3.3 The Results

There are 659 Heritage Buildings in SPFA. They are mostly in Old Salt Area. But a few buildings are out of that area*. So that we explain each case as below.

- a. The current situation of SPFA No. buildings (Only SPFA No.)
- b. The current situation of the buildings in Old Salt Area (SPFA No. and New Discovery No.)
- c. The current situation of the buildings out of Old Salt Area (SPFA No. and New Discovery No.)

This is Target Areas and Heritage buildings on SPFA.

Blue buildings are "657 heritage buildings". Red line is "Implementation Area", Blue line is Old Salt Area.

SPFA covered the 657 heritage buildings based on Law No.5 for the year 2005 for the protection of Urban and

Architectural Heritage. But, we reviewed them and found from 657 to 632 buildings. This contents is

- (1) Duplicate No. buildings : 2
- (2) No. of lost buildings : 27




Fig.3-16 Target Areas and Heritage Bulldings in SPFA's Map

Situation of lost buildings are


- (2) -1 Case of new buildings

- (2) -3 Case of plain ground


(2) -1 Case of new buildings

There are 2 cases of new buildings.


"Replaced with the concrete":

There was a cross vault ceiling and courtyard. The owner destroyed the historical building and rebuilt new one in 1990's.









"Use old stones from old buildings":

ex) The present building is totally new in 2000. But they used the old stones from the historical building for it.








Fig.3-18 Use was a cross vault ceiling and courtyard

ex) There were 2 rooms buildings. But it was destroyed in 1995~2000.









Fig.3-20 Case of Plain Ground


(3) Integrity of Heritage Buildings

'Integrity 1"


Buildings categorized in "Integrity 1" remain whole original structure even though they have additions.








'Integrity 2"
Buildings categorized in "Integrity 2" have lost some part of its original structure.








'Integrity 3"
Buildings categorized in "Integrity 3" have no trace from its original structure at all.










Fig.3-21 Map of the Integrity in SPFA No.





Fig.3-22 Listed Buildings through our Survey (In Old Salt Area)

c. The Current Situation of the Buildings out of Old Salt Area (SPFA No. and New Discovery No.)


We found the historical buildings which have the unique structure made of Unshaped Stones with Qantara'ah and openings made of Yellow Limestone.

These were constructed in a style different from buildings in the city centre. Regarding the methods of the structures, it is considered as new type of buildings than the buildings in city centre.
