- I was working as a doctor of the China-Japan Friendship Hospital at that time, and now active in teaching and research as a professor of dermatology in Peking University. (14th batch: China)
- I was working as a doctor of the STD control department in Yangon Hospital, and now teaching as a head of dermatology department in Univ. of Medicine I. (8th batch: Myanmar)
- I am still working in the NGO and provide trainings on community-based prevention approach of some skin diseases. In addition, seeing 7,000 patients per year in low income areas. (19th batch: Bangladesh)
- I holds two posts now; vice director of the National Institute of Dermatology and a head of dermatology dept at the medical college. (11th batch: Laos)
- After attending DCD, I worked as a head of technical guidance department of the National Institute of Dermato-Venereology. In addition obtained a Ph.D in dermatology. (11th batch: Vietnam)
- After attending DCD, I started the new department of leprosy and dermatology in the belonging medical institute. (11th batch: Philippines)
- Right after completing DCD, I was asked to start OPD in dermatology by the head of the department, and did so. (3rd batch: Sri Lanka)

In order to measure how much the Diploma Course has contributed in this regard, we would like to know your roles and activities in your country. Please describe your roles and activities as a dermatologist.

This question is included only in the questionnaire distributed in 2008, and some of the outstanding answers are seen below.

- After completing the course, I organized a workshop and started teaching student nurses at my work place. DCD indeed gave me ample opportunities to treat my patients who have serious skin diseases. (19th batch: Lao DPR)
- I am the chief of the dermatology section in the Provincial Health Department, and I use

my knowledge and skills that I gained from the course to lead the section to work accurately on dermatology. I try to apply the knowledge in a suitable manner to the situation in my country and especially in the Champasak province. (22nd batch: Lao DPR)

- I am a trainer of dermatology at the department of dermatology in IBNI Cina Emergency Hospital. I have taught postgraduate resident doctors, too. (22nd batch: Afganistan)
- I take a part in out-patient treatment in my institute. In addition, I work in the technical guidance department, which is responsible for supervising all the activities of provincial dermatology units in every province in Vietnam. In my field trips to provinces, I have been consulted about interesting cases. I could use the knowledge I gained from the course to give advices against those difficult cases. (24th batch: Vietnam)
- I work as a medical officer in dermatology under supervision of the only professor of dermatology in my country at the biggest child hospital in South Asia. We have daily outpatient clinics excluding Sundays and inpatient treatments. I treat all new and previously registered patients and discuss complex cases with professor. I do skin scrapings, grafting, biopsy, etc. I try to transfer my knowledge to others as much as possible to improve dermatological situations in my country. I plan to conduct classes, short term seminars etc, in this field in the future. (24th batch: Sri Lanka)
