# RECORD OF DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN JAPAN INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AGENCY AND

# THE AUTHORITIES CONCERNED OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF PAKISTAN ON THE JAPANESE TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROJECT ON THE PROMOTION OF SOCIAL PARTICIPATION OF PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

Japan International Cooperation Agency (to be referred as "JICA" in the following text) exchanged views and had a series of discussions with authorities concerned of Government of Pakistan, with respect to desirable measures to be taken by JICA and GOP for the successful implementation of the Project on the Promotion of Social Participation of Persons with Disabilities.

As a result of the discussions, JICA and authorities concerned agreed to recommend to their respective Governments the matters referred to in the document attached hereto.

#### THE ATTACHED DOCUMENT

#### I. COOPERATION BETWEEN JICA AND GOP

- 1. GOP will implement the Project on Promotion of Social Participation of Persons With Disabilities (hereinafter referred to as "the Project") in cooperation with JICA.
- 2. The Project will be implemented in accordance with the MASTER PLAN, which is given in Annex I.

#### II. MEASURES TO BE TAKEN BY JICA

In accordance with the laws and regulations in force in Japan, JICA will take, at its own expense, the following measures according to the normal procedures under the Colombo Plan Technical Cooperation Scheme.

#### 1. DISPATCH OF JAPANESE AND OTHER COUNTRY'S EXPERTS

JICA will provide the services of the Japanese and other country's experts as listed in Annex II.

#### 2. PROVISION OF MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT

JICA will provide such machinery, equipment and other materials (hereinafter referred to as "the Equipment") necessary for the implementation of the Project as listed in Annex III. The Equipment will become the property of GOP, upon being delivered C.I.F. (cost, insurance and freight) to the Pakistan authorities concerned at the ports and/or airports of disembarkation.

## 3. TRAINING OF PAKISTAN PERSONNEL IN OTHER COUNTRIES INCLUDING JAPAN

JICA will receive the Pakistan personnel connected with the Project for technical training in other countries including Japan.

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#### III. MEASURES TO BE TAKEN BY GOP

- 1. GOP will take necessary measures to ensure that the self-reliant operation of the Project will be sustained during and after the period of Japanese technical cooperation, through full and active involvement in the Project by all related authorities, beneficiary groups and institutions.
- 2. GOP will ensure that the technologies and knowledge acquired by the Pakistan nationals as a result of Japanese technical cooperation will contribute to the economic and social development of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan.
- 3. GOP will grant in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan privileges, exemptions and benefits to the Japanese experts referred to in II-1 above and their families, which are no less favorable than those accorded to experts of third countries working in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan under the Colombo Plan Technical Cooperation Scheme.
- 4. GOP will ensure that the Equipment referred to in II-2 above will be utilized effectively for the implementation of the Project in consultation with the Japanese experts referred to in Annex II.
- 5. In accordance with the laws and regulations in force in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, GOP will take necessary measures to provide at its own expense:
  - (1) Services of the Pakistan counterpart personnel and administrative personnel as listed in Annex IV;
  - (2) Land, buildings and facilities as listed in Annex V; and
  - (3) Supply or replacement of machinery, equipment, instruments, tools, spare parts and any other materials necessary for the implementation of the Project other than the Equipment provided by JICA under II-2 above;

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- 6. In accordance with the laws and regulations in force in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, GOP will take necessary measures to meet:
  - (1) Expenses necessary for transportation of the Equipment referred to in II-2 above within the Islamic Republic of Pakistan as well as for the installation, operation and maintenance thereof;
  - (2) Customs duties, internal taxes and any other charges on the Equipment referred to in II-2 above, imposed in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan; and
  - (3) Running local expenses necessary for the implementation of the Project.

#### IV. ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROJECT

- 0. Director (NR), DGSE, as the Project Chief Coordinator, will ensure smooth implementation of the Project and its replication after the successful completion of the Project in other provinces.
- 1. District Coordination Officer, District Abbottabad, as the Project Director, will bear overall responsibility for the administration and implementation of the Project.
- 2. District Officer, Department of Social Welfare and Community Development, District Abbottabad, as the Project Manager, will be responsible for the managerial and technical matters of the Project.
- 3. The Japanese experts will provide necessary recommendations and advice to the Project Director and the Project Manager on any matters pertaining to the implementation of the Project.
- 4. The Japanese experts will give necessary technical guidance and advice to the Pakistan counterpart personnel on technical matters pertaining to the implementation of the Project.
- 5. For the effective and successful implementation of technical cooperation for the Project, a Joint Coordinating Committee will be established whose functions and composition are described in Annex VI.

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#### V. JOINT EVALUATION

Evaluation of the Project will be conducted jointly by JICA and the Pakistan authorities concerned, at the middle and during the last six months of the cooperation term in order to examine the level of achievement.

#### VI. CLAIMS AGAINST JAPANESE EXPERTS

GOP undertakes to bear claims, if any arises, against the Japanese experts engaged in technical cooperation for the Project resulting from, occurring in the course of, or otherwise connected with the discharge of their official functions in the Islamic Republic of Pakistan except for those arising from the willful misconduct or gross negligence of the Japanese experts.

#### VII. MUTUAL CONSULTATION

There will be mutual consultation between JICA and GOP on any major issues arising from, or in connection with this Attached Document.

# VIII. MEASURES TO PROMOTE UNDERSTANDING OF AND SUPPORT FOR THE PROJECT

For the purpose of promoting support for the Project among the people of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, GOP will take appropriate measures to make the Project widely known to the people of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan.

#### IX. TERM OF COOPERATION

The duration of the technical cooperation for the Project under this Attached Document will be three years from dispatching the Japanese expert.
