# 1. Summary of Data Collection Survey

## 1.1 Objective of Survey

- ① To collect basic data regarding tourism development in western region.
- ② To indicate a future direction of tourism development based on the result of the above activity.
- ③ To propose "ideas" of cooperation by JICA in order to realize a future direction of tourism development.

## 1.2 Summary of Survey

Duration of Survey : From January 8, 2012 to February 16, 2012 Surveyed Area : Western Region (Mostly in Copan Ruins expanded in three (3) Prefectures such as Copan, Ocotepeque and Lempira, ) Survey Procedure : Data collection, interview, site visit, work shop

# 2. Tourism Situation in Honduras

## 2.1 Tourism Situation in Honduras

## 2.1.1 Summary of National Tourism Plan

Sustainable Tourism Development Strategy was prepared by Secretary of Tourism (SETUR) and Honduras Tourism Institute (IHT) in 2005. According to the above strategy, following components for tourism development are proposed.

## **[**Priority (short term) Development Zone]

- ① Bay Islands : Preparation of international beach resort considering natural environment.
- 2 Maya Ruins Area : Preparation of cultural tourism route between Copan Ruin and the North Coast considering protection of ruins.
- ③ The North Coast : Further expansion of beach resort. Development of eco-tourism utilized the rich natural resources.

## [Middle Term Development Zone]

- ① Yojoa Lake Area : Installation of tourist area to offer eco-tourism, recreation, sports, etc.
- (2) Comayagua Area : Installation of tourist area using historical buildings/town, and traditional festival.

## [Long Term Development Zone]

- ① La Moskitia (Puerto Lempira Area) : Frontier with northeastern part of Nicaragua. Development of eco-tourism using heritage of ethnic minority and particular environment of savanna.
- (2) La Moskitia (Rio Platano Area) : Protection and promotion of tourist use (eco-tourism) of primitive rainforest.

## 2.1.2 Major Tourism Resources

Major tourist destination and tourism resources in Honduras are classified in three (3) categories as follow; Caribbean islands and beach, pristine nature such as rainforest and Maya Ruins.

## 2.1.3 Number of Tourist and Tourism Situation

# (1) Situation of Number of Visitors

Number of annual visitors to Honduras has been increased from 2000 (about 680,000 visitors) to 2008 (920,000 visitors) continuously. It was slightly decreased in 2009 due to instability of political situation and global economic fluctuation. Meanwhile, it was increased again in 2010 and keeps about 900,000 visitors annually.

#### (2) International Competitiveness of National Tourism Honduras

According Tourism Competitiveness Report, Honduras is ranked in 88th of 139 countries (2011). Comparing among Central America, Costa Rica is the head of the list as 44th, and Honduras is ranked in fourth place of six (6) countries.

#### 2.1.4 Challenges of Tourism

Challenges of Tourism in Honduras are studied by SETUR and IHT as follow. They are summarized in; 1) coordination and capacity building of organizations, 2) improvement of safety and security, 3) human resources development and 4) development of tourism products and marketing.

[Challenges of Tourism in Honduras (by SETUR web site)]

- ① To promote active participation of private sector and local government in program and project development of competitive products including promotion and effective commercialization of priority tourist destination.
- <sup>(2)</sup> To harmonize judicial and institutional framework to improve tourism sector and also to guarantee judicial security.
- ③ To establish planning, control and follow up mechanism in order to determine strategic action courses to maximize sector benefits and also to evaluate the result of tourism policy.
- (4) To promote institutional coordination through formation of tourism cabinet to define sectorial and inter-sectorial policies that give consistency to the public action on tourism issue.
- (5) To improve security and service in tourist destination through formation of tourism police and development of facility and information services and tourist support.
- (6) To develop programs for capacity building of human resources in tourism sector and also for guarantee a quality of services and actions aiming at improvement of tourism culture diffusion.
- $\bigcirc$  To support local/regional tourism development considering value of attraction.
- ⑧ To improve investment in the sector through establishment of promotion fund for tourism.
- (9) To develop alternative tourism products considering nature, adventure and rural tourism.
- ① To develop strategic marketing plan to maximize efforts of all related industrial actors, resources and capacity.

## 2.2 Tourism Situation in Western Region

## 2.2.1 Number of Tourist and Tourism Situation

## (1) Number of Annual Visitors to Copan Ruins

Copan Ruins received around 150,000 visitors annually from 2003 to 2008. Then number was decreased until 100,000 in 2009 and 2010. Half of visitors are from Honduras, followed by Europe and North America. It shows that history and culture of Maya Ruins are attractive for foreigners.

# 2.2.4 Challenges of Tourism Development in Western Region

Challenges of tourism development in western region, especially in Copan Ruins, a center of attraction, are as follow based on the result of interview, field survey and workshop.

- ① Redevelopment of downtown in Copan Ruins as tourist destination
- ② Improvement of touristic attraction of Copan Ruins
- ③ Increasing of income and expansion of employment through tourism
- ④ Development of tourism products and events to promote visitors' stay
- (5) Improvement of coordination among tourism organization
- (6) Improvement and enlightenment of local residence for environment and esthetic consciousness

# 3. Consideration Points for Tourism Development in Western Region

Basic direction for tourism development in western region is proposed as follow based on the result of survey described above in Chapter 1 and 2.

# [Improvement of touristic attraction and function in Copan Ruins]

- Copan Ruins, including Maya Ruins, is major tourism resources in Honduras. It is placed as priority tourism development zone in "Sustainable Tourism Development Strategy (2005)".
- Only reference destination has historical and cultural character in three (3) priority tourism development zone. In this connection, tourism development to exploit this particular character shall be important factor to improve diversity and attractiveness of national tourism.
- It is required to improve touristic attraction and function in order to call visitors to go to other tourist destination in the region.

# [Establishment of regional tourism route]

- El Puente Ruins and Rio Amarillo Ruins are located along the highway from Copan Ruins to San Pedro Sula. Also colonial town such as Santa Rosa de Copán and Gracias is located to the east from La Entrada on the way.
- Regional tourism route shall be established beginning at Copan Ruins as visit or staying point and also contribute to tourism development in whole western region.

# [Allocation of touristic benefits to the community]

• Allocation of tourist benefits to the community through handicraft development and job training has been implemented but not sustained in Copan Ruins. It is required to expand tourist benefits to the community sustaining the reference activities.

# [Sells promotion of local industry]

- Pottery, clay work, jewelry, stone carving, dyeing, textile, corn doll as artifacts and coffee as agricultural products are specialty of the region.
- It is required to promote sales of these products and to increase income of local residents.

# **[**Coordination and capacity building of organizations for tourism development**]**

• Lack of communication among tourism organizations was pointed out at workshop. In this connection, it is required to establish meeting opportunity and consultation among city, NGO, agricultural, artifact and tourist business operator, guide, transport and education sectors.

# **[**Promotion of job training on tourism industry**]**

• Promotion of employment is one of the important aims of tourism development. In this connection, it is required to improve program contents of job training, such as cooking and service.

# [Further development and promotion of tourism products]

• Various one-day tours are offered at Copan Ruins already. It is required to promote such tourism products through further development of unique tour and events.

# [Improvement of exhibition and guide content of Maya Ruins]

• Copan, El Puente, and Rio Amarillo placed along the river from Copan Ruins and La Entrada as Maya Ruins has various issues such as deterioration of visitor centers. In this connection, it is required to improve a situation and touristic attractiveness.

# 4 Project Ideas

#### 4.1 Possibility of Cooperation by JICA

Concrete project ideas are proposed as follow based on consideration above mentioned.

#### Possibility of Cooperation 1 : Improvement of Touristic Area in Copan Ruins

• Downtown of Copan Ruins is visited as a base place of tours. Meanwhile, chaotic traffic, bumpy road, unfriendly sidewalk around Central Park is issues to be resolved. In this connection, it is proposed to improve tourist area of downtown in Copan Ruins, especially around Central Park to where many visitors come.

[Possible Cooperation Activities]

• Enlightenment for esthetic consciousness, planning and implementation of traffic system (traffic regulation and control, promenade, planning for parking place), planning and implementation of landscape improvement (rehabilitation of cobbled pavement, landscape control, installation of public restroom), waste management, installation and management support of tourism information center

#### Possibility of Cooperation 2 : Establishment and Promotion of Regional Tourism Route in Western Region

• Western region has basis resources to establish unique tourism route. In this connection, it is examined to support establishment and promotion of tourism route such as Maya Route and Colonial Town Route coordinating with Lenca Route already existed.

[Possible Cooperation Activities ]

• Establishment and management of consultation of regional tourism, preparation of planning by consultation, promotion and publicity of routes, preparation of promotion tool (brochure, map, etc.), preparation of signing (including common logo), planning and implementation of tour ideas (common coupon, etc.), development of tourism products and event

#### Possibility of Cooperation 3 : Development of Local Industry Promotion Center

• Production and sales of artifacts (souvenir) is effective measure to allocate touristic benefits to the region. In this connection, it is expected to continue development of artifacts previously implemented.

[Possible Cooperation Activities]

• Establishment of organization (consultation), preparation of work plan and selection of priority project by consultation, development and training of concrete products, marketing, development of sales channel and sales

#### Possibility of Cooperation 4 : Promotion of Job Training on Tourism Industry

- Tourism is important industry to provide employment in western region. In this connection, it is examined to
  establish job training courses of such as cooking in order to provide human resources to tourism industry.
  [Possible Cooperation Activities]
- Formation of organization, demand survey, study for contents and schedule of courses, preparation of action plan, providing of instructors, implementation of courses

#### Possibility of Cooperation 5 : Development of Software to promote Tourism in Copan Ruins

- Local tour operators offer and implement various tourism products. Meanwhile, it is still possible to develop other products and events. In this connection, it is required to develop tourism software to call more visitors.
   [Possible Cooperation Activities]
- Coordination and capacity building of organizations, planning, selection and implementation of priority project (marketing, promotion, tourism products development, events development, study and preparation of advertising media), improvement of tourism information center

#### Possibility of Cooperation 6 : Improvement of Exhibition and Guide Contents in Maya Ruins

• As mentioned above, Copan Ruins, El Puente, Rio Amarillo need to improve exhibition facility. In this connection, it is proposed to support for exhibition improvement aiming at tourism promotion of the ruins.

[Possible Cooperation Activities]

- Copan Ruins : Support for exhibition of excavated materials (exhibition of relatively small materials)
- El Puente : Updating of exhibition
- Rio Amarillo : Support for new exhibition (building already constructed)

#### Project Idea 1: Project for Improvement of Touristic Area in Copan Ruins

- Formation of tourism promotion consultation composed of Copan Ruins City and relevant players and establishment of working group (WG) by themes in the consultation.
