GHS Presents "Mama's Determination": New Edutainment Tools to prevent HIV transmission from mothers to their babies with Japanese support

The Ghana Health Service (GHS) presents new educational/ entertainment (edutainment) tools titled "Mama's Determination" for Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission of HIV (PMTCT) at the La Palm Royal Beach Hotel in Accra on 22nd July 2014. The edutainment tools were developed jointly by the GHS, Ghana AIDS Commission (GAC), and the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) under the "Project for Strengthening Operational Capacity of PMTCT," which has been implemented in the Greater Accra Region from 2012 to 2015.

The new set of edutainment communication tools for PMTCT, "Mama's Determination," consists of a DVD, Photo Drama Book and Interactive Cards, aimed at supporting counseling services for PMTCT at health facilities. The "Mama's Determination" tools are the first edutainment materials for PMTCT in Ghana with application of episode-based drama technique introduced by Japanese experts from a Japan-based international NGO, the Japanese Organization for International Cooperation in Family Planning (JOICFP), entrusted by JICA as a project executing agency. The tools production was carried out through on-the-job training for the purpose of technical transfer of production techniques from the Japanese experts to their Ghanaian counterparts.

According to the situation analysis on the existing PMTCT communication tools conducted in 2012, major tools were found suitable for giving knowledge, but weak for bringing about behavior change of the clients to get tested for HIV and regularly take drugs as instructed if tested positive. Knowledge, on its own, does not always drive behavior change. Emotion communication is the highlighted characteristic of the "Mama's Determination." They were developed to educate and entertain pregnant and nursing women in Ghana, motivate them to take HIV testing, and encourage HIV positive mothers to continuously take their medicines for long healthy lives.

The "Mama's Determination" tools are disseminated on Tuesday, 22nd July, 2014 at the La Palm Royal Beach Hotel in Accra with invited partners from the Central and Regional levels covering all the ten (10) regions of Ghana. The distributed "Mama's Determination" tools will be used at PMTCT facilities in their daily services for pregnant and nursing mothers to eliminate HIV transmission to the next generation by 2015.

HIV educational materials launched

ASET of educational materials on the "Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission (PMTCT) of Human Immune Virus (HIV)", was launched and disseminated in Accra on Tuesday.

The materials being provided under an initiative dubbed:

"Mama's Determination", consist of a video drama, produced together with a photo book and interactive cards, which would be used as awareness creating materials for pregnant women.

"Mama's Determination" conveys a story of how mother-tochild transmission and AIDs can be prevented by taking antiretroviral drugs, even if the woman does not find out she is HIV-positive until her pre-natal check-up. The materials are expected to be used in hospital waiting rooms, other facilities, and be made available to pregnant women as a means of providing them with relevant information on how to protect babies from HIV infections during antenatal and post-natal periods.

Speaking on behalf of the Minister of Health, Dr. Kwaku Agyeman Mensah, the Director of Health Monitoring, Planning and Evaluation at the Ministry of Health, Dr. Afisa Zachariah, said the initiative has been developed to reduce HIV prevalence rate among babies from zero to five years.

He disclosed that the materials were developed through the joint efforts of Japanese experts, the Ghana Aids Commission and the Ghana Health Service with funding from the Japan International Corporation Agency.

Dr. Agyeman Mensah said the materials fits into the PMTCT circumstances in Ghana, and believed that mothers, who visit health facilities, would enjoy the drama, and be motivated to actively seek PMTCT services.

"PMTCT is one of the priority areas in the country's health sector towards the achievement of a HIV free generation and this initiative would assist the country in this endeavor", he said

The Health Minister thanked Japan for its support for the "Project for Strengthening Operational Capacity of PMTCT", and hoped that the lessons conveyed in Mama's Determination materials would be effectively utilised.

The "Project for Strengthening Operational Capacity of PMTCT", which brought forth Mama's Determination, started in Ghana in 2012, and would officially come to an end in 2015.

The project aims to improve the quality of PMTCT services by running training sessions to nurture PMTCT counselors and capacity-building training programmes for their supervisors, to develop teaching materials to be used in health facilities for raising awareness, and produce a handbook on implementing PMTCT services.

The Japanese Ambassador to Ghana, Mr. Naoto Nikia, said Ghana's future was secured following the adaptation PMTCT measures.

He appealed to institutions responsible for the implementation of the project in all the ten regions of Ghana to ensure the success of the project.

3 Bodies unveil tool to prevent mother-to-child transmission of HIV

NEW strategic tool to reinforce the national Prevention of motherto-child transmission of HIV (PMTCT) effort has been developed by three entities.

The new educational and entertainment tool titled 'Mama's Determination' was developed by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), in collaboration with the Ghana Health Service (GHS) and the Ghana AIDS Commission (GAC).

The PMTCT is aimed at eliminating mother to child HIV transmission by

photo drama book and interactive cards and is aimed at facilitating counselling services for PMTCT at all health facilities.

'Mama's Determination' is the outcome of "Project for Strengthening Operational Capacity of Prevention of mother-to-child transmission of HIV (PMTCT)" which has been implemented for three years in the Greater Accra Region.

The project, has been implemented jointly by GHS and Japanese experts from two Japan-based NGOs, namely the Japanese Organisation for International Cooperation in Family Planning (JOICFP) and the Japan Anti-Tuberculosis Association (JATA).

It was established that major existing tools were found suitable for giving knowledge but were weak in bringing about behaviour changes in

The expected behaviour changes of the old tool included getting women

and lactating mothers to test for HIV and regularly take drugs as instructed, if they are positive.

The survey also showed that knowledge and emotion communication, a characteristic of 'Mama's Determination', were together a requisite for the required behaviour change in the PMTCT of HIV campaign.

The tool has, therefore, been developed to educate and entertain pregnant and nursing mothers in Ghana, motivate them to get tested and encourage HIV positive mothers to continuously take their medications for long, healthy lives.

Ghana AIDS Commission

At a ceremony to unveil 'Mama's Determination' in Accra, the tools were handed over to the Director General of the GHS, Dr Appiah Denkyira, for onward distribution to representatives of all 10 regions to be used by PMTCT

In a statement read on her behalf, the Director General of the GAC, Dr Angela El-Adas, said in 2012 alone, 852 children were newly infected with HIV in the country.

She said there was a huge gap in addressing the reproductive health needs of women, leading to more morbidity and mortality.

"One major target of the national strategic plan is to reduce the motherto-child transmission of HIV from 30 per cent, currently to less than five per cent in 2015," the statement added.

In the statement, Dr El-Adas said the current HIV prevalence rate was 1.9 among pregnant women as reported by the 2013 HIV sentinel survey, reflecting a reduction from 2.1 in the previous

	2- Video Drama	
	2-1 Utilization	
	The video drama "Mama's Determination" is shown at the waiting rooms at all 11 facilities. At 9 facilities, the video is shown every day, while at 2 facilities (Anyamam HC & Bornikope HC), the video is	

- shown only for 1 to 2 days per week on the days of ANC clinic. The video is also used in the Health Education Sessions and discussion, Q & A session at all 10 facilities.
- The main users of the video drama are PMTCT Counselor / Midwife / Nurse / Community Health Nurse. Other users are Models of Hope and Data Officer of the ART unit.
- The video drama is shown mainly to ANC and PNC clients followed by ART clients and OPD clients.

2-2 Reactions

- Almost all users reacted positively on the video as a useful tool for their daily works, especially for educating and entertaining the clients, removing fears and encouraging mothers to take HIV test. One PMTCT counselor said that the DVD leads to very detailed discussions between PMTCT counselor and the clients (Midwife/ User Polyclinic).
- One user mentioned that the video drama contributes to increasing the couple counseling (Midwife/Kasseh HC).
- Two users have received the request from the clients to show the video to their partners / husbands and community people. One user plans to show it to the community leader and assembly men (Midwife/ Kasseh HC), while another user plans to show it at a community durber (Midwife/ Anyamam HC).

2-3 Issues

- The main issue is the language barrier. Especially at the health facilities in Ada East and Ada West, most of the clients speak Dangme, and do not understand Twi and cannot read English. Therefore, the health staff who can speak local language usually explain the story to the clients before showing.
- One user said sometimes patients concentrate on the video and they don't realize that they are called up, that is a problem for service side. (Nurse/PLM).

3-Photo Drama Book

3-1 Utilization

- The primary usage of the photo drama book is for self-reading at the waiting room (10 facilities). Some service providers also read aloud the story in the waiting room, have discussion and Q&A sessions with the clients. Seven out of 11 users utilize the photo drama book in their one-to-one counseling, too. The book is also used instead of video drama when the electricity is down.
- The photo drama books are given to those who can read English or, given to mothers regardless of their literacy skills with the facilities. The books are given to those who want for taking it home at Kasseh HC, Sege HC, Bornikope HC Ridge Regional Hospital, Ada East District Hospital /ART Unit and Usher Polyclinic.
- The main users of the photo drama book are PMTCT Counselor / Midwife / Nurse / Community Health Nurse at all 10 facilities, and

Models of Hope and Data Officer also use the tools.

 The main target audience is ANC/PNC clients, followed by OPD clients and ART clients.

3-2 Reactions

Two users (Data Officer of the ART Unit and Community Health Nurse of the ANC Unit of Ada East District Hospital) express that the photo drama book makes their counseling easier to explain about PMTCT, benefit of HIV testing and treatment. Previously the users had to explain a lot about PMTCT.

3-3 Issues

- One service provider mentions that due to the high illiteracy rate among the clients, the usage of the photo drama book is low. (Midwife/James Town Maternity Home)
- Compared to the utilization of the video drama, the utilization of the photo drama book varies by users, some use frequently, and some use rarely.

4-Interactive Cards


4-1 Utilization

- The interactive card is mainly used to write the date of the next visit, giving the telephone number of the PMTCT counselors for enabling the clients to contract them anytime.
- The selection of the interactive cards is done by both clients and PMTCT counselors.
- No-one has not used the interactive card when they refer HIV positive clients to the ART section.
- The users are PMTCT Counselor / Midwife / Nurse / Community Health Nurse at all 10 facilities. Models of Hope were also involved as users at 2 facilities (Ussher Polyclinic and Ridge Regional Hospital).
- The card is given to all clients at the maternity ward/unit/section. At the ART units, the card is given to all clients including men (Ridge Regional Hospital), mothers only (Ada East District Hospital), and to only the fresh clients (PLM). At the Ridge Regional Hospital, the card is used for FP, STI and diabetic clients as well since the user thinks the card makes their service more client-friendly by enabling the clients to contact them for any concern anytime.

4-2 Reactions

- The card motivates more mothers to come back to the next visit, and usually the mothers keep it well till next visit.
- The card helps the service providers communicate with clients when they are at home. The clients show the card to their partners, and couples call and ask more questions. Sometimes, husbands call the midwife for clarifications.
- One user (Data Officer/Ada East District Hospital, ART Unit) says that the card is better than ARV card because it helps hide the identity of the patients to avoid stigmatization. Mothers, who cannot read, can

	just show the cards to others to ask when the date of the next visit since the cards does not have the information on the purposes. - Some clients just leave the card behind or even throw it away, and do not appreciate it since they cannot read, they are not pregnant mothers, or they have an appointment card (James Town Maternity Home, PML and Ussher Polyclinic).	
	4-3 Issues	
	 One issue raised by the users is that they are sometimes bothered by the telephone calls from the clients since the clients call even night time.

	Some experienced PMTCT counselors were observed making full use of the tools to strengthen their counseling works, while some PMTCT counselors used the tools in limited ways. For example, the PMTCT Counselor at Ussher Polyclinic uses several kinds of IEC materials in her counseling to explain and motivate the clients to regularly take medicine. Her experience and counseling skills could be shared with other counselors to strengthen their daily counseling works. Visually recording her ways of counseling by video will be one way to share her skills with other health staff.	
	· Creation of local language version of "Mama's Determination"	
	Three users (Data Officer and Community Health Nurse of Ada East District Hospital, Midwife of Bornikope HC, Midwife of Anyamam HC) mentioned about the language barriers in showing "Mama's Determination." It is recommended that the Greater Accra Region Health Directorate propose to the Ghana Health Service to create local language version of "Mama's Determination" as new follow-up works of this project.



31) Analysis of Pre- & Post-Tests Results of PMTCT Training

Analysis of Pre- & Post-Tests Results

An analysis of the pre- and post-tests results based on the 114 participants' scores revealed the following points.

- In the pre-test, less than half of the participants could give correct answers to the questions about the PMTCT statistics (Question 1), PMTCT monitoring (Question 10), Early Infant Diagnosis (EID) of HIV exposed infants (Question 11), and Cotrimoxazole prophylaxis for HIV exposed infants (Question 12) (44%, 49%, 49%, and 31% respectively).
- The post-test results saw a great improvement on those questions (97%, 79%, 77%, and 79% respectively).
- The Japanese experts provided feedbacks to the trainers based on the pre-test scores so as to better guide what areas of training curriculum need more emphasis.
- More participants could give the correct answer for each question in the post-test.
- These results showed that the training was effective and the trainers were skilled in conducting the training.
