.,

- a) Directorate General of Special Education, Ministry of Social Welfare and Special Education
- b) Secretary, Zakat, Ushar, Social Welfare & Women Development Department, NWFP
- c) District Coordination Office, District Abbottabad
- d) Department of Social Welfare and Community Development, District Abbottabad

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#### 2.3.2 NGOs

The NGOs working in the fields of disabilities including visually impaired, hearing impaired, physically handicapped, mentally retarded and multiple disabled will be taken on board as project partners. The actual project partners from among the NGOs will be identified through mutual consultation and agreement between JICA and GOP project partners.

#### 2.3.3 PWDs

The PWDs and their family members who have already participated in the preparatory study including pilot survey will be encouraged to represent PWDs as project partners. In addition to this, the Project will be open to provide membership to other PWDs and their family members.

#### 2.4 Project location

#### 2.4.1 Targeted District

The Project location is District Abbottabad, NWFP. However, the project activities will not be limited to District Abbottabad.

#### 2.4.2 Targeted Union Councils

Population including disabled and non-disabled people living in twelve selected Union Councils<sup>2</sup> (UCs) in District Abbottabad as follows;

Abbottabad city Banda Pir Khan Dhamtour Jhangi Kathwal Kehal Kakul Malikpura Mirpur Nawanshaher Salhad Shekhrbandi

#### 2.5 Duration

The duration of the Project will be Three (3) years, which will start with the placement of long-term experts in District Abbottabad.

#### 2.6 Concept of the Project

The basic concept of the Project is to promote social participation of PWDs through their empowerment and inclusion in all walks of life. For this purpose, the Project will focus on following key areas:

Empowerment: This will include training of PWDs, so as to equip them with leadership skills and

facilitate them in formation of Disabled Peoples Organizations (DPO), Self Help Organizations (SHO) and Family Association of PWDs

Inclusion:

This will aim at building an interface between disabled and non-disabled people through awareness raising, information dissemination and experience sharing.

Network:

This will consist of Federal Government, Provincial Government (NWFP), District Government (Abbottabad); select number of NGOs; and PWDs & their families with a mandate to manage, coordinate and monitor the implementation of the Project. In addition to this, the Federal and Provincial government partners of the network will have the responsibilities of sharing the Project experience with other districts, provincial and federal relevant ministries, departments and NGOs. It is also anticipated that, after the Project, the network members will make efforts to replicate the Project experience in other districts and provinces.

#### 2.7 Project Design

The project design consists of: a) project concept illustration, b) Project Design Matrix (PDM), c) Plan of Operation (PO); attached as ANNEX 2, 3 and 4.

#### 2.8 Project Organization

#### 2.8.1 Implementation and management [Counterpart, Experts and PST]

The implementation of project including PDM and PO will be primarily the responsibility of counterpart to be assigned by the Social Welfare Department (SWD) of District Abbottabad with technical advice and corporation of JICA long-term experts. In order to ensure a coordinated and well represented frame work for the management of project, the counterpart and JICA experts will constitute a Project Steering Team (PST) having members from district based and disability-related government institutions, NGOs, PWDs and their families. Please also refer to ANNEX 5.

#### 2.8.2 Coordination and Networking [JCC]

For this purpose, Joint Coordinating Committee (JCC) will bear the responsibility for the coordination and networking between project partners around the Project objectives and activities. The specific mandate of JCC is as follows;

- To endorse annual work plans to be developed and submitted by PST as per the details specified in Record of Discussions (R/D).
- To review and discuss the major issues and agree on their solutions aiming at smooth implementation of the Project.
- To share the Project experience with other related organizations in other districts and provinces.

#### 2.8.3 Internal Monitoring and Evaluation [NPA-WG]

The internal monitoring and evaluation of the Project will be carried out by NPA Working Group (NPA-WG) on quarterly basis. For details on members, please refer to ANNEX 7.

#### 2.9 Inputs

The Project inputs have been broadly categorized as Human resources, Physical resources, financial resources including description of other related expense. Please refer to ANNEX 8 for specific details.

#### 3. Others

#### 3.1 Record of Discussions

The details of the undertakings by both parties have been discussed and agreed in "Record of Discussions", shown in ANNEX 9

#### 3.2 Gender Mainstreaming

Department of Social Welfare, Special Education and Women Development, District Abbottabad will make efforts for gender mainstreaming such as more participation of female PWDs in line with PDM and PO.



#### I. COOPERATION BETWEEN JICA AND DSW

- 1. GOP will implement the Project on Promotion of Social Participation of Persons With Disabilities (hereinafter referred to as "the Project") in cooperation with JICA.

JICA will receive the Pakistan personnel connected with the Project for technical training in other countries including Japan.

#### III. MEASURES TO BE TAKEN BY GOP

- 1. GOP will take necessary measures to ensure that the self-reliant operation of the Project will be sustained during and after the period of Japanese technical cooperation, through full and active involvement in the Project by all related authorities, beneficiary groups and institutions.
- 2. GOP will ensure that the technologies and knowledge acquired by the Pakistan nationals as a result of Japanese technical cooperation will contribute to the economic and social development of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan.
- 3. GOP will grant in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan privileges, exemptions and benefits to the Japanese experts referred to in II-1 above and their families, which are no less favorable than those accorded to experts of third countries working in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan under the Colombo Plan Technical Cooperation Scheme.
- 4. GOP will ensure that the Equipment referred to in II-2 above will be utilized effectively for the implementation of the Project in consultation with the Japanese experts referred to in Annex II.
- 5. In accordance with the laws and regulations in force in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, GOP will take necessary measures to provide at its own expense:
  - (1) Services of the Pakistan counterpart personnel and administrative personnel as listed in Annex IV;
  - (2) Land, buildings and facilities as listed in Annex V; and
  - (3) Supply or replacement of machinery, equipment, instruments, tools, spare parts and any other materials necessary for the implementation of the Project other than the Equipment provided by JICA under II-2 above;

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- In accordance with the laws and regulations in force in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, GOP will take necessary measures to meet:
  - Expenses necessary for transportation of the Equipment referred to in II-2 above (1)within the Islamic Republic of Pakistan as well as for the installation, operation and maintenance thereof;
  - (2) Customs duties, internal taxes and any other charges on the Equipment referred to in II-2 above, imposed in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan; and
  - (3) Running local expenses necessary for the implementation of the Project.

#### ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROJECT IV.

- Director (NR), DGSE, as the Project Chief Coordinator, will ensure smooth 0. implementation of the Project and its replication after the successful completion of the Project in other provinces.
